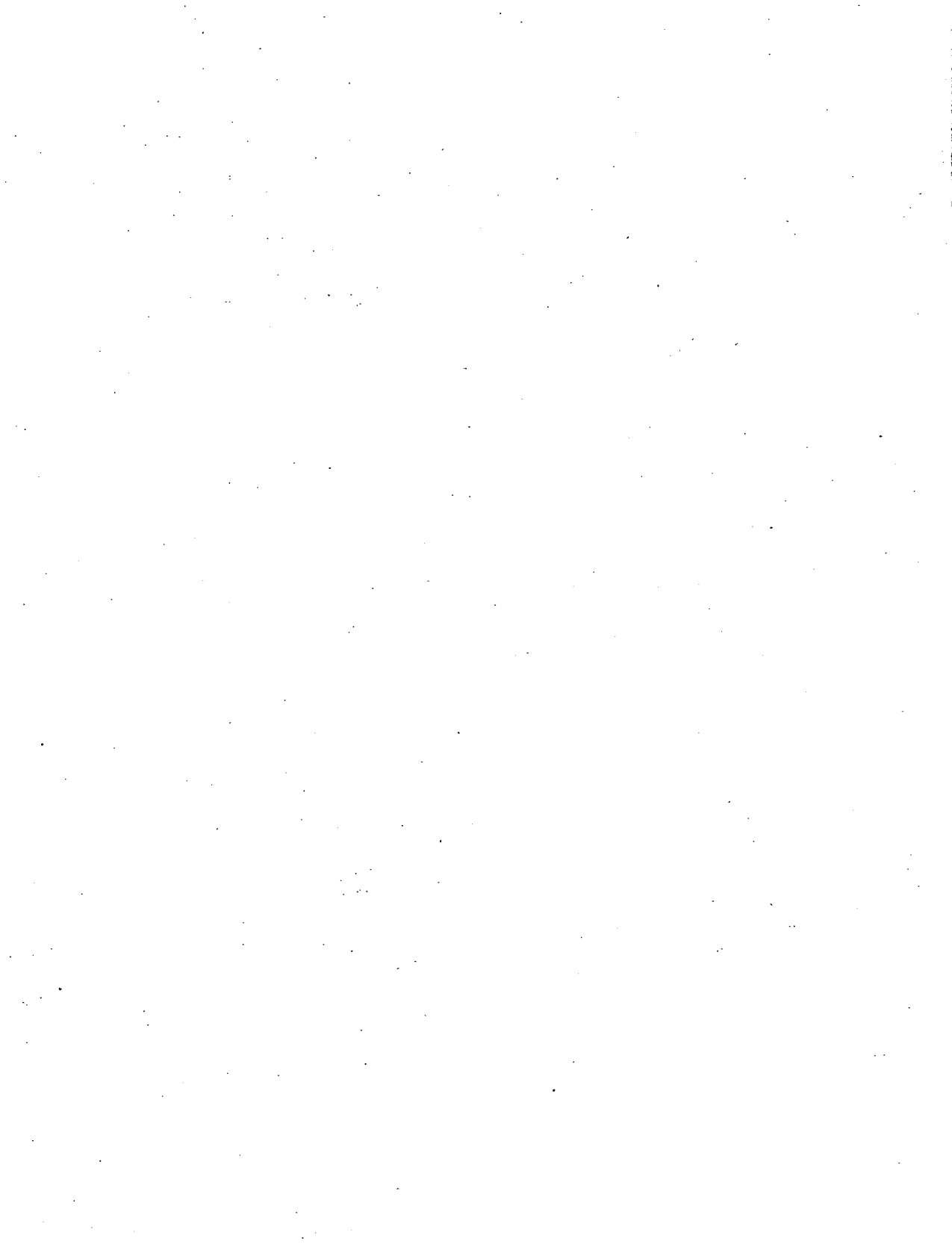

CORSTOPTUM: NOTE ON THE PHRASE 'DOMITIANIC-TRAJANIC POTTERY.'

By 'Domitianic-Trajanic' Samian, I mean pieces such as are shewn in the report for 1910, plates v and vi and fig. 42. Though this style of pottery is generally held to have gone out of use by the end of Trajan's reign (A.D. 117), it is not impossible that in some instances it may be found in Hadrianic deposits.—
