1. All papers submitted for consideration must be clearly typed, double-spaced on quarto pages, with all references filled in ready for printing, subject only to correction of printer's errors.
2. These papers, if accepted, must be in the hands of the Editor by 1st March each year, otherwise they cannot be included in that year's volume.
3. If more papers are accepted than can be printed in any one year, the Editor will decide as to which should have priority.
4. Authors receive twelve free copies of their papers. More copies can be had at cost price if ordered at proof stage.
5. Line illustrations will normally be reproduced in the text as *figures*. Line drawings should be of such a proportion as will reduce to a finished size within the limits of  $6\frac{1}{2} \times 4$  inches.
