ADDITIONS AND CORRECTIONS.

Page 14, line 13. The finding of a seam of coal in Jesmond Vale is mentioned so late as 1854.—*Newcastle Chronicle* for 11th August, 1854.

Page 52, last line of notes, for '1823' read '1283.'

Page 69, line 7. Adelyne Brabant, in the text called erroneously Adelyne Brahan, was married thrice, first to Thomas Lawson of Cramlington by whom she had issue, secondly to Roger Anderson and thirdly to James Cholmondley.—*Chancery Suits of the Time of Charles I.* Epitomised in the *Ancestor*, No 11, p. 169.

Page 72, line 6, for 'Bowes' read 'Bowlees.'

Page 81, note 1, for 'Henry VIII.' read 'Henry VII.'

Page 106 note 9. Add Brenan's *House of Percy*, vol. i. pp. 230—232.

Page 108, line 2, for 'seventh earl of Ogle' read 'seventh Lord Ogle.

Page 136, line 20, for 'Sir Robert Brandling who was knighted on the field at Musselburgh by the Duke of Somerset' read 'Sir Robert Brandling who as mayor of Newcastle was knighted in 1547 by the duke of Somerset on his return through Newcastle after the battle of Musselburgh.'

Page 157, line 21, for 'Elizabeth' read 'Eleanor.'

Page 159, line 11, for 'Richard' read 'Ralph.'

Page 172, line 5, for 'John Morrison' read 'James Morrison.'
