


Figure 1. Location Plan

#### PART 1 INTRODUCTION

#### Background to scheme:

Avalon Heritage Ltd (AHL) has been commissioned by Mrs. Clare Sandford (the applicant) to prepare a Heritage Statement (HS) in relation to an outline planning application to be submitted to Wyre Forest District Council (the LPA, planning application no. 19/0352/FULL) for planning consent for the change of use of agricultural land for the erection of thirteen holiday lodges, with associated track, drainage and the erection of a replacement building following the demolition of two existing buildings.

The LPA, however, has raised objections to the planning application on the basis that the proposal will adversely impact on the landscape character zone in which the application site is situated. This character zone is described as *Forest Smallholdings and Dwellings* in the Worcestershire Landscape Character Assessment. The LPA have also classed the land associated with Olive Tree as an undesignated heritage asset recorded on the Worcestershire Historic Environment Record (WSM59121)R). Olive Tree itself, which is represented by a brick cottage of early to mid-19<sup>th</sup> century, is also considered to be an undesignated heritage asset and is recorded on the Worcestershire HER (WSM51471).



This HS contains a statement of significance of any heritage assets effected by the proposal, including the contribution to that significance from their settings and an identification of the potential impacts to that significance from the proposal as well as a justification for why the proposal should be granted planning permission by the LPA.

This report has been undertaken with reference to guidance prepared by the Chartered Institute for Archaeologists and Historic England and following consultation of planning guidance on the historic environment published by Wyre Forest District Council. In particular, the following guidance has been used in the preparation of this report:

A site visit was undertaken by the author of this report in order to assess the significance and settings of the non-designated heritage assets concerned and to evaluate potential impacts from the proposal on that significance.

Application site:




Figure 2. Site location.

The application site is located between Cleobury Mortimer and Bewdley in the hamlet of Finger Post to the south of the Wyre Forest (Figure 2). The site is surrounded on all sides by small paddocks laid down to pasture whilst its boundaries are delineated by hedges comprising well- established vegetation and mature trees. Access to the application site is through a gated entrance off Buckeridge Lane. Inside of the gates is an open parking area which adjoins a track which leads past Olive Tree and down into the development area (Plate 1). The parking area and access track are laid down to hard core.

The central part of the development area is also laid down to hard core and contains a large brick and corrugated metal shed as well as a shipping container and several camper vans (Plate 2). To the east of the metal shed is a large chalet type building which is where the applicant lives (Plate 3).

The northeastern portion of the application site is overgrown and covered in uneven ground beneath ruderal vegetation suggesting that this part of the site has been used for rubbish dumping at some point (Plate 4). A dilapidated, open fronted corrugated metal shed occupies the southeastern corner of this rough ground (Plate 5).

In contrast, the northwestern half of the application site comprises gently undulating open pasture (Plate 6). As a whole the application site slopes down towards the northeast.

Olive Tree, is a two-storey brick cottage with canted bay windows projecting to either side of the front door (Plate 7). It does not display any particular architectural detailing on the front elevation apart from a segmental arch over one of the ground floor windows. The north west gable end has been mostly rendered whilst the back of the cottage is adjoined by a large modern, flat roofed extension overlooking a child's play area (Plate 8).

#### PART 2- HERITAGE AND SIGNIFICANCE

Historic context:

A HER search based on a 1000m radius of the application site was undertaken as part of the preparation of this report (Appendix 3). The HER provides a helpful summary of the historic and archaeological context of the application site and its environs. Extracts of the summary are included below:

The application site is situated on the southern Edge of the Wyre Forest which is geologically based on sandstone bedrock with superficial deposits of alluvium. The surrounding landscape is heavily wooded with significant ancient woodlands and the field patter is a patchwork of small planned enclosure fields that have seen some modern reorganization. Historically, the settlement pattern was characterised by dispersed clusters of settlements and small holdings although modern development has resulted in the growth of settlement along the main roads. The area contains a number of unlisted historic buildings the earliest of them dating to the 18th century including farm buildings and dwellings. The *Historic Farmsteads of Worcestershire* 



also records twenty-five farmsteads and four out-farms mainly dating to the 19<sup>th</sup> century. Olive Tree itself probably originated as a small-scale farmstead with associated paddocks and fields.

The post medieval period is represented by a village pound, a possible limekiln and several farm ponds. In addition, a coppice, trackways, ditches and field boundaries are also recorded which may date to the post medieval period if not earlier. Twentieth century records are also represented relating to the defence of Worcestershire during the WW2.

The HER acknowledges that there has been very little archaeological investigation within the area apart from a single watching brief and two programmes of building recording. The lack of archaeological investigation means that the potential for preserved archaeological remains within the area around the application site is more or less unknown.




Figure 3. Extract of digitized Tithe Map.






Figure 4. Extract from the Tithe Map 1842.

The 1842 Tithe Map confirms that Olive Tree was present by this time and that it sat amidst a series of small to medium irregularly shaped fields and paddocks (Figures 3 & 4). At this time Olive Tree was described as *House and Pig run* suggesting that small-scale husbandry was being carried out there at least during the first half of the 19<sup>th</sup> century if not before. The application site was divided up into irregularly shaped fields which were given over to a mixture of arable, meadow and pasture. To the west of the house a small square building is also depicted. The Tithe Apportionment records that the house and several of the fields within the application area belonged to one Oliver Isaac. Specifically, *House and Pig run, Pleck by House, Pleck* meaning a small plot of land or enclosure, *Pool Meadow* and *Orchard Meadow* (Figure ). This shows that Olive Tree most likely originated as a small farmstead with a mix of pasture, meadow and arable.




Figure 5. Extract from the OS County Series: Worcestershire 1889  $-\,1892.$

By the late 19<sup>th</sup> century the OS Map (Figure 5) shows that there had been some changes of land use within the fields previously owned by Oliver Isaac. The western field, previously a meadow, appears to have been converted to orchard and is abutted on its south east edge by a small square sub-division of the adjacent field. This may have been an enclosure for livestock or perhaps an allotment.




Figure 6. Extract from the OS County Series: Worcestershire 1929.




Figure 7. Extract from the OS Plan 1972.






Figure 8. OS Map 2019.

Little appears to change within the Olive Tree fields by the time of the 1929 OS Map (Figure 6) apart from the appearance of a building at the north east end of the previously mentioned sub-division/enclosure. Similarly, the OS Map 1972 (Figure 7) depicts more or less the same layout as earlier although small buildings have appeared to the rear of Olive Tree and the map now identifies a pond and a well being present to the north of the cottage at the edge of the field. These features may well have been present during earlier periods but were not marked. The field pattern at the application site has remained relatively unchanged since the time of the Tithe Map to the present day (Figure 8).

#### Assessment of

#### Significance and Setting:

Historic England concedes that assessments of **significance** may be subjective, but the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) notes that it is ultimately for the LPA to assess significance based on evidence provided by applicants. This HS is primarily intended to provide that evidence and this report suggests the following for the LPA to consider when exercising its planning judgement (see Appendix 1 for detail on assessing significance and setting). This HS will adhere to the NPPF definition of setting as *the surroundings in which a heritage asset is experienced* and its definition of significance as *the value of a heritage asset to this and future generations because of its heritage interest*.

Olive Tree:

The cartographic evidence shows that Olive Tree was in existence by the time of the Tithe Map in 1842. On this basis, the cottage, whilst not listed, is a heritage asset. Its heritage significance arises largely from its evidential and historic values which result from the preservation of original built fabric along with documentary evidence of historic ownership and agricultural regimes. It is not an aesthetically pleasing or architecturally interesting building being relatively plain, and much altered on all elevations by later modifications, in particular a large flat-roofed extension to the rear. In turn, these modern alterations have served to diminish the evidential value of the cottage. As a much-altered undesignated heritage asset the cottage on its own has very limited heritage significance. However, the cottage in combination with the survival of a field pattern historically associated with it endows the cottage with a slightly increased level of heritage significance.



In terms of the setting of the cottage this is essentially the extensive areas of hard core occupying the entranceway and the central portion of the application site, including the large metal farm building and the chalet occupied by the applicants. The current surroundings of the cottage do not contribute positively to its setting, despite longer views from the cottage towards the field north west of the house, historically used as an orchard/meadow and now used as a horse paddock, and northeastwards towards the edge of the Wyre Forest.

Historic Landscape:

The cartographic evidence shows that the field pattern within the application site and in the surrounding area was present by at least the early 1800s but more likely represents a much earlier process of gradual, piecemeal assarting of land from the Wyre Forest for agricultural purposes. The existing fieldscape, therefore, represents continuity of boundaries over a very prolonged period of time. As a consequence, the significance of the landscape within the application area is largely vested in the evidential and historic values it possesses as part of the wider historic landscape in the area.

The application site is included in the *Worcestershire Landscape Characterisation Assessment* as *Forest Smallholdings and Dwellings*. The latter is described in that document as:

Occurring in Worcestershire solely around the fringes of the Wyre Forest, this is an intimate, densely settled landscape characterised by strings of wayside cottages and associated smallholdings. These nestle within a complex matrix of wayside cottages and narrow interlocking lanes, usually defined by prominent, dense hedges with hedgerow trees. The consistency of human activity in these distinctive, small-scale landscapes has resulted in a unified, palpably domestic character.

Key characteristics highlighted in the document are primarily:

- Hedgerow boundaries to fields
- Scattered hedgerow and garden trees
- Intimate spatial character
- Intricate network of narrow, interlocking lanes
- Densely settled pattern of wayside dwellings
- Distinctive building style small cottages of brick or stone.

The application site possesses a number of the attributes described above and therefore, makes a contribution to the local historic environment.



Aesthetically the value of the application site in its current form is very limited. The presence of large areas of hardcore in the central portion of the site along with the presence of the overly large modern farm building has greatly diminished its attractiveness and they represent visually jarring features within the confines of the application site. Similarly, the northeastern portion of the application site, which contains a dilapidated metal shed and is laid down to rough ground and weed, detracts considerably from the aesthetic value of the site. Moreover, despite its rural location the application site does not possess the sort of quiet and tranquility which might be expected from a countryside site due to the noise generated by the nearby A4117 and A456 which are busy main roads.

#### PART 3 – PLANNING POLICY, PROPOSALS AND IMPACT ASSESSMENT.

Planning

Policy:

Relevant national planning policy and legislation makes clear that LPAs are under an obligation to consider not only the preservation/conservation of heritage assets but also the impacts from a proposed development on their significance and on the contribution to that significance provided by their setting. Based upon the information provided by an applicant the decision-maker must apply planning judgement to the particular facts and circumstances, having regard to the relevant policy, guidance and advice (see Appendix 2 for detail of guidance and legislation).

Local Planning Policy is laid down in the *Core Strategy (2006 – 2026) Adopted 2010, Wyre Forest Local Development Framework*. This document contains a number of policies relevant to the historic landscape and historic environment.

Policy CP11: Quality Design and Local Distinctiveness states:

New developments and their layouts should take into account heritage assets and where possible utilize historic streets, buildings, spaces and infrastructure as an integral part of the scheme design. Subsequent DPDs which allocate sites will take full account of the heritage assets within the landscapes and settlements. The positive management of the District's historic environment and heritage assets will be taken forward through the development of appropriate SPDs.

Policy CP12: Landscape Character states:

New developments must protect and where possible enhance the unique character of the landscape including the individual settlement and hamlet within which it is located.

The Worcestershire County Council Landscape Character Assessment and Historic Landscape Characterisation will be used when determining applications for development within rural



areas. The Worcestershire Landscape Character Assessment and Historic Landscape Characterisation will form the basis for the development of supplementary guidance relating to landscape character.

Proposals:

The proposal is for the creation of a small holiday site comprising thirteen timber lodges painted green and brown. The lodges will measure 12.8m x 6.8m and have two bedrooms, two bathrooms and a living area with kitchen, dining and seating.

The layout of the proposal (Appendix 4) will be for the holiday lodges to be dispersed over the whole of the application site served by an access track using the existing gateway from Buckeridge Lane using permeable stone material. Each lodge will have a parking area for one vehicle, and they will also be laid down to permeable stone material.

Soft landscaping proposals will include the planting of new native species trees, hedges and areas of wildflowers at the western edge of the site. The design takes into account the recommendations forwarded in the Landscape and Visual Impact Assessment and the Extended Phase 1 Habitat Survey.

As part of the proposal the large metal shed in the centre of the application site along with the extensive area of hard standing will be removed.

The proposal is also fully reversible and will entail limited ground disturbance.

Impact of Proposals:

In accordance with NPPF impacts on significance from the proposed scheme have been judged in this HS using the criteria of **no harm**, **less than substantial harm and substantial harm**.

The Conservation Officer at Wyre District Council has raised a concern that the proposal and the previously submitted documentation as part of the planning application do not take into account the impacts of the proposal on the landscape associated with Olive Tree, considered to be an undesignated heritage asset recorded on the Worcestershire HER (WSM59121). He considered this to be a fundamental failure to recognize the significance of the historic environment at this particular location. Specifically, the Conservation Officer states:

I consider that the introduction of numerous structures as proposed in the application of this hitherto agricultural site will introduce a density of development more akin to an urban area rather than a rural area. It will radically alter the existing historic development characteristics of this part of the former hamlet of Fingerpost, which is characterised by small wayside brick and stone dwellings, separated by small fields with remnants of orchards and hedgerow trees.



The proposed development amounts to harm to the historic landscape associated with Olive Tree. I doubt it could be considered less than substantial as the nature of the proposed development will radically alter the site with new structures and access roads.

It has been shown by the cartographic analysis in this HS that the field pattern at Olive Tree is certainly part of a wider historic landscape shown on the 1842 Tithe Map. However, it is questionable how far the proposal for holiday accommodation causes harm to the historic landscape directly associated with Olive Tree in addition to the wider historic landscape.

It is quite clear that the proposed layout of the holiday accommodation is within the confines of the existing historic field boundaries shown on the Tithe Map (the boundary which originally separated Orchard Meadow from Pool Meadow no longer exists in its entirety). All sides of the application site are therefore delineated by historic hedgerows which will remain in situ. The proposal will, in fact, entail extensive planting of native trees and shrubs to reinforce the historic hedgerow boundaries around the application site.

As a consequence, the proposal will sustain and not impinge upon the integrity of the historic field pattern which still exists at Olive Tree. On that basis the proposal would not conflict with the key attributes of the *Forest Smallholdings and Dwellings* characterization contained in the *Worcestershire Landscape Characterisation Assessment*.

The application site does not contain any demonstrable physical characteristics that would elevate it above the level of the general countryside in this area and which would be adversely affected by the proposal. The reversibility of the proposal also means that at some future point, should it be considered desirable or necessary, the land which will have suffered minor disturbance could be turned back to agricultural use.

In terms of the wider area around the application site there are no designated or undesignated heritage assets listed on the Worcestershire Historic Environment whose settings would be impacted by the proposal. Similarly, the wider historic landscape, characterised by a pattern of hedged pastures and orchards assarted from the woodland with an intimate spatial character and narrow winding lanes with wayside dwellings, will remain unchanged and capable of being appreciated and understood in terms of its significance by present and future generations.



The proposed holiday site has also been designed to be visually confined within the existing hedgerows in order to limit any views of it from vantage points around the site. Where gaps are present, or vegetation thins out, the proposal entails additional planting to augment the screening around the site. This has been confirmed by the Landscape and Visual Impact Assessment (Moss 2019) which concludes that the site is extremely well contained visually in all directions as a result of the local topography, neighbouring development and the trees/hedgerows around the site and in the wider landscape.

The Conservation Officer also objected to the potential for the proposal to introduce an inappropriate *urban form* into a rural area. However, it is the contention of this Heritage Statement that whilst a structural form will admittedly be introduced into the area it would not constitute an urban form. Rather, the proposed materiality, colour and design of the timber holiday lodges will be low-key and capable of blending in with the surroundings. In the balance it should also be considered that in its current form, the application site does not make a particularly positive contribution to the historic landscape.

Only the western half of the site now functions as a paddock with the remainder of the site either being laid down to extensive areas of unattractive hard standing or rough, weed covered ground. Also, to be considered is the presence of the dilapidated metal shelter in the northeastern portion of the site, along with the large modern metal farm building towards the centre of the site. In combination, these unsympathetic aspects of the application site do not make a positive contribution to either the site itself not to the wider picturesque landscape. Therefore, the removal of the large metal shed, and of the unattractive hard standing, would be beneficial to the appearance of the surrounding area.

In judging the proposal, therefore, it would perhaps be more informative if it is considered in its entirety. Whilst involving a loss of historically open ground within the application site, therefore effecting a non-designated heritage asset, the proposed holiday lodges along with additional planting and landscaping, will actually be an improvement on the current layout and appearance of the application site. In turn, this would enhance rather than detract from the setting of the non-designated Olive Tree, the hamlet of Fingerpost and the landscape in general. Importantly, the proposal will not result in the loss of any surviving elements of historic boundaries and field patterns.

It should also be considered that vacationing within the Wyre Forest area has been a long-standing tradition and that holiday villages and caravan sites have been part of the landscape since at least the end of WW2. It cannot, therefore, be argued that they are an alien feature at odds with the historic landscape.



On the basis of all of the above it is judged that the proposal would not cause harm to the historic environment in the locality as a whole and will not adversely impact on the ability of present and future generations to experience the distinctive qualities of the historic landscape in this part of Worcestershire.

#### PART 4 - CONCLUSION

It is the conclusion of this HS that the proposal will not harm the significance of the non-designated landscape directly associated with Olive Tree or of the wider historic landscape. It is further considered that despite the more structural form which will be introduced to the application site, the traditional appearance of the timber lodges and the low-key nature of the proposal as whole would not fundamentally diminish the historical integrity of the application site nor would it unacceptably jar visually with the wider landscape.

In the case of this application, the HS concludes that the absence of harm to the significance and settings of designated and undesignated heritage assets in the vicinity of the site should lead to a positive response in heritage terms when the proposal is weighed in the balance by the LPA. This would be in accord with NPPF which states:

In particular, when weighing the impact of a development on the significance of a non-designated heritage asset LPAs will need to use a balanced judgement regarding the scale of any harm or loss and the significance of the heritage asset.

In this case that balanced judgement should also consider that apart from the economic opportunities for local employment and increased tourism that the proposal will facilitate, there will be an incremental increase in exposure of the distinctive historic landscape and its associated heritage assets within the locality.

This HS has described the heritage significance of designated and non-designated heritage assets within the vicinity of the proposal, assessed the potential impacts of the proposal on their significance, including from development within their settings and provided reasons why the scheme should be allowed. This fulfils the role of the HS to support the planning application through the provision of a proportionate level of information for the LPA to make their planning judgement.

## **APPENDIX 1**

#### ASSESSING SIGNIFICANCE

The NPPF glossary describes **significance** as the value of a heritage asset to this and future generations because of its heritage interest. The Historic England publication *Managing Significance in Decision Taking in the Historic Environment (GPA 3, 2015a*) states that an understanding of the nature, extent and level of the significance of a heritage asset is necessary in assessing how adaptable an asset may be to change, the best means of conservation and how relevant policies should be applied.

Historic England's publication *Conservation Principles* (HE, 2008) further clarifies the concept of significance as the value of a heritage asset which may be evidential, historical, aesthetic or communal.

**Evidential value** is defined as the potential of a place to yield evidence about past human activity and primarily associated with physical remains or historic fabric.

**Historical value** arises from the ways in which past people, events and aspects of life can be connected through a place to the present. This can derive from particular aspects of past ways of life. It can provide a direct link to the past and to notable families, persons, events or movements.

**Aesthetic value** is the way in which a heritage asset provides sensory and intellectual stimulation including design value such as of a building, structure or landscape as a whole. It may also include its physical form, and how it lies within its setting.

**Communal value** is the meaning of a place to the people who relate to it and for whom it relates to their collective experience or memory. It may be commemorative or symbolic and be associated with identity or collective memory.

The significance of a heritage asset is normally related to a combination of some or all of these values.

The contribution that **setting** makes to the significance of a heritage asset is considered to mean the surroundings in which a heritage asset is experienced. NPPF makes it clear that *the* 



setting of a heritage asset is the surroundings in which a heritage asset is experienced. Its extent is not fixed and may change as the asset and its surroundings evolve. Elements of a setting may make a positive or negative contribution to the significance of an asset, may affect the ability to appreciate that significance or may be neutral.

Setting is not a heritage asset, nor a heritage designation. Its importance lies in what it contributes to the significance of the heritage asset (Historic England GPA 3 *The Setting of Heritage Assets*).

The extent and importance of setting is often expressed by reference to visual considerations. Although views of or from a heritage asset will play an important part, the way a heritage asset is experienced in its setting is also influenced by other environmental factors such as noise, dust and vibration from other land uses in the vicinity and by our understanding of the historic relationship between places (ibid).

Historic England provides guidance on approaches to assessing the setting of a heritage asset and its contribution to the significance of the heritage asset. A staged approach is advised:

- **Step 1** is to identify which heritage assets and their setting are affected;
- Step 2 is to assess whether, how and to what degree these settings make a contribution to the significance of the heritage asset and considers the physical surrounding of the asset, including its relationship with other heritage assets, the way the asset is appreciated and the asset's associations and patterns of use;
- Step 3, if appropriate, is to assess the effect of the proposed development on the significance of an asset by considering its location/siting, form/appearance, additional effects and permanence;
- Step 4 is to maximise enhancement and minimise harm;
- Step 5 relates to making and documenting the decision and monitoring outcomes.



## **APPENDIX 2**

#### NATIONAL PLANNING POLICY AND LEGISLATION

Section 2 of the NPPF, *Achieving Sustainable Development* states that the purpose of the planning system is to contribute to the achievement of sustainable development, described as the objective of meeting the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs. So that sustainable development is pursued in a positive way, at the heart of NPPF is a presumption in favour of sustainable development.

For decision-taking this means:

- Approving development proposals that accord with an up-to-date development plan, or.
- Where there are no relevant development plan policies, or the policies which are most important for determining the application are out of date, granting permission unless:
  - a. the application of policies in the Framework that protect areas or assets of particular importance provides a clear reason for refusing the development proposed, or,
  - b. any adverse impacts of doing so would significantly and demonstrably outweigh the benefits, when assessed against the policies in the Framework taken as a whole.

In this regard the NPPF recognizes that heritage assets are an irreplaceable resource which should be conserved in a manner appropriate to their significance, so that they can be enjoyed for their contribution to the quality of life of existing and future generations.

Section 16 of the NPPF sets out the Government's planning policies on the historic environment and how these are expected to be implemented. The emphasis is on planning requirements and decisions within the planning system being relevant and proportionate to the significance of a heritage asset potentially affected by a proposal.

Paragraph 194 of the NPPF states that any harm to, or loss of the significance of a designated heritage asset (from alteration or destruction or from development within its setting) should require clear and convincing justification. Where a proposed development will lead to **substantial harm** to (or total loss of significance) of a designated heritage asset, LPAs should refuse consent unless it can be demonstrated that the substantial harm or total loss is



necessary to achieve substantial public benefits (para. 195). Where a development proposal will lead to **less than substantial harm** to the significance of a designated heritage asset, this harm should be weighed against the public benefits of the proposal including, where appropriate, securing its optimum viable use (para. 196).

Where non-designated heritage assets are concerned the NPPF requires that LPAs take into account the impact of a proposal on the significance of the heritage asset in determining the application. In particular, when weighing the impact of a development on the significance of a non-designated heritage asset LPAs will need to use a balanced judgement regarding the scale of any harm or loss and the significance of the heritage asset (para. 197).

In determining planning applications, the NPPF also requires that LPAs should take account of the desirability of sustaining and enhancing the significance of heritage assets and putting them to a viable use consistent with their conservation. It also encourages LPAs to consider the positive contribution that conservation of heritage assets can make to sustainable communities including their economic vitality.

#### The NPPF defines archaeological interest as:

....evidence of past human activity worthy of expert investigation at some point. Heritage assets with archaeological interest are the primary source of evidence about the substance and evolution of places, and of the people and cultures that made them.

All heritage assets, including those within the historic built environment, can have archaeological interest, but very often archaeological interest pertains to buried remains and above-ground remains in the form of earthworks and historic landscape features.

The NPPF emphasises that the information required in support of applications for planning permission should be no more than is necessary for an LPA to reach an informed decision and that the level of information provided needs to be proportionate to the significance of the heritage asset affected and the impact on that significance (including setting) from a proposed development.

Therefore, the aim of this HIS is to provide a sufficient level of information regarding the presence of designated and undesignated heritage assets (including buried archaeological remains) and the potential impact on them of the proposed development in order for the LPA to exercise its planning judgement with regard to the planning application in question.

The Listed Buildings Act 1990 which sets out the general duties of Local Planning Authorities with regard to the exercise of planning functions within a conservation area and the relationship of proposals to any listed buildings states:



In considering whether to grant planning permission for development which affects a listed building or its setting, the local planning authority, or as the case may be, the Secretary of State, shall have special regard to the desirability of preserving the building or its setting or any features of special architectural or historic interest which it possesses (Section 66).

With regard to development affecting buildings or land in a conservation area the Act requires the LPA to pay special attention to *the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of that area* (Section 72).

# Introduction

The **Historic Environment Record** for Worcestershire is held in a GIS (Geographical Information System). This is a computer system designed to allow users to collect, manage and analyse large volumes of spatially referenced information and associated attribute data. When you request information from us on a particular area, we carry out a spatial search on a grid reference (or a specific area) supplied by you, which will bring up all the records within that area. Unless otherwise requested, the search radius will be restricted to everything within 500m of the centre point of the proposed investigation (or a 250m buffer along pipelines).

If you are conducting research it must be remembered that the results of an HER search are designed to be a starting point, not a complete record. The sources mentioned in the full reports should be consulted in order to fully understand the nature of the archaeology in your search area. We <u>strongly recommend</u> that you come to visit the HER once you have received your search results to consult all the sources mentioned along with other more general information that we hold. The Worcestershire **Historic Landscape Characterisation** Project (HLC) aims to improve our understanding of the County's landscape, and provide a context for its archaeological sites and monuments. Historic landscape characterisation provides a framework for informed landscape management strategies, spatial planning, development control and conservation issues at a local, regional and national level. HLC underpins historic environment advice given to planners, district councils and other environment or conservation agencies, enabling future changes within the historic environment to be monitored. It provides information, not judgements, and does not identify the "best" areas, rather allowing appropriate decisions to be made in the light of proposed change. # The HER data

This document contains two types of report:

- 1) The Single Line or Short Report this provides the basic information: the WSM Number, the Name/Title of the Record, the monument type, the date range and finally the National Grid Reference (the WSM number is the unique number given to each record within the HER).
- 2) The Full Report this provides the above information plus a more detailed description of the monument/site/find/fieldwork etc. It also contains the sources and references that the record is based upon and gives its relationship (if any) to other associated sites. A 'full' report is not definitive and all sources mentioned should be consulted to gain a full understanding of the record.

This report also contains the location of the records on maps (unless you have requested GIS data in a shape file, which will be sent in an email with this report). Where appropriate/requested we will also include historical maps.

#### 1) GIS Shape Files

We can provide site location data as shape files for use with your own GIS system. This is the best way of sending and receiving complex spatial information. We send this out by email.

In built up areas where there are a large number of records, the data will be sent out in several files. We will provide site location data as individually themed shape files for each type of record. This will allow you to switch on each HER archaeological theme independently and is most appropriate for use by our customers whose projects are located in areas of intense archaeological activity, where there is more likely to be a need to discreetly interrogate the data and examine spatial relationships.

#### 2) pdf Maps

If you do not have a GIS, location maps will be included in this report. The clarity of these maps is not perfect, but they are clear enough to distinguish all the site locations - especially if you zoom in.

The maps will show the location of all the sites in the report, labelled with the WSM number. **Please note:** The labels only give the approximate location of the sites and monuments. The reason for this is that if there is more than one record for a location or there are lots of sites in close proximity – i.e. on a street of historic houses – then the labels overlie each other and cannot be read. # **Archaeological Summary for WSM72018 Land at Olive Tree, Pound Bank, Rock**

An HER search was carried out on a 1000m radius of the provided site plan on 27/09/2019, as specified in the search request. 5 Archaeological activities and 101 HER Monuments were recorded.

The search area sits on the southern edge of the Wyre Forest based on sandstone bedrock geology with superficial deposits of alluvium. The landscape is heavily wooded with significant ancient woodlands, whilst the fieldscape is a patchwork of small planned enclosure fields that have seen some modern field reorganisation and amalgamation. The settlement pattern historically was one of infrequent clustered settlements and small holdings, but modern expansion has seen a string of linear developments along main roads.

Within the search area lie 1 Historic England Listed historic building and 37 other unlisted historic buildings. The earliest structures date to the 18<sup>th</sup> century and include farm buildings, dwellings and two milestones. 19<sup>th</sup> century structures include further farm buildings and a Methodist chapel, whilst the remaining structures include a 20<sup>th</sup> century village hall and school, war memorial and antitank cylinders used during the defence of Worcestershire during the Second World War. An Historic England funded project to identify the Historic Farmsteads of Worcestershire also recorded 25 farmsteads and 4 out farms mainly dating to the 19<sup>th</sup> century.

In addition to the built environment there are also monument records for the site of a number of farm buildings that are now demolished. The Post-Medieval period is represented in the monument record by a village pound, possible lime-kiln, a well and several farm ponds. A coppice, trackways, ditches and field boundaries are also recorded which may be post-medieval or earlier. 20<sup>th</sup> century records are also present, related to the defence of Worcestershire during the Second World War. Earlier records include two undated paleochannels and the Wyre Forest Coal field which covers the whole of the search area.

2 Portable Antiquity Scheme finds are recorded within the search area, both are lead objects dating to the medieval period. There has been very little archaeological investigation within the search area aside from a single watching brief and two building recordings. The lack of investigation within the wider landscape also means that survival of below and above ground remains, and potential for further deposits, is largely unknown.

# **Statutory and other Designations**

#### **Scheduled Monuments**

Scheduled monuments are those considered to be monuments of national importance. The Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979, supports a formal system of Scheduled Monument Consent (SMC) for any work to a designated monument. Any works within a Scheduled area will require SMC, including non-invasive techniques. There are no Scheduled areas within the search area.\*

#### **Listed Buildings**

The Secretary of State for Culture, Media and Sport holds a List of Buildings of Special Architectural or Historic Interest, considered to be of national importance. Compiled under the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990, the List includes structures from boundary walls and telephone boxes to cathedrals. Listing gives statutory protection and restrictions apply. Consent may be required for works to, or that affect the setting of, a Listed Building and the LPA conservation officer should be consulted if in doubt. There is 1 Listed Building within the search area.\*

#### **Conservation Areas**

A Conservation Area is an area considered worthy of preservation or enhancement because of its special architectural or historic interest, "the character or appearance of which it is desirable to preserve or enhance," as required by the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 (Section 69 and 70). There are additional planning controls over certain works carried out within the Conservation Area. The designation does not preclude development from taking place, but does require that developments preserve or enhance the historic character of the area, for example by ensuring that newly constructed buildings are of a high quality design. Conservation Area status also removes some permitted development rights that apply in undesignated areas. The Conservation Areas are maintained by the relevant Districts. #### **Registered Parks and Gardens**

Historic England holds a Register of Historic Parks and Gardens of Special Historic Interest. These Registered landscapes are graded I, II\* or II, and include private gardens, public parks and other green spaces. They are valued for their design, diversity and historical importance. Inclusion on the Register brings no additional statutory controls, but there is a presumption in favour of conservation. LPAs are required to consult Historic England on applications affecting sites Registered as grade I or II\* and the Garden History Society on sites of all grades. There are no Registered Parks within the search area.\*

#### **Registered Battlefields**

There are two Registered Battlefields in Worcestershire, The Battle of Evesham and The Battle of Worcester. Registered Battlefields are not currently graded as a means of ascribing relative significance. They do not carry any statutory designation, but there is a presumption in favour of preservation. There are no Registered Battlefields within the search area.\*

#### **Locally Listed Historic Buildings**

Worcester City, Redditch Borough and Wyre Forest District have a Schedule of Buildings of Local Interest. These are buildings considered to be of local or regional importance which make a significant contribution to the historic environment character of an area. They do not carry any statutory designation, but local policies make it clear that retention of these structures is important to the historic environment. There are no locally listed buildings within the search area.\*

\* Heritage Assets are designated by English Heritage. It is possible that the HER is out of date. EH (or the LPA as appropriate) should be consulted for confirmation of designated status. NB. Other statutory designations may apply to your site, such as SSSI status. Palaeochannels: ancient silted up river channels, or other watercourses that are often associated with well-preserved organic remains and historic environment features

Palaeo-environmental: Organic remains associated with past landscapes. Such deposits can reveal information about climate, the types of fauna and flora in a landscape and past human activity

Ridge and furrow: large-scale earthworks associated with former medieval and post-medieval open-field communal farming that appear as a distinctive corrugated surface

SWR: The unique number given to each report, document, map etc


