

No. II.—*Bills of Cravings of the Sheriff of Northumberland for 1715, of Expenses incurred by him relative to the Rebellion in that Year.*

(Communicated by WM. DICKSON, Esq., of Alnwick, Sept., 1836.)

THE originals are in the office of the Clerk of the Peace for Northumberland, and are Nos. 93, 94, 95, and 96, of the Michaelmas Sessions Papers for the year 1717. The Sheriff in the year of the rebellion was John Johnson, of Bebside, Esquire.

The accounts of Sheriffs being made up at the Exchequer yearly, to Michaelmas day, it is probable that those of the Sheriff who succeeded Mr. Johnson would contain a portion of the expenses. It would be curious to see the accounts of those two Sheriffs, as allowed by the officers of that Court, since it cost, £104. 5s. 6d., over and above the *ordinary* charge, to pass the account of Mr. Johnson, and sue out his quietus.
