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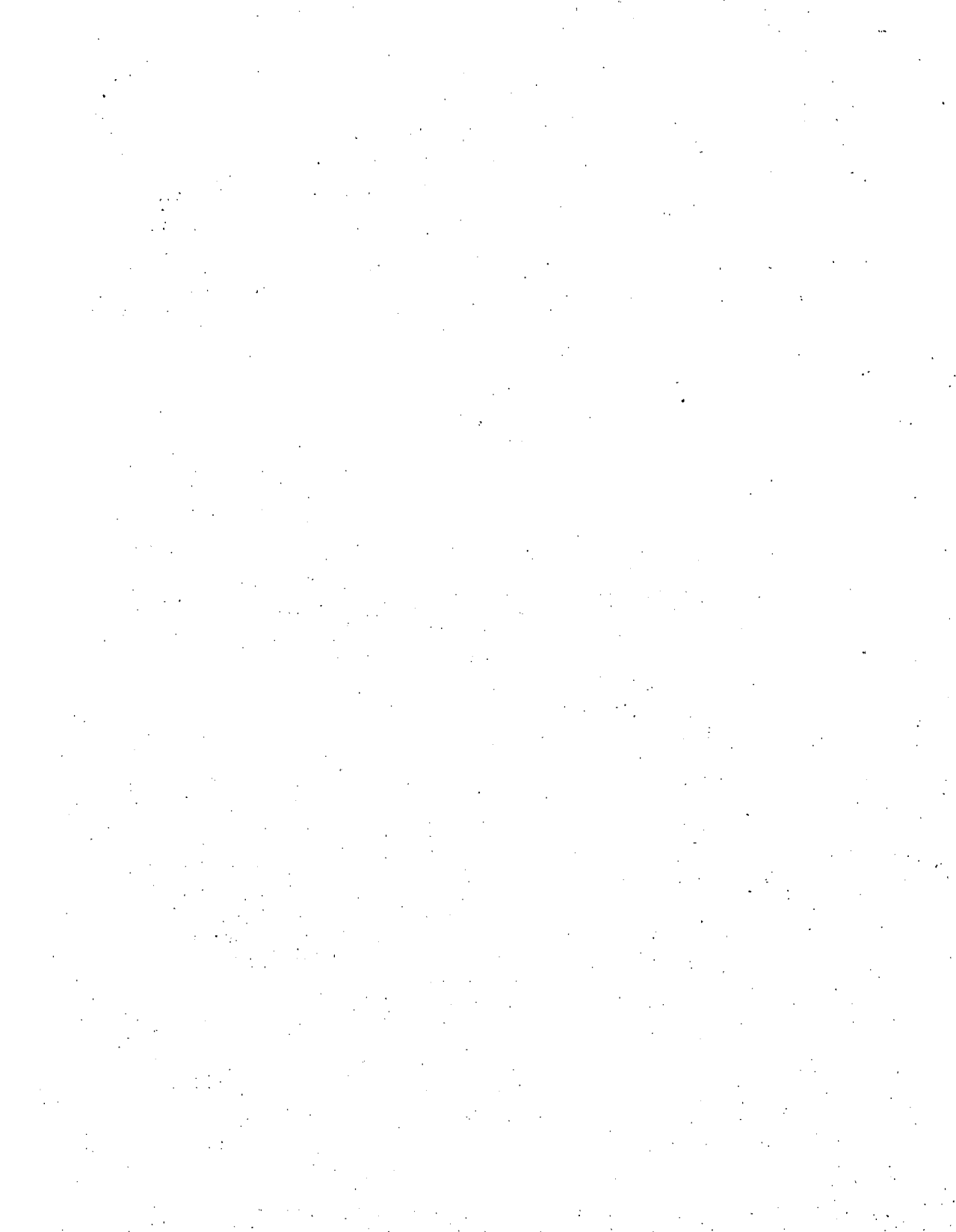

4175. Northumberland. Midds. 6 James I. Lease to Bevis Balmer of coal-mines, etc.
4215. Northumberland. Midds. 16 James I. Fee farm rent in arrear, payable by William Clopton and Christopher Banister for lands, etc., in Durham.

 temple dating from the 8th century B.C., has been unearthed at the shrine
 of Artemis Orthis. It is a primitive Doric sanctuary. It is interesting to
 note that amongst the great mass of votive offerings discovered is a
 'number of finely worked ivory lions devouring their prey.'—*The Anti-*
