

EDITORIAL NOTE.

Council decided, at the beginning of 1957, to cease publishing *Proceedings*. The high cost of publication made this economy necessary. Council also decided to issue, in early March each year, a REPORT telling of the various activities of the Society during the preceding year, this to include:

1. Reports of the Council, of its committees and of the officers of the Society.
2. Short accounts of monthly and country meetings.
3. List of officers and committees for the current year.
4. List of members, with dates of their election, as at 31st January of each year.

Council also decided that shorter papers, such as were formerly published in *Proceedings*, should in future be printed in *Archæologia Aeliana* under the heading of NOTES. The addition of these will add to the cost of the yearly volume. Council has therefore made the following regulations in order to reduce this extra cost as far as possible.

1. All papers submitted for consideration must be clearly typed, double-spaced on quarto pages, with all references filled in ready for printing, subject only to correction of printer's errors.
2. These papers, if accepted, must be in the hands of the Editor by 1st January each year, otherwise they cannot be included in that year's volume.
3. If more papers are accepted than can be printed in any one year, the Editor will decide as to which should have priority.
4. Authors receive twelve free copies of their papers. More copies can be had at cost price if ordered at proof stage.
