A SHORT-TITLE CATALOGUE OF THE EARLY PRINTED BOOKS IN THE LIBRARY OF THE SOCIETY OF ANTIQUARIES OF NEWCASTLE UPON TYNE

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Introduction

The formation of a library was one of the primary aims of the Society's founders in 1813. John Bell, jnr. in his circular letter dated 24th November 1812 stated that "a Library be formed, to consist of Books on Antiquities and coins which are not to be found in the public libraries in the neighbourhood".¹

The collection of books was begun immediately the Society came into being although the early collection appears to have led a rather peripatetic existence. From 1813 to 1819 the Library was housed in the Keep, from late 1819 until 1824 in rooms leased at Messrs. Farrington's Yard in the Bigg Market, and then, until 1848, was housed in the Literary and Philosophical Society premises on Westgate Road. The books were returned to the Keep in 1848 and moved to their present home, in the Black Gate, between 1909 and 1911—after twelve families had been removed and rehoused!

The Library grew erratically. While purchases were made—the first being a copy of Pinkerton's Essay on medals, in May 1813—the bulk of the material was acquired by donations and exchanges with other similar societies. In 1816 the Library contained about 140 volumes. This had increased to 1,500 by 1839, and today is in excess of 20,000 volumes. Together with the books, the Society also received many non-book items, which included drawings, archives and a wide range of artefacts. The earliest listings of the Library holdings appeared in 1816,² although the first separately published catalogue was not issued until 1839.³ In turn this was updated and replaced by a new catalogue in 1863,⁴ with the most detailed compilation appearing in the last of the published catalogues in 1896.⁵ The archives and printed maps were covered by these catalogues but have since been more fully described by Hugh Taylor in his hand-list entitled *General collection of MSS, maps and plans in the Black Gate Library, Newcastle upon Tyne*, 1960. He also referred to most of the standard histories relating to Northumberland, and the genealogical sources in the Society's Library in his bibliography *Northumberland history*, 1963.

As the 1896 Catalogue was compiled thirty years before Pollard and Redgrave's *Short-title catalogue* (STC)⁶ and the much later guide by Wing⁷ to early printed English works it now seems relevant to revise the Society's old catalogue entries for the pre-1700 period in the light of these more recent publications, particularly as both STC and Wing are themselves in the process of being revised and updated.

A thorough check of the Black Gate Library between 1976 and 1980 revealed that the Society possesses over 200 works printed before 1700. These may be divided into 20 STC items (pre 1640); 170 Wing items (1641–1700) and 15 works printed on the Continent before 1700. Most of the volumes were acquired by donation in the earlier years of the Society's formation. Notable benefactors include John Bell, jnr., John Hodgson and Emerson Charnley. All were founder members of the Society, with Hodgson contributing over 30 seventeenth-century tracts (volume Gy 122). A substantial donation of 14 further tracts (Gi 20) was presented by D. Dippie Dixon in 1904, and in 1941 Miss Peters gave the Society a fine collection of almanacs for the year 1677 (Gh 13) as well as two other early printed works.

The STC items represent early monographs on antiquarian topics, sermons by local clergymen and a copy of Camden's *Britannia*, 1637. The greatest interest for local historians however lies with the fine collection of Civil War and Restoration tracts. They not only include printing by Newcastle's first printer, Robert Barker (1639), but also examples from his more prolific successor Stephen Bulkley who was operating in both Newcastle and "Gateside" between 1646 and 1662. To Bulkley's credit must go the first history of Newcastle, Grey's *Chorographia*, 1649.* The Society possess not only a copy of this work but also six of the known twenty-nine titles issued by Bulkley during his stay here.

The Society's tracts complement a similar collection held by Newcastle City Libraries.⁸ Between them, the two collections provide a unique typographical history of seventeenth-century printing on Tyneside.

Arrangement of entries in the short-title catalogue.

This present catalogue is in two parts:

1. works printed in the United Kingdom pre-1700
2. works printed on the Continent pre-1700.

In both sections the items are arranged alphabetically by author. In addition in Part 1 each work is prefixed by the standard running number used in Pollard and Redgrave's *Short-title catalogue* e.g. 9335: 25223 or Wing's *Short-title catalogue* e.g. A3760: G828.

Any entry number prefixed with a. or b. has not been identified in either catalogue, and should therefore appear in their respective sequences after or before the stated number.

Each entry in both sections of the Society list also gives the Black Gate class number (or shelf number) e.g. Gg 27; and tracts contained within volumes are identified more precisely by Roman numerals following the class number e.g. Gg 20 ii.

Cap. signifies without a title page: * less than 8 leaves.

Unfortunately some books listed in the earlier Society published catalogues could not be located. Below is a list of those works which now appear to be missing.

* The Society's copy bears the imprint "London, printed by J.B. 1649". It is generally accepted that the text was printed by Bulkley in Newcastle, and that some copies for the London market have had the imprint details changed. At least twelve printers/booksellers with the initials J.B. are known to have been working in London in 1649.
