Only stratified sherds from Phases 1-3 are described here. Information about the remainder has been deposited with the finds.

Dr 37, SG, broken ovolo. Flav-Traj.
Trench 1, UCS5
Dr 37 in the style of Drusus $i(x-3)$ of Les Martres. $S \& S$ 1, 13, no. 167 has the same scroll, rosette terminal, and beadrow. c. AD 100-120.

Dr 37, SG. Scroll with toothed leaves, the arcades divided into
groups of arrowheads above a hound (H.PL 26, no. 25) and a hare (H.PL 26, no. 62. For generally similar bowls, cf H. PLe 81, especially nos. 4 and 7. c. AD 75-90.

Dr 37 in the style of $\mathrm{X}-13$ ('Donnaucus') of Les Martres. The ornament is shown on S \& S PL. 42, no. 490 , the astragalus and small circle on ibid. PL 43, no. 493. The leaves and corded motifs were used in several similar saltires, the closest being Terrisse 1968, PL.32, no. 324, which lacks the second pair of beadrows in the upper portion. The warrior is 0.688/D.403. C. AD 100-125.

IVLI. T $\uparrow$ hVSS个Non Dr 33a. Die 3a, Iulius Talussa of Les Martres and Lezoux (3). This stamp has been recorded at Hadrian's Wall Turret 25b. He worked c. AD 110-135, probably moving to Lezoux c. 120. This cup is in Martrers fabric.

Trench 4, 4
Dr 29 probably, $S G$. The motifs - possibly including a badly impressed gladiator - are not identifiable. Pre-Flavian.

Dr 37; CG. Crown notif used by several Martres potters. Traj-Had. Dr 37 in the style of Drusus $i$ of Les Martres. The arcading with a similiar arrangement of latticed column, acanthus and 'anchor' motif, with the astragalus in the field, is on Terrisse 1968, PL.5, no. 123. The gladiator ( $0.1063 / \mathrm{D} .611$ ), warrior $(0.163 / D .106)$ and ovolo are on S \& S PL. 10, nos. 121 and 127. c. AD 100-120
Dr 37, CG. Possible freestyle design. Had-early Ant.

## Quadrant 3, 3b

Dr 37 in the style of $\mathrm{X}-13$ ('Donnaucus') of Les Martres. Circle as ovolo, with beads and astragalus, S \& S PL. 45, no. 521, the short corded motif, ibid. no. 528, and the vine scroll, and bird ibid. PL.49, no. 578. c. AD 100-125.

Dr 37 CG. Small double medallion, wavy line border, bead rosette terminal. Traj-Had. Burnt.

Dr 37, CG. Figure of goat or deer. Had-early Ant.
Dr 37, CG. Ovolo smudged but probably that used by X-12 ('Ioenalis') with similar beads (S \& S PL.40, no. 462). c. AD 100-125.

Quadrant 12, 4
Dr 37, SG, broken ovolo. Flav.

## Quadrant 14, 5

Dr 37, SG, blurred and broken ovolo. Flav-Traj

## Quadrant 26, 5

Dr 30, style of X-13 (Donnaucus') of Les Martres. Saltire of corded rods and leaves, $S \& S$ PL. 44, no. 513, ovolo, beads and rosette, ibid, PL 146 , no. 538; for similar use of parallel beadrows, cf ibid PL.43, no. 493 c. AD 100-125.

Dr 37 in the style of X-13 ('Donnaucus') of Les Martres. The corded and leaf motif, here in a freestyle arrangement, is on S \& S PL. 48, no. 566; the ramshorn wreath is on ibid. no. 568 c. $A D$ 100-125.

Dr 27g, stamp worn away, SG, C1.
Dr 37 in the style of $\mathrm{X}-5$ of Lezoux. Probably his ovolo, though broken; he used the Minerva ( $0.126 / \mathrm{D} .77$ ), cushion, leaf, background leaves, wavy Iines and astragalus ( $S$ \& $S$ PL. 67, nos. 1 and 4). C. AD 125-145. (Joins sherd from Q 14.4).

Dr 37, CG, early-mid C2; incompletely slipped under base. Dr 37, CG. Figure 0.322/D.184. Had-Ant.

## Quadrant 17, 3

Dr 29 probably SG. Lower frieze scroll with large toothed leaves and fine beaded bindings. Pre or early Flav.

Dr 37, CG. Possible freestyle design. Had - early Ant. Quadrant 17, 4

Dr 37 in the style of Drusus $i$ of Les Martres. $s \& S$ PL. 15, no. 184, has
the gladiators ( $0.1003 / \mathrm{D} .582 \mathrm{a}$ and 0.1004 ) beneath a group of arrowheads.
c. AD 100-120.

Dr 37, SG. Ovolo with small rosette tongue. c. AD 70-90.

Quadrant 18, 3
Dr 27, CG; the stamp is illegible. Early-mid C2.
Dr 37, SG. Scroll, the arcades divided between 'spectacle' scrolls
above small dog and a hare; basal wreath of s-gadroons. Cf. H.PL. 81, no. 7, for similar use of the motifs. c. AD 75-90.

Quadrant 18, 4
Dr 37, style of X-13 ('Donnaucus') of Les Martres. Wreath (S \& S PL. 43
no. 499), formal foliage R.G16. c. 100-125.

Quadrant 20, 5
Dr 37, CG. Vine scroll, probably. Traj-Had
Dr 37, CG. Apparently no exact parallel for the ovolo. It is similar
to that of Arcanus, but the tongue is finely corded. Traj-Had.
Small bowl or cup. There is a beaded moulding on the interior just above the base, and the wall has apparently been cut off at the same level. There is no apparent parallel. CG, early-mid C2 (Fig M1)

Quadrant 26, 4
Dr 37 in the style of Igocatus ( $\mathrm{X}-4$ ) of Les Martres. The figure (0.949) and characteristic wavy line/on S \& S PL. 17, no. 218 c. AD 100-120. Dr 37, SG, broken ovolo. Flavian.

Dr 29, SG. Triple leaf tassel, apparently from scrollery. Pre-Flav. Dr 37, CG. The ovolo is broken but is probably that used, sometimes with beads, by the Martres 'Potter of the Rosette' (S\&S PL. 22, no. 273). There is no apparent parallel for his using the plain double festoon, but it occurs as an arcade on Terrisse 1968, PL. 19, no. 1203; the motif inside it is rrobably a bird, as S\&S PL. 20, no. 250. c. AD 100-125.

Dr 37, CG. The ovolo may be R.G205, whose user is not known. Fine beads, small leaf motifs in the field. The rim has been grooved, and the interior is poorly finished. Had, probably (Fig M1)
Dr 37, CG. Panel with festoon or medallion and small circle. Dr 37, CG. Panel containing Apollo 0.83/84 variant. Had-Ant. Dr 37 in the style of Drusus ii of Lezoux. Ovolo, beads and small double medallion as S\&S PL. 88, no. 7. c. AD 125-145. Dr 37, CG. Part of ? animal. Traj-Had. Dr 37, CG. Ring-tongued ovolo with astragalus border, used by several Lexoux potters. Antonine.
(RV) FFI.MA on flat base. Die la, Ruffus ii or Lezoux (3) Ruffus' stamps, including this, have been noted in Antonine Scotland. His work also occurs in the Rhineland, suggesting activity in the first half of C 2 , though there are no examples of this particular stamp there. Ruffus made 18/31, 18/31R and 27. c. AD 130-155.
'Dr 37, CG. The ovolo has been damaged in finishing, and is not certainly identifiable; narrow beads beneath. Ilad-early Ant.

Dr 37, with ovolo and beads used by Attianus of Lezoux (S\&S PL. 87,
no. 23). c. AD 130-150.
Dr 37, CG. The broken ovolo is likely to be one used, with similar beads, by Sacer of Lezoux: S\&S PL. $\because 4$, no. 16. The lion may be 0.1497 J
c. $\mathrm{AD} \mathrm{125-145}$.

Dech 67, SG, barbotine leaves, Flavian.
Dech 67, SG, Darbotine leaves, Flav-Traj.
Déch 72, incised: as Oswald \& Pryce 1920, PL. 77, no. 4. CG, Ant

Dr 37, CG. Triple leaf used singly by X-10 ('Ranto-Silvio') on S\&S PL. 33, no. 393, and X-11 ('Ioenalis') on ibid. PL. 38, no. 451, here used in a cross in a panel of wavy lines. c. AD 100-125. Dr 37, fragment of decoration. CG. Traj-Had. Burnt. Dr 37, SG. The fragmentary ovolo probably has a triple tongue. The main frieze contains a resting stag beside a corded foliage arrangement: cf. H. PL. 88, no. 2; Grimes 1930, Fig. 37, no. 40.

Dr 37, CG. Cinnamus ovolo 3a and scroll (cf. S\&S PL. 162. no. 61.)
ㄷ. AD 150-170.
Dr 37 in the style of Albucius of Lezoux. The ovolo, astragalus borders, circle terminal, medallion, cupid, ( $0.450 / \mathrm{D} .265$ ) and Victory ( $0.826 / \mathrm{D} .484$ ) are all on S\&S PL. 120, no.1, the beaded circle on no. 2 , the corded motif on ibid. PL. 122, no.23. He used the panther, 0.1570/D.805. c. AD 150-180 (other pieces from Quadrant 3.4; another from Quadrant 3.3 is badly burnt). Dr 37:the broken ovolo is probably one used by Attianus of Lezoux with similar beads (S\&S PL. 85, no.6). The motifs in the panels are fragmentary but cf. the large leaf used in a saltire by the 'Large $S$ Potter' (ibid. PL. 76, no. 31). c. AD 125-150.

Dr 37 in the style of Cinnamus of Lezoux. His ovolo 3a, acanthus, cakestand, vase, lion ( $0.1421 / \mathrm{D} .753$ ), panther ( 0.1512 ), bird ( 0.2250 A ), beads, astragalus, and medallion: S\&S PL. 157, no. 10, PL. 159, no. 23 and 26, PL. 161, no. 50, PL. 162, no. 58 c. AD 150-170.

Déch 72, CC, barbotine leaves, CG, Ant.

Quadrant 3, 4
Dr 29, SG. Lower frieze wreath of triple leaves (cf. Atkinson 1914, PL. 8, no. 46)
above one of pointed leaves (cf. ibid. PL. 11, no. 54, by Mommo) and a basal frieze of festrons with small birds (D. 1009 and a bird looking back to right, without parallel), separated by a beadrow endirg in a bifid tassel. There are general links with such potters as Passienus. c. AD 55-70. Dr 37 probably. ? scrollery ; circle in field. Antonine.

Dr 37 in the style of X-13 ('Donnaucus') of Les Martres. The panel of Abundantia (0.802), Bacchus (0.622/D.362) and astragal!:s, with similar borders and rosette terminals, is shown on S\&S PL. 48, no. 574. c. AD 100-125.
