III.—THE WATCH AND CLOCK MAKERS OF NORTHUMBERLAND AND DURHAM OF THE SEVENTEENTH AND EIGHTEENTH CENTURIES RECORDED IN NEWSPAPERS, DIRECTORIES, ETC.

The following list of old northern watchmakers has been compiled mainly from the advertisement files of old newspapers and from local directories. There is still much to discover, particularly examples of early north country watches and watch-movements. This is, however, a field of research that is fast vanishing. The destruction of old watches all over England has been so comprehensive that it is hard to find examples of old watches made in the north. It has been thought that no watches were ever "made" in Northumberland or Durham; that watches were simply bought complete in London and Coventry, and their own names added to them by the persons who This, however, can hardly have sold them in the north. been the case. During the greater part of the eighteenth century the watch trade in England was a composite trade, in the hands of many specialists.1 Hardly any watchmaker in England (even the most famous) himself fabricated the standardized portions of his watch. The drudgeryof the work was left in the hands of specialists called "movement-makers" and others, who lived chiefly in London and Prescot (Lancashire). But the watchmaker was responsible for the "finishing" of the watch, that

is to say, for assembling the various parts, fitting them together, adjusting the springs, regulators, etc. That was the really essential part of watch-making, which decided whether a watch should be good or bad. In London even great makers employed outside "watch-finishers"; but in the country the watchmaker was perforce his own watch-finisher, and very often he had started business in London in that way.

In earlier days the watchmaker had to make almost every part of his watch himself; the earliest Newcastle watchmakers undoubtedly did so. The following is an example of a completely "home-made" watch:

Post Man, June 2, 1719.

"Lost, a gold striking watch made at Newcastle, on the outside case is engraved a Stag in a Gaze, upon a wreath."

It was probably the work of Thirkeld or Emmerson.

Robert Graham of Sunderland stated in 1754 that he "finished" new watches "from the beginning," and he charged two guineas more for these than for the watches of other makers which he sold in his shop. John Weatherston, who took over a watchmaker's business in Morpeth in 1778, had served as foreman to a famous Edinburgh maker. There is no doubt then that most northern watchmakers really "made" the watches that bear their names, in the sense that they fitted them together and finished them. After about 1725 that was all that the average "watchmaker" ever did.
