Observations: Overview of site ground works, topography, exposed stratigraphy, features and deposits.

Arrived on site and met Foreman Nick. He did not want to put a trench on the hard standing as he requires it for access. We therefore decided to excavate a trench through the garden which is less likely to be targeted. The garden steps to S and is overgrown and cluttered with debris.

Natural was observed at NW end appears to be cut by an amorphous feature of unfiled 1/2 backfilled material

Further on a cobbled surface containing 2 patterns / orientation was observed along 1/2 a wall projecting away from the trench. This area requires further archaeological investigation to ascertain extent and relationship of archaeology. Possible courtyard for some of access more was excavated to depth (see sketch plan) and the rest will be excavated on Tuesday.

A few burnt features also in evidence.

Ground works continuing. Due to site restrictions the contractors and I are slightly in each others way. I spent the morning clearing only to observe them putting down the upper bank and evening the area when open. I ceased because it was hazy. I advised the office of an exposed feature and received some advice from Andrew. This was excavated to more depth depth and get the machine to excavate to depth. As clearing he had photos was pointers at his junction whilst the engineers pulled the bank & marked it away. I excavated this feature. It appears to be a terrace feature here occurred. The soil up slope. Nothing a subterranean structure has been excavated and has been filled up with rubble.

Excavation confirmed showing unbetweem muck and a modern (Victorian+) truncation in soil to the west through the cobble and wall, I signed this over to the contractors, as once machine had finished.

Arrived on site. Due to a mutual decision and due to varying circumstances, lead content in the topsoil; the contractors have pulled off site and I can continue working unimpeded. I successfully cleared and re-recorded the wall & cobbles. The subterranean Feature has yielded many ^{cat storage} ^{3 items} ^{was} ^{possibly} used as a midden/ refuse dump. This appears to have been subsequently weeded and covered in a demolition/levelling layer. We were unable to excavate this feature with the machine as it could not be reached by the bucket without tracking on the cobble/wall. The cobbles have been truncated to the NW by the reinforcing wall parallel to the Workshop Cobb Wall and also to the NW west by a Victorian dump. See plan
