Area walked: 3.05 hectares Site Code: GBH2004WH





Location: This field lies in the east of Great Bowden parish in the area of Welham Lane. It is the only arable field among many pastures. It is close to the highest point in the parish at Mickelberg Hill and 480 metres from the present course of the River Welland at its nearest point.

The furlong name Potterscroft survives from the open fields and is nearby suggesting possible kiln activity. The field would have been within the East Field of the Great Bowden open fields. This was the first field to be walked by the group in 2004 when only the northern part of the field was covered. An attempt to re walk the field in October 2012 was thwarted by the wet conditions on the ground and too much grass growing among the emerging rape.

Associated documents. None.

History: This field was sold to Welham Bush Farm in 1919 (field No. 212 also known as Wynants Hill - 18.416 acres on farm sale details). The cultivation was described as new seeds, on barley stubbs, after part oats and wheat, after part wheat and oats, after Old Pasture, suggesting that it had only been arable for a few years, possibly ploughed during WWI. If it was pasture from the 1780s after Enclosure until early in the 20th century it could account for the lack of later pottery sherds. All the clay pipe stems are thick with a large bore probably dating from the 18th century.

Method. In 2004 the northern half of the field was walked using the traverse and stint method with 12 traverses at 10 metre intervals in an east-west direction. Stints (A-J) were at 20 metre intervals along the Welham Lane boundary. This was a training session with both experienced and novice field walkers.

Finds Summary:

Prehistoric =12 flints, 1 pottery sherd, Iron Age or mid to late Bronze Age?
Early medieval and medieval = 9 sherds (Lyveden Stanion ware, Midland Purple, sandyware and oxidised ware)
Early post medieval and post medieval = 48 sherds (mottled ware, earthenwares including pancheons, clay pipes, Cistercian ware, Midland Black, Bourne D ware, slipware, hard fired earthenware EA1,2 and 6)
Modern, white and blue and white sherds not counted.

Finds from some of the traverses were initially identified by GBHA and later verified by archaeologists at Leicestershire County Council under Identification Service Report EN No. 773 dated 4th September 2007. Three traverses - 1, 9 and 12 were identified by Great Bowden Heritage & Archaeology and further confirmed by group members in 2017.
