

HARTSHILL - Kilns 14 & 14A

Preference	KILN 14 (the bigger kiln)
H61 (14) 1	Does not exist of itself = H61 14A 1 and H61 14/14A 1.
3 H61 (14) 2	Top 4" of kiln-filling. Soil.
2 H61 (14) 3	Filling of kiln in front half, where floor broken away; amongst the soft red clay which had been part of the kiln and pottery floor.
1 H61 (14) 4	Underneath floor.
H61 (14A) 7 belongs to this kiln.	
H61 (14A) 8 belongs to this kiln.	

KILN 14A Principally the small Kiln but layer 7 belongs to the larger kiln 14; layer 8 probably belongs to Kiln 14.

10	H61 (14A) 1	Topsoil = H61 14A/14 1 etc. The 1 means (H61 14/14A 1 = H61 14 1) topsoil.
8	H61 (14A) 2	Above the floor of the kiln.
7	H61 (14A) 3	In the holes between the kiln-bars.
9	H61 (14A) 4	The top of the stokehole - 4"-5"only. Some pottery from this layer was labelled 14/14A. There is really no distinction; it almost certainly mean that the latter was from the middle area of the stokehole, where you could not tell whether it belonged to kiln 14 or kiln 14A. They should be put together.
3	H61 (14A) 5	Stokehole filling, beneath 4.
3	H61 (14A) 6	Bottom of stokehole filling, beneath 5. No difference in the filling from 5. Layers 5 & 6 belong to that part of the ?joint stokehole which was adjacent to tiny kiln 14A.
	*H61 (14A) 7 (KILN 14)	Stokehole filling where sealed with red clay fallen from kiln 14 and therefore closely associated with Kiln 14. Appears to be similar to layer 6.
	*H61 (14A) 8 (Kiln 14)	Other side of stokehole - probably Kiln 14 but beyond the collapse of red clay.
	H61 (14A) 9	Top of flue area of kiln 14A, filled with brown earth.
	H61 (14A) 10	Black ash in flue of kiln 14A, beneath 9.
6	H61 (14A) 11	In black ash under the floor of the pottery chamber of kiln 14A; possibly in the flue.

2 H61 (14A) 12

In construction of the flue of Kiln 14A -
although the flue did not survive the clay at
the back of it did.

1 H61 (14A) 13

In construction of upper floor of kiln 14A.

5 H61 (14A) 14

Underneath floor of kiln 14A, in brown earth.
