 THE AIR TERRACE SITE COMPRISES THE LAND FROM BRACK RHYDING IN THE WEST TO BUCK LANE AS ITS EASTERN BOUNDARY. THE NORTHERN BOUNDARY IS THE STAFFORD TO ST. LEY MAIN ROAD. THE SOUTHERN BOUNDARY IS THE RIVER AIR.
 OVER PRACTICALLY THE WHOLE OF THIS AREA WHICH HAS BEEN UNDER PLOUGH FINE IMPLEMENTS OF MESOLITHIC TO BRONZE AGE TYPE HAVE BEEN PICKED UP. IN THE FOLLOWING NUMBERED INDEX (M) MARKED THIS WAY IMPLIES MICROLITHIC OR MICROLITHIC TYPE OF IMPLEMENT.
