The Library is open to members every week day (except New Year's Day, Good Friday and Christmas Day) from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. from April 1st to September 30th, and from 10 a.m. 10 5 p.m. from October 1st to March 31st. It is also open every Wednesday until 9 p.m.

Each member is entitled to borrow from the Library such books as he may require, but so that there are not more than three volumes issued to him and unreturned at any one time.

No volume may be kept by a member for more than four weeks without the previous consent of the Council.

Members keeping books longer than the time allowed shall pay a fine of one shilling per week for each volume so kept.

All books must, for the purpose of examination, be returned to the Library on or before the Wednesday preceding the Annual Meeting, under a fine of two shillings and sixpence per volume, payable to the Society by the member in default. All books shall remain in the Library from the Wednesday preceding the Annual Meeting until after that Meeting.

Manuscripts and books of special value are not allowed to circulate without the previous permission of the Council, to obtain which, application should be made, in writing, to the Librarian.

A volume lost or injured must be replaced or restored or its value paid to the Society by the member so losing or damaging
