



From the 1970s onwards, Winchester Museums, responsible for the investigation and curation of the archaeological heritage of the city and its surrounding district, carried out a series of major excavations in the Winchester area. The results of these excavations, together with associated analyses and research, are being published in a series of academic reports.

The following reports have already been published:

The Brooks, Winchester – a Preliminary Report on the Excavations 1987–88 by G D Scobie, I M Zant & R Whinney, 1991

The report is a preliminary statement about the major discoveries made during archaeological investigations of a large site in the town centre prior to redevelopment

The Brooks, Winchester 1987–88 – The Roman Structural Remains by J M Zant, 1993 The book details the origins and development of the Roman buildings and associated features discovered at The Brooks, from the mid 1st century AD to the early 5th century AD

Oram's Arbour – The Iron Age enclosure at Winchester. Volume 1: Investigations 1950–1999 by K E Qualmann, H Rees, G D Scobie & R Whinney, 2004

The book reports on the evidence for prehistoric settlement in Winchester from a series of excavations carried out in the 1970s and 1980s

The following reports will be published in the near future:

Feeding a Roman Town – Environmental Evidence from Excavations in Winchester 1972–1985 by M Maltby

Much of this book is taken up by a detailed report on a very large group of Roman faunal remains from sites in the northern suburb and on the defences. It also includes smaller reports on other faunal assemblages, and molluscan and plant remains

Food, Craft and Status in Medieval Winchester - the Plant and Animal Remains from the **Suburbs and City Defences** *edited by D Serjeantson & H Rees*

The companion volume to Feeding a Roman Town, the book contains seven chapters on aspects of Winchester's medieval environment, mainly faunal, but with one chapter devoted to plant remains
