

**C257 Crossrail Central – Farringdon Station, Eastern Ticket Hall (XSF10)**

**Summary Note on Building Materials**

Six pieces of London-made peg roofing tile were recovered from context [28].

One piece has glaze spots and a grey core indicating a medieval date (fabric 2586). This has mortar on the broken edge suggesting possible reuse in a later building or structure.

There are four tile of general 1480-1900 date (fabric 2276). One has a slightly blackened top, bottom and edge surface - suggesting heat damage. This may have come from an oven or chimney area. A further tile has two round nail holes 13mm in diameter.

A sixth tile (fabric 3090) could be either medieval or post-medieval in date.
