Editorial Note

For the guidance of authors the following regulations have been made:

1. All papers submitted for consideration must be clearly typed, double-spaced on quarto (or A4) pages, with all references filled in ready for printing, subject only to correction of printer's errors.
2. These papers should be sent to the Editor at Hernspeth House, Harbottle, Morpeth NE65 7DQ to be in his hands by the second Tuesday in January each year, otherwise they cannot be considered for inclusion in the volume for that year. Facilities may be arranged for the reception at an address in Newcastle of bulky drawings unsuitable for posting.
3. If more papers are accepted than can be printed in any one year, the Editor will decide as to which shall have priority.
4. Authors of articles receive twenty-five free copies of their papers. More copies can be had at cost price if ordered at proof stage.
5. Line illustrations will normally be reproduced in the text as *figures*. Line drawings should be no larger than 85×60 cm and preferably of such a proportion as will reduce to a finished size within the limits of 150×185 mm.
6. Owing to the process now adopted for printing *A.A.*, the lines of illustrations should be drawn firmly and stipples should be relatively coarse.
7. Authors are reminded that alterations at proof stage are prohibitively expensive, so the text as submitted should be final.
8. For guidance in presentation authors are referred to the *MHRA Style Book* which may be obtained from W. S. Maney & Son Ltd., Hudson Road, Leeds LS9 7DL.
