## 1 Summary for London Archaeologist

Crossrail Charterhouse Square Gardens Borehole Investigation, Charterhouse Square, EC1 TQ 3196 8188 MOLA (Tim Johnston) watching brief December 2014 – February 2015 Crossrail XTE12

Six boreholes revealed terrace gravels, truncated by probable quarrying (but possibly grave fills), which was overlain by post-medieval levelling deposits and cultivated or garden soil. It was thought that the medieval outer cemetery of Charterhouse (*f*. 1371) and earlier plague burials may have extended into the area of the boreholes, but no evidence for this was present.
