And 40s. from the forfeited issues of Nicholas de Graham in the Roll of forfeited issues before the same at pleas in the 26th. year. 863. And 65s. from the issues of the forfeited lands of William de Bedenhale in the Roll of estreats, fines and amercements and issues before W. de Bello Campo steward of the king's household for the 24th. and 25th. years. And in beams, iron, tin, brass, tallow, thread and hemp purchased for constructing one catapult in the king's castle of Newcastle upon Tyne for defence of the same against the Scots enemies of the king and rebels who hostilely invaded the kingdom in these parts and perpetrated divers enormities in the same in the 25th. year; payment of carpenters making cord with the aforesaid hemp; and in 102 bolt shafts made for the catapult, 40 irons, 40 feathers of iron for the same bolts, making one platform below the aforesaid catapult in the aforesaid year £4 2s. 4d. by the king's writ (For which catapult he should answer and he answers below (872)) And in 100 boards, 3,160 nails bought for making (80) shields to hang outside the walls of this castle at the embrasures between battlements for defence of the same; in the repair of one turret behind the large tower, payment to carpenters working on the same shields and turrets (SIC) and hanging the trunks around the castle walls for the defence of the same; and men cutting down withes in the wood of Chapwell for tying aforesaid trunks to the castle walls to form a breastwork beyond the chapel. Of

one engine made to wind up a screw crossbow and of one hand mill made within the castle for munition of the same 66s. 5¼d. by the same writ. (For which shields, engine for crossbows and mill he answers below (872)). And for a certain engineer staying in the aforesaid castle in the aforesaid munition for his wages from Monday the morrow of Michaelmas aforesaid year to saturday in All Souls the same year (30/9/1297-2/11/1297) for 34 days both days inclusive to wit 6d. each per day; and 2 carpenters making flooring and the aforesaid breastwork also the engine for winding up the aforesaid crossbow and repairing the hand mill aforesaid and other munitions within the aforesaid castle for 33 days; and 2 smiths working in the same castle for their wages for the same time to wit one of them at 4d. a day and the other at 3d; and one miller staying in the aforesaid castle for the munition aforesaid for wages for 6 days to wit at 2d. per day; And in payment for 2 men repairing 1000 old irons of the bolts and making shafts for 2095 bolts, and in making wooden steps beside the kitchen in the aforesaid castle and behind the hall in the same to ascend the walls of the castle. Repairing 2 posterns; and 5 quarters lime, 49 stone iron, 10 stone hemp, 17 foot crossbows, 10 baldrics, 2 horse hides for 105 slings with sticks, 1000 earthenware pots for casting lime, one stone for grinding and sharpening the iron armaments and one bucket for drawing water, bought for the munition aforesaid and delivered to Robert de Balliol sheriff. (Of which the same R. answers below) And in making 3 cords and one screw crossbow, 100 iron bolts for the same screw crossbow, 1315 bolts for the aforesaid foot crossbows and 100 shafts for the aforesaid screw crossbow, stitching the aforesaid slings and collecting stones for the same, aforesaid year £10 22½d. by the same writ. (For which crossbow he answers below). And 6 serjeants dwelling with barded horses in the aforesaid castle for the munition of the same, for their wages from tuesday after Michaelmas 25th. year of the reign of the same king to friday of All Saints the same year (1/10/1297-1/11/1297) for 32 days both days inclusive to

wit each of them at 8d. per day and 88 crossbowmen and 88 archers staying in the aforesaid castle for the aforesaid munition to wit 45 crossbowmen for their wages from tuesday after Michaelmas 25th. year to All Souls day in the same year (1/10/1297-2/11/1297) for 33 days both days inclusive, 20 crossbowmen from 8th. October aforesaid year to All Souls day aforesaid (8/10/1297-2/11/1297) for 26 days both days inclusive and 23 crossbowmen from 9th. October aforesaid year to the same All Souls day (9/10/1297-2/11/1297) for 34 days (sic) both days inclusive and 60 of the aforesaid crossbowmen from Sunday on the morrow of All Souls aforesaid year for the 3 days following and 46 bowmen from friday next after Michaelmas aforesaid year until All Souls day (4/10/1297-2/11/1297) for 25 days (sic) and 20 bowmen from 11th. October aforesaid years until All Souls day aforesaid (11/10/1297-2/11/1297) for 23 days both days inclusive to wit to each of the leaders of 20 crossbowmen 6d. per day and the other crossbowmen each 4d. per day and to each of the leaders of 20 bowmen aforesaid 4d. per day and the others each 2d. per day £73 13s. 6d. by the same writ. And in 34 quarters of wheat of the king's corn in the manor of Neweham carried thence by sea to the aforesaid castle for its munition, in carriage of the same wheat from the water to the aforesaid castle, and in 22 quarters wheat, 62 quarters rye, 7 quarters barley, 10 quarters ground wheat flour, 41½ quarters oats, 26 quarters mixed malt, 11½ quarters oat malt, 5 quarters milled malt, 28 quarters salt, 46 oxen, 35 bullocks, 24 stirks, 10 ox carcasses with entrails without hides, one carcase without entrails and hide, 168 doggedroves,⁸ 400 gallons of ale, 30 cart loads of turves and 6 chaldrons of coal and 20 quarters salt used to salt the aforesaid carcasses paid by the said Robert the sheriff towards the munition aforesaid (Of which munition the same R. sheriff answers below (872)) £50 10s. 7½d. by the same writ. And in expenses of Res and Canon Welsh prisoners held in the castle of Newcastle and

taken thence to London 25th. year of the king's reign and for the escort of the same and in expenses staying in London in the custody of the said sheriff and his men after they had been brought there for 5 weeks until the king released them £9 9s. 8d. by the same writ. And paid to Adam de Croke-dayk at Easter 25th. year for his expenses who was then assigned by the king to seize wool in co. Northumberland for the king's use and to make enquiries about the concealment of wool 20s. in the same year, by the same writ. And in munition of the aforesaid castle 24th. year of the king's reign on account of the Scots hostilely infiltrating those parts and perpetrating damage of all sorts therein £4 12s. 5d. by the same writ. Sum of the aforesaid allowances £156 16s. 10d. And he owes £109 9s. 9½d. And he answers in the Residuum (873).

871. William de Button in Cestreton owes £20 for a fine to have respite of knighthood which was required from him in Kent, and he answers in Kent in the other part of the Roll.

872. John de Kirkeby recently sheriff owes 1 catapult newly made as contained above. And 80 shields made for the walls of the castle to protect it, one engine for winding the screw crossbows and one hand mill as contained above (870). (Robert de Balliol sheriff owes) 17 foot crossbows, 10 baldrics, 105 slings with sticks, 1 bucket for drawing water received from John de Kirkeby recently sheriff as contained above (870). The same John de Kirkeby recently sheriff owes one screw crossbow as is contained there. The same Robert de Balliol owes 34 quarters wheat taken by the said John de Kirkeby in the manor of Neuham and 22 quarters wheat, 62 quarters rye, 7 quarters barley, 10 quarters wheat flour, 41½ quarters oats, 26 quarters mixed malt, 11½ quarters oat malt, 5 quarters of milled malt, 28 quarters salt, 46 oxen, 35 bullocks, 24 stirks, 10 ox carcasses with entrails without hides, 1 carcase without entrails and hide, 168 doggedroves, 400 gallons of ale, 30 cartloads of turves and 6 chaldrons of coal and 20 quarters salt used to salt the aforesaid carcasses.

873. John de Kirkeby recently sheriff of Northumberland renders account of £106 9s. 9½d. for several debts as contained in the principal Roll (870). In the treasury nothing. And in wages to 4 horsemen and 8 foot soldiers escorting Res ab Mailgon, Canan abmeredyk' and Maelgon abres Welshmen held in the castle of Bamburgh from that castle to Newcastle upon Tyne 24th. year and staying there 8s. by the king's writ. *And similarly by order of the king⁹* paid to the same welshmen and 2 grooms ministering to them for their wages from the morrow of Michaelmas in the aforesaid year up to the 6th. June in the 25th. year, both days inclusive, to wit for 250 days namely to each Welshman 3d. a day and their grooms 2d. per day £13 10s. 10d. by the same writ. *And similarly by order of the king⁹* paid to the aforesaid Welshmen and their grooms for their robes for the same year to wit to each Welshman 20s. and to each groom 6s. 8d. 73s. 4d. by the same writ. *And similarly by order of the king paid from 7th. June aforesaid year, on which day aforesaid Res ab Mailgon and Canan ab Mereduch were taken from the aforesaid castle of Newcastle to London.⁹* And the aforesaid Mailgon ab Res and his groom staying in the aforesaid castle for their wages from 7th. June aforesaid year to Michaelmas same year to wit for 111 days both days inclusive 47s. 11d. by the same writ. 874. And in 157½ sacks and 11 stone wool taken for the king's use in county Northumberland by Adam de Cokedayk at the close of Easter 25th. year of the king's reign, packed, prepared, weighed and carried from the aforesaid castle of Newcastle upon Tyne to ships coming to the port there (delivered to the keepers of the king's custom of wool there) and one sack and 13 stone of the aforesaid wool carried from the town of Wollore to the town of Newcastle and 602 ells canvas

And in 10 lasts 9 daces and 3 salted hides taken by the aforementioned Adam in this county at that time delivered to the same keepers trussed, sealed and carried from the aforesaid castle to the aforesaid ships 13s. 6d. by the same writ (Of which hides the same keepers answer below (882)). 875. And in 30 quarters wheat, 49 quarters 1 bushel oats taken for the king's use by the same sheriff 25th. year to sustain the king's faithful subjects staying in the parts of Gascony, carried from divers places beyond Coket in county Northumberland by land to Alnemuth, the wages of 2 men collecting the aforesaid corn, hire of one house at Alnemuth for depositing the corn there for 3 weeks, wages of one man staying there to watch over the receipt of the said corn, carriage of the same corn from the granary at Alnemuth to the ship, carriage of the same corn from Alnemuth to the town of Newcastle upon Tyne by water and the wages of two grooms staying in the ship as super (cargoes) of the aforesaid corn 65s. 1½d. by the same writ. And in 10 quarters wheat, 69 quarters 5½ bushels and 1 peck oats taken by the same sheriff within Coket in the aforesaid county the same year, carrying by land from divers places in this county to the town of Newcastle 28s. 3¼d. by the same writ. And for 100 ells coarse canvas bought for making 25 sacks for putting the aforesaid corn in, and thread for making and stitching the same sacks, and carrying 10 quarters of the aforesaid wheat to the mill and in milling there and thence carrying back, and 2 empty casks wherein to put the meal thence coming; buying, cleaning, coopering the same casks with the meal put in them and carrying the same from the castle of Newcastle to the port there and hire of one house in the town of Newcastle for storing the aforesaid 69 quarters oats for 4 weeks before they were put in the ship 22s. 7d. by the same writ. And in freightage of one ship called La Hynde of Gippeswyk of 200 casks and all the corn

aforesaid taken from Newcastle to the port of Herewyz, dunnage of the same ship, construction of a granary made in the same ship for the aforesaid corn, pay of one pilot sailing this ship out of the port of Newcastle to sea, pay of one clerk remaining in the same ship on the sheriff's behalf from the same port to the port of Herewycy 25th. year. And to discharging this ship of the casks and corn aforesaid at Herewyz 114s. 9d. by the same writ. And Galfro Blusse master of the ship called "Leon de Estland" for freightage of the same ship receiving the casks and corn aforesaid in the same port of Herewyz transporting them to the dam in La Swyne in Flanders delivered there 66s. 8d. by the same writ. 876. And Luke de Tailleboys and Adam de Benton assigned in the Northriding of county York to collect the eighth and fifteenth granted to the king in the 25th. year for their expenses in assessing and collecting, which eighth and fifteenth, was afterwards revoked by the king for certain reasons, 100s. by the same writ (of which they answer below (883)). 877. And Res ab Maygon and Canon ab Mereduk Welshmen staying in the king's castle of Bamburgh for their wages from 7th. October 23-24th. year to 10th. September the same year beginning to wit for 348 days both inclusive at 3d. each per day £8 9s. 6d. by the king's writ. And a certain groom of the same for his wages for the same time to wit 2d. per day 56s. 6d. by the same writ. 878. And 11 Welsh hostages of the king from Northwales staying in the king's castle of Newcastle upon Tyne and 10 welsh hostages of the king from the same parts staying in the king's castle of Bampurgh (sic) for their wages from 2nd. March 24th. year to 14th. August the same year, on which day the king released the aforesaid welshmen, for 166 days both days inclusive at 4d. each £58 2s. by the same writ. 879. And 6 crossbowmen staying in the munition of Newcastle upon Tyne from 22nd. April 24th. year to the 6th. May same year to wit for 15 days at 3d. each per day 22s. 6d. by the same writ. And 10 archers staying in the said munition there for the same time at 2d. each per day 25s. by the same writ. And 6

crossbowmen staying in the munition of the castle of Midford for the same time at 3d. each per day 22s. 6d. by the same writ. And 36 archers staying in the said munition for the same time at 2d. each per day £4 10s. by the same writ. And he has a surplus of £21 10s. 5 $\frac{3}{4}$ d. which is allowed to the same John de Kirkeby in the principal Roll in a certain sum of £25 (863). And he is quit.

880. William son of Ralph owes 100s. for a fine for leave to agree with John son of William de Creystok in the Roll of fines and issues of the Bench 25th. and 26th. years in Yorkshire.

881. Andrew de Smetheton who married Margery sister and heir of Robert de la Val for his relief for all the lands and tenements which the same Robert brother of Margery held from the king in chief on the day he died, in the originalia 26th. year.

882. The keepers of the new custom of the king's wool at Newcastle 157 $\frac{1}{2}$ sacks 11 stone wool taken in county Northumberland by Adam de Crokedeyk and received by John de Kirkeby as contained above (874). And 10 lasts, 9 daces, 3 salted hides taken in the same county by the same Adam and received by the aforesaid John as contained above (874). But they answer in Roll 28 after the Nova (Oblata) at the end.

883. Luke de Taylboys and Adam de Benton 100s. for collecting the eighth and fifteenth granted to the king in county York as contained above (876), but they answer in Roll 28 after the Nova (Oblata) at the end.
