You have made a valuable contribution to the local history of Sheffield and I should like to add my appreciation of the care, patience, and thoroughness with which you have made your investigation.

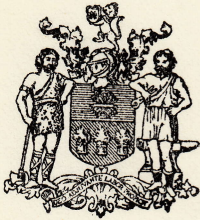
I am suggesting steps to make the work better known and hope to get in touch with you later on this subject.
