

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
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Illus. 1 Site Location



Summary

The Archaeology Company (TAC) was commissioned by Ms Sarah Hanson (Planning Consultant) acting on behalf of Mr. John Weavers of Newfront Ltd (Client) to undertake a programme of archaeological survey on the site of a proposed residential development consisting of five new dwellings with garages and a private road (P171228/F) at Dilwyn, Hereford, Herefordshire.

The Earthwork survey was carried out using a Leica GS16 Robotic Total Station with CS20 controller operating using Leica Captivate software survey points taken at the top-of-slope and break-of-slope on all visible earthworks within the area of the proposed development.

The survey has identified the within the proposed development area several raised features forming levelled areas and possible linear field divisions or track ways are present these may be indicative of an agricultural heritage rather than suggesting that the site was once occupied, however is practically impossible to date the earthworks recorded within the proposed development site on form alone or to confirm the function of such structures from survey records alone.

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Introduction

The Archaeology Company was commissioned by Sarah Hanson (planning Consultant) acting on behalf John Wreaves, NEWFRONT Ltd (Client) to undertake a programme of archaeological survey on the site of a proposed residential development consisting of five new dwellings with garages and a private road (P171228/F) at Dilwyn, Hereford, Herefordshire the Site is centred on National Grid Reference (NGR) 341391 254471.

The proposed development is located within the conservation area of Dilwyn and is situated within a sensitive location formerly occupied by traditional orchards. Several low earthworks and other topographic features are evident on and around the site.

Site Description, Topography and Geology

The project site is located just to the west of the core of the historic village of Dilwyn (NGR 341391 254471 approximately). The site is bounded to the north by the A411, to the south by an un-named local road and to the north east by the curtilage of The Great House.

The British Geological Survey have mapped the underlying geology as comprising of an outcrop of Raglan Mudstone Formation a siltstone and mudstone, sedimentary bedrock formed

approximately 419 to 424 million years ago in the Silurian period indicating a local environment previously dominated by rivers. Superficial deposits are noted as Clay, Silt, Sand, and gravel. (https://www.bgs.ac.uk/ accessed July 2018)

Aims and Objectives

The objectives were to:

- establish the presence/absence, character and extent of extant earthwork remains within the Site that may be threatened by the proposed development;
- produce a report which will present the project information in sufficient detail to allow interpretation without recourse to the project archive;
- provide an interpretation of results, placing them in a local and regional context;
- facilitate judgements on the status of the archaeological resource and allow the formulation of an appropriate response ('a mitigation strategy') to the impact of any surviving archaeological features and deposits.

Method

Earthwork Survey

All fieldwork was undertaken in accordance with recognised professional standards issued by the Institute for Archaeologists (2008) and English Heritage (2007).

The Earthwork survey was carried out using a Leica GS16 Robotic Total Station with CS20 controller operating using Leica Captivate software survey points taken at the top-of-slope and break-of-slope on all visible earthworks within extent of the proposed development area.

From this data a hachure plot was produced using AutoCAD the finish survey was then tied in to an Ordnance Survey 1:2500 map of the area.

All the observable earthworks within the area enclosing the proposed of development area were surveyed. Notes on surface condition, land use and topography, as well as specific observations on the earthworks themselves, were taken and recorded using The Archaeology Company pro forma recording sheets and recording system.

A photographic record was generated consisting of digital (.jpg) photographs to aid in the interpretation of the Site.

A search of the available Historic Environment records was made, the results of which are included in appendix II

Fieldwork was carried out on the 6th of July 2018.

Background History

A History of Dilwyn published in 1868 and describes the parish of Dilwyn as "one of the largest and most populous of the rural parishes of this county. The acreage exceeds 6,000, and the population is nearly 1,100. Situated in the northwest angle of the county, it combines the luxuriance of Herefordshire with just a tinge of the bolder scenery of the country over the border. The origin of the name, variously written in past centuries Dilge, Dilewe, Dilwin, Dilvin, and lastly Dilwyn" A transcription of an extract from the Archaeologia Cambrensis (Third Series, No 54, APRIL 1868) published by the Cambrian Archaeological Association)

"Dilwyn has been thought to be Old English (Anglo Saxon) for a hidden place. This is based on two of the four names for Dilwyn that appear in the Domesday Book i.e. Dilge". The Domesday entry is possibly the earliest written account of Dilwyn. "However, Dilge appears to refer to Sollers Dilwyn and Little Dilwyn and not the main manor of Dilwyn. This manor was shown in the other two entries as Diluen. This is more likely to be a Normanised version of a celtic (Welsh) name. It should be remembered that Welsh (the anglo-saxon name for the celtic language) was

widely spoken in the area up to the time of the English Civil War.

From the Domesday references it is possible to suggest that Dilwyn was well established before the Normans conquest and may well extend back close to that of neighbouring Weobley which theoretically was established in the very late 6th century.

Historic Environment Search

As part of the survey project an Historic Environment Record (HER) search was conducted with a radius of 500m from the centre of the site, a summary of the result is represented below, the complete results are included in Appendix II.

The HER search identified four archaeological interventions within the 500m search area, all centred on the Church of St Mary the Virgin, approximately 200m to the north east of the proposed development site.

Within the 500m search radius 16 listed building were identified including The Great House, which boarders the proposed development site on the north east boundary.

Located directly to the southeast of the proposed development site (approximately 150m) is a site recorded as Dilwyn Castle, Moated Mound (HER Number 2238) the HER entry is listed below;

Description

"Though suggestive of castle site work appears rather to be of homestead moat class. (1) Moat, partly wet, encloses nearly circular area c165' diameter rising slightly above surrounding ground with remains of rampart. Immed SE pond of irregular form. (2) Possible ringwork. (3) Appears to be ringwork with reduced remains of encircling bank on N side of featureless interior. Ditch waterfilled on E and S, but N side filled in and only slight depression indicates position irregular pond does not appear to be contempory. Watching brief by J Sawle on trenches just outside area of ditch (5)

Motte & bailey. Partly banked on uphill side. Large shell keep is indicated by buried foundations 5'-6' thick. Slightly off centre inside shell is large roughly rect block of buried masonry poss a stone keep. Most of upper bailey has been covered with houses apparently without any record being made of site. An old excav trench on motte, whose report found no stonework stopped only 18" from foundations. Site fo protected by a marsh, mere & fishponds on two thirds of circuit, now mostly drained. (6) The author was on site to examine the builder's excavations and foundation trenches throughout the development. Finds were retrieved from the site including probable 12th century pottery. After the development there remains the partial ringwork bank on a mound. Historical information is included in the account with reference to those that held the land from 1086. Comment and speculation on the present evidence includes the possibility that Dilwyn was one of the few stone square or rectangular keeps in Herefordshire. The tower might have been surrounded by a shell-wall built up behind the rampart. Indicating a very strong castle, although there is no conclusive proof of this. Discussion is also included of the possible destruction of the site when the fee holding moved from the castle some time after 1200. (7) Since the visit in 1993 houses have been built near the base of the motte, gardens have encroached onto the motte slopes and the tower keep platform is less clear due to soil build up. (8)

Historic Map Progression


Examination of the 1886 six inch to one mile OS map shows the proposed development site is under cultivation and planted out as orchard or possible woodland, the field is subdivided north east-south west and a foot path is recorded in the

north west part of the field. No indication of the visible earthworks within the proposed development site is recorded in the 1886 OS map. It is interesting to note that the A411 to the north west of the proposed development site has not been constructed yet however indication of an unmade track is recorded along the future route of the A411. (See Illus. 2)

Examination of the 1902 six inch to one mile OS mapping shows that although the field patterns surrounding the proposed development site remain relatively unaltered that fields are now shown as containing sparsely populated woodland, the impression of regimented planting as encountered with formal orchards has changed, given the short time between mapping it is more likely that the registration key for orchards has changed between issues rather than a radical change in planting.(See Illus. 3)

The 1945 six inch to one mile mapping series is a direct copy of the 1902 map with the exception of adjusted benchmarks and spot heights and shows no alteration to the proposed development site, however given the period the map was issued a repeat of a pervious map series is to be expected.




Illus. 4 1945 Six inch to one mile OS map

Results

Introduction

A hachure plot was produced and tied in to an Ordnance Survey 1:2500 map of the area. Illus. 5 shows the result of the earthwork survey and a description and discussion of the individual features is presented below.

Feature A

Aligned north east Area A measured approximately 14.0m in length with a minimum width of approximately 1.43m spreading out to approximately 2.68m at the north eastern end. Forming a linear cut with a possibly connection to area K, Feature A also forms or is part of the confining bank to the south west of feature (see Plate. 2)

Discussion

The location and direction of feature A suggested a continuation of feature K; however, feature A may represent the south east defining edged of feature B, the alignment either being a coincident or because of the continuation of feature K but obscured by the formation of features A and B.

Feature B

Feature B represent a large sub rectangular flat platform or lynchet located along the 90m contour line, measuring approximately 36.80m along the south west north east axis and with width of approximately 14.70m running out to the break of slope at the north western edge. The construction of the feature B projects forward of the line formed by feature E and is divided from feature E by linear feature C and bounded on the south west edge by the line of feature A. the platform is relatively shallow at the south west edge, projecting approximately 0.26m above the

ground level while at the north eastern edge the platform rises by approximately 0.70m.

Discussion

Feature B forms a large and relatively flat platform or lynchet within the natural slope of the hillside, generally the raised nature of such platforms would indicate it is formed from up cast material cut from the hillside however the angle of the natural slope would suggest it is not cut into the hill side and that it may be formed from imported material. Given the overall dimensions of the platform it would possibly suggest that it feature B does not reflect the typical building platform and given the its size it may have originally been formed to provide a level area within the sloping landscape for agricultural purposes. (See Plate. 3)

Feature C

Feature C is aligned northwest south east and measures approximately 12.65m in length with a width of approximately 5m and an average depth of 0.40m and forms the division between features B and E.


Discussion

Feature C is not directly formed, it is rather a by-product of the junction between features B and E, however it may have been intentionally fashioned to provide a boundary between features B and E and then subsequently a shallow entrance or part of a trackway providing access to platforms areas B and E. (See Plate. 4)

Feature D

Located to the south east of features E and respecting the division between features B and E, feature D represents a very shallow "L" shaped feature measuring approximately 9.0m along the north west axis and 17.50m along its north east axis. Feature D corresponds with a break in slope to the north east of the site forming part of feature E. Feature D is intermittent along the north east axis and aligned to the break in features B and E corresponding to feature c. (See Plate. 5)

Discussion

Feature D corresponds to a breaking the slope towards the north east of feature E and respects the alignment between features B and E in the same way as feature C. the feature is relatively shallow and intermittent in nature however it may represent a boundary to feature F rather than an individual phase of construction within the proposed development site. The nature and purpose of feature D is unclear and inconclusive.






Plate. 5 Facing NW, Overview of Features D and F.



Feature E represent a large sub rectangular flat platform or lynchet located along the 90m contour line, measuring approximately 40.0m along the south west north east axis and with width of approximately 10.0m running out to the break of slope at the north western edge. The construction of the feature E does not projects forward of the line formed by feature E and is divided from feature E by feature C and appears to cut by the curtilage of The Great house, the platform is relatively shallow at the south west edge, projecting approximately 0.40m above the ground level while at the north eastern edge the platform sits atop a series of breaks in the slope which run down to the south west edge of the site. (See Plate. 6)

Discussion

Feature E forms a large but relatively narrow platform or lynchet similar to feature B and subdivide by linear feature C, the feature is relatively pronounced within the landscape and appears to run from the curtilage of The Great House to the north east, the feature is more rectangular and linear when compared to feature B but despite the length is relatively narrow for either a building platform or an area formed for agricultural reasons, the feature gives the impression of a levelled trackway but it appears to go nowhere suggesting that it originally formed a level area similar to feature B and may have in fact been part of a strip lynchet farming system.

Feature F

Located to the south east of feature E and D feature F forms two parallel raised linear mounds aligned north west-south east, measuring approximately 20.0m in length with a top width of approximately 6.0m and sitting into the hillside, of the two mounds the northern one is much more defined while the south one appears to be heavily degraded.

Discussion

The two raised linear mounds that constitute feature F are possibly an indication that the field was once part of an orchard as further impression of linear mounds continues towards the south west of feature F, however at the time of survey they were only observed as changes in grass colour rather than solid features. (See Plate. 7)

Feature G

Feature G measures approximately 12.0m in length and at its widest projects from the wall line of The Great House garden by approximately 1.50m.

Discussion

Feature G represents a linear feature either aligned with the existing stone wall of The Great House or projecting from the wall line and possibly represents part of the construction of the existing stone wall, the end of feature G corresponding with an opening in the wall line.

Feature H

Running parallel to the south west boundary of the site Feature H forms a linear depression with an open end at the north east, measuring approximately 13.17m in length with a maximum width of 3.20m. Feature H has an approximate maximum depth of 0.30m. Running parallel to the south east edge of feature H several trees have been planted in line, this may indicate that feature H is remnant or associated with a phase of modern construction.

Discussion

The location of the tree line running parallel to feature H would suggest a contemporary relationship and may indicated that feature H represents the remove footings or concrete base for a small linear stable block, the tree line representing a cover line to obscure the structure from the road line and neighbouring houses.

Feature I

Feature I. is located to the east of feature B. and the north of feature J and comprises a semicircular depression with an approximate depth of 0.10m and a diameter of approximately 2.10m.

Discussion

Within the area surveyed two semi-circular depressions were identified it is possible that the feature I represents the scar left from a three throw or tree bowel. (See Plate. 9)

Feature J

Feature J. is located to the east of feature B. and the north of feature K. and comprises a slightly elongated semi-circular depression with an approximate depth of 0.20m and a diameter of approximately 1.90m.

Discussion

Within the proposed development area two semicircular depressions were identified, features J and I are considered to both represent the scar left from a three throw or tree bowel. (See Plate. 9)

Feature K

Feature K measures approximately 32.30m in length with an apparent width of 3.30m and is aligned north west — south east. Feature K comprises of a banked track way running from feature L to Feature B, the bank is more pronounced on the southern edge.

Discussion

The alignment of feature K suggests a contemporary relationship with feature L while the alignment also suggests that it may have functioned as trackway linking feature B, however this maybe a secondary relationship as feature K comprises of a pronounced bank on the southwestern edge with a more subtle and intermittent bank on the north east edge suggesting that feature K may in fact represent a boundary division that creates an enclosure to the south east of the site with a possible entrance provide by feature M.

Feature L

Feature L represents a relatively steep cut slope aligned to feature K and set within the landscape feature L corresponds to the existing entrance to the proposed development site. Measuring approximately 5.0m in width with a steep gradient spreading into the development site for approximately 6.50m from the boundary line.

Discussion

Although feature L provides access to the existing field system form the main road, the feature shares a connected alignment to the bank or possibly track way (Feature K) and breaks the steep boundary bank running along the south eastern extent of the proposed development site, the alignment of the feature I may indicate a contemporary relationship with the observed and recorded earthworks within the proposed development site.

Feature M

Located along the south east boundary of the proposed development site a slight depression in the boundary bank measuring approximately 4.15m in with a stretched and steep gradient that extends approximately 4.20m from the boundary line.

Discussion

Feature M appears to break the steep slope (Feature N) that forms the existing boundary line like feature L suggesting that it may represent a former entrance into the proposed development site, however the boundary is relatively overgrown at this point. If feature M did represent a former entrance, then it is plausible that feature K does in fact define a parcel land within the southern

corner of the proposed development site as well as form a trackway.

Feature N

Located along the south east boundary a steep slope or bank forms part of the boundary of the proposed development site, the bank runs for approximately 100m and extend out of the proposed development area, the bank is more pounced at the southern extent of the survey area while it fades out towards the north east of the boundary line. The bank is cut by the present entrance way (Feature L) and feature M.

Discussion

The southeast boundary of the proposed development site is formed by a long and relatively steep slope line that extends down to the existing road line beyond the line of the proposed development site. It is possible that feature N is by-product of the cut for the existing road or is a change in the natural topography.




Plate. 13 Facing SE, Overview towards Feature N.

Feature O

Located outside the proposed development area with an approximate north west-south east alignment a faint depression was observed, measuring approximately 20.0m in length. The feature was very shallow and only visible under certain lighting conditions during the survey.

Discussion

The overall appearance of feature O was very shallow and intermittent, identified primarily by a change in the colour of grass cover under certain lighting conditions, the possible linear feature may represent a field boundary, previous fence line or footpath of relatively modern origins.





Conclusion

The earthwork survey of land adjacent to The Great House, Dilwyn, Herefordshire has provided a record of the extant earthworks and has considered their form, functioning and chronological development within the context of the wider historic landscape.

Determination of the significance of the remains outlined above comes from the assessment of the earthworks in relation to English Heritage (2008) guidance however with any interpretation of such ambiguous earthworks that are not instantly identifiable, such as ridge and furrow, present us with a level of conjecture as to the function and chronological development and this must be accepted when assessing the significance of such features.

The survey has identified the within the proposed development area several raised features forming levelled areas and possible linear field divisions or track ways are present these may be indicative of an agricultural heritage rather than suggesting that the site was once occupied, however is practically impossible to date the earthworks recorded within the proposed development site on form alone or to confirm the function of such structures without further physical investigation, therefore it must be accepted that the identification of such earthworks adjacent to the historic core of the village and located in such close proximity to the moated site and earthworks associated with the site of "Dilwyn Castle" may suggests that the earthworks within the proposed development site share a contemporary relationship, again it must be emphasised is not possible to date or suggest the function of the earthworks observed within the proposed development site on form alone, However the project has archived its aim by identifying and recording the earthworks.

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

An old excav trench on motte, whose report found no stonework stopped only 18" from foundations. Site fo protected by a marsh, mere & fishponds on two thirds of circuit, now mostly drained. (6)

The author was on site to examine the builder's excavations and foundation trenches throughout the development. Finds were retrieved from the site including probable 12th century pottery. After the development there remains the partial ringwork bank on a mound. Historical information is included in the account with reference to those that held the land from 1086. Comment and speculation on the present evidence includes the possibility that Dilwyn was one of the few stone square or rectangular keeps in Herefordshire. The tower might have been surrounded by a shell-wall built up behind the rampart. Indicating a very strong castle, although there is no conclusive proof of this. Discussion is also included of the possible destruction of the site when the fee holding moved from the castle some time after 1200. (7)

Since the visit in 1993 houses have been built near the base of the motte, gardens have encroached onto the motte slopes and the tower keep platform is less clear due to soil build up. (8)

Series of early grave slabs fitted to walls around the font, as are a number of floor tiles. Latter are large, bearing coats of arms and foliage; the only identified parallels so far are at Hailes Abbey in Gloucestershire (Hilary White). A trench for an electricity cable put in in 2001 revealed the foundations of a stone-faced brick building on the north side of the church. (6) Watching brief carried out in 2004. (7)





Coursed rubble with ashlar dressings under a slate roof with an octagonal shingled spire. West tower, nave with north and south aisles, north transept, chancel and north vestry. The west tower, of c1200, is of three stages with a timber spire probably added in the C18. The tower has clasping buttresses, battered plinth with roll moulding and a C18 crenellated parapet. The third stage has a semi-octagonal head, probably C19, in the south wall, with a lancet to the west wall. The first stage has lancets with double roll mouldings. The ground stage has lancets with dog toothed labels set in pilaster buttresses. The late C13 south aisle is of five bays with a four-bay clerestorey above. This has square-headed windows, each of two trefoiled lights. The aisle windows below are each of two lights, trefoiled to the west, then pointed to east of south door, trefoiled and finally cinquefoiled, the latter three under two-centred heads. The south porch of the late C15 or early C16 has a tall outer two-centred arch with moulded and shafted jambs. The side walls are of two bays, each with a window of two ogee trefoiled lights with a quatre-foil under the two-centred head. Internally, a moulded respond is carried up to support the central roof truss, the mouldings continuing across the tie-beam. The contemporary south door has a two-centred arch and moulded jambs. The outer rolls of the jambs are continued up to form the sides of tall

trefoiled panels flanking the door with moulded brackets for statues. North aisle of three bays to west with two windows; each of two trefoiled lights with quatrefoil under two- centred head, with blocked north door between. Above the clerestorey are two windows, each of two trefoiled lights. North transept added in early C14 has diagonal buttresses. The north window is of three trefoiled lights with a traceried head under a two-centred arch. East and west windows are each of two cinquefoiled lights under a two-centred head. The chancel is also late CI3 with clasped buttresses. The south wall is of three bays, the western window of two trefoiled lights under a twocentred head, the central one a trefoil lancet, that to east of two cinquefoiled lights under a two-centred head. The priests' door to the west of the central window has a two-centred cusped head. The north wall has two 2-light windows similar to those in the south wall flanking the north vestry. It has a simple lancet in the east and west walls. The east window of the chancel has three lights, the outer two trefoiled, the central light cinquefoiled, all under a two-centred head. Interior has similar arcades of five bays to the north and south aisles. These have twocentred arches of two chamfered orders with chamfered labels which have head stops. The cylindrical columns have moulded capitals and bases. The eastern columns of each arcade bear a corbel to support a statue. The south arcade is aligned centrally on the tower arch, which has a central pier forming the respond of the arcade. This is probably contemporary with the two-centred tower arch of three chamfered orders, the inner order supported on three engaged filleted shafts. There is the scar of a steep roof of the former nave (centred on the tower) above this arch. A lean-to arch of two chamfered orders separates the north transept from the remaining three bays of the north aisle. The chancel arch is two-centred of three chamfered orders, with engaged respond shafts to the inner order. To north of arch a square-headed door formed the entrance to the rood loft, with the lower doorway into the north transept. In the north wall of the chancel there is a C14 tomb recess which haste hollow chamfered segmental-pointed head with ball flower ornament, a moulded label with crockets, head stops and finial. The side shafts have carved finials. The recess contains a C14 stone effigy of a knight. Fittings: C15 screen dividing off the east bay of the south aisle of seven bays to the north, three bays to the west, all with ogee trefoiled and traceried heads. Doorway in west side with two similar heads. Chancel screen, C15, of five bays including central door with a square head carved with monsters, and above a 3-light open- ing with ogee trefoiled heads, with similar heads to the 3-light bays on each side. The moulded main posts have carved mole heads at the base. The fan-vaulted canopy above is probably C19. The north transept screen, also C15, is of four bays, with the doorway to west of centre. The western bay is of three lights, the other two each of four lights, all with ogee trefoiled heads. The main posts all have pilasters with carved finials. The C12 font is a cracked simple round tapering bowl. The C14 font has an octagonal con- tinuously moulded bowl with panelled stem. 




