XIV.—BOOKBINDERS OF NORTHUMBERLAND AND DURHAM

Though a great deal of work has been done in the past on the printers and typography of the two northern counties, little or nothing has been written up to the present on the bookbinders of the area. Some Newcastle binders appear in Welford's well known Early Newcastle Typography, which was published in Archæologia Aeliana in 1907, but Welford was primarily concerned with printers, and bookbinders are mentioned only incidentally, some being recorded, as in other towns, also as printers and stationers. My own interest in local binders was aroused during an investigation of the signed bindings in the Library of King's College, Newcastle upon Tyne, and this, combined with a search of the relevant directories and correspondence with other investigators and collectors, has resulted in the preparation of the following list, which is offered as a first attempt to record the names and dates of the bookbinders of Northumberland, Durham and Berwick on Tweed to the end of the nineteenth century. I am particularly indebted to Mr. Charles Ramsden, who placed at my disposal, before the publication of his book on provincial binders, his slips recording those of the North East. My own approach was originally through the examples of the work of some of the binders in various collections, particularly in the Library of King's College.

The earliest binder so far recorded in this area is Hugh Hutchinson of Durham, who flourished towards the end of the seventeenth century and who died in 1695. Fortunately some of his bindings survive in the Libraries of Durham University and King's College. He rebound some of the books in the Kepier School Library at Houghton-le-Spring, as manuscript inscriptions in the books show. He used suede, or reversed calf, with a very simple form of decoration in blind consisting of corner ornaments only. Hutchinson is mentioned in the correspondence of Bishop Cosin, whose armorial stamp he applied to the Bishop's books. Jonathan Hutchinson, who may have been a brother or a son, predeceased Hugh on February 4th, 1690/1.

John Linn of Newcastle, who is listed by Welford as being at work in 1739, is well known to collectors of signed bindings because of his large ticket, which is illustrated as No. 6 in the Catalogue of the Schiff Collection. Mr. A. N. L. Munby, in his recent paper Collecting Signed Bindings, has suggested that the binder's ticket had its origin in the tradesman's card, of the eighteenth century, and Linn's, which measures approximately six inches by four, seems to bear this out. It records his address "At the sign of Locke's head upon the Middle of Tyne Bridge" and his many activities, which included the sale of bibles, novels, stationery, quills, Dr. Daffy's Elixir and Stoughton's Elixir. Many booksellers at that time dealt also in patent medicines.

The name of Michael Turnbull, "bookbinder in ye Low Bridge", occurs in a manuscript list of voters at an election in 1774 which is now in one of the volumes of the Robert White Collection in King's College. He appears in Welford's list as being a printer between 1755 and 1779, but in the list of voters referred to he voted as a Free Cordwainer. His occupation of bookbinder and therefore as a worker in leather would account for his enrolment as a cordwainer, but this illustrates the difficulty which I have encountered in searching for bookbinders among the printed lists of Newcastle freemen. If Turnbull was admitted as a cordwainer no doubt other binders were, and this would explain the absence of the trade of bookbinder as such.

By the end of the eighteenth century many binders were active in Newcastle, and they have been recorded by

Welford, some of them being also printers and booksellers, as for example Joseph Atkinson, Edward Humble, George Young, Stephen Wilkins, Joseph Whitfield and William Charnley, who was admitted to the Stationer's Company in 1749. Thomas Brown, who began work in the Groatmarket at this period (about 1778), later had two attractive tickets giving addresses in Nun's Gate and the Arcade. As his name appears in the Directories up to 1839 it is possible that the business was carried on in his name by a son or by another binder. Brown's tickets are oval, in a style which was favoured by other local binders, notably Handyside and the better known William Lubbock.

Gilbert Gray, who was engaged in the craft of bookbinding in Newcastle from 1778 until his death at the age of 85 in 1794, was a friend of Thomas Bewick, who declared that Gray was "perhaps the most invaluable acquaintance and friend I ever met with". Gray is stated to have been educated at the College of Aberdeen, and he is probably the Gilbert Gray who had been a pupil of Aberdeen Grammar School and who matriculated at Marischal College there in 1723, graduating M.A. in 1727. In 1723 Gray the bookbinder would be fourteen years old, a common age for entering a University at that time. An engraved portrait of Gray is on page 32 of Robinson's *Thomas Bewick*.

A Darlington binder, Bryant Holland, is known to me only through a brief mention in Longstaffe's *History of Darlington*, where it is recorded that he was sent to gaol for robbery. He is stated to have worked with Darnton, but I am not sure whether the latter was himself a binder.

As for the signed bindings by local craftsmen that have survived, little can be said. They are for the most part in half calf or half sheepskin, though a few in full leather are known to me. There are several good bindings by William Lubbock in various public and private collections. He used red morocco and had one or two distinctive tools. A typical example of his binding is shown in Plate XVIII. In the Library of King's College the Robert White copy of Wright's

History of Hexham, published in 1823 and bound, presumably in the same year or shortly afterwards, by Davison of Alnwick, is in full blue calf, with a simple frame of a fillet on the covers. The spine is decorated with a square floral tool in gold (Pl. XVIII, No. 2). In the same collection Maitland's Ancient Scottish Poems, edited by Pinkerton, London, 1786, is bound in a simple but attractive half russia binding by Barker of Hexham (Pl. XVIII, No. 8).

There appears to be no decoration that can be claimed as characteristic of Northumberland and Durham generally, but I have noticed that on bindings by several of the late eighteenth and early nineteenth century binders there are only three bands across the spine, no matter what height the book is, and the bands are wide. In Plate XVIII, Nos. 2, 4 and 8, which are by Davison of Alnwick, Clarke of Newcastle and Barker of Hexham respectively, show this, and No. 4 is eleven inches tall. Later in the nineteenth century many fine bindings appear to have been done by Waters of Newcastle, of which one example is No. 3-of Plate XVIII.

So far as entries in Directories are concerned, I have recorded all the names of persons who have described themselves as bookbinders, even though this is included in such descriptions as bookseller, printer, stationer, or any combination of all four. It may be that many of the men here recorded as booksellers and bookbinders did not actually bind books themselves but farmed out such work to men or firms who did. This was a common practice in the latter half of the nineteenth century.

Limitations of space have reduced the references at each entry to a minimum. They record the directories or other works in which entries relating to the binders are to be found between the years given, which denote the first and the last, or the only, appearance of the name in any directory; they do not imply that the name is found in every directory between the years mentioned. For the years between 1780 and 1840 I have given a reference to Ramsden's Bookbinders of the United Kingdom only.


