

Dear Mr. C. P. P. ^{requested} today I have sent the following as requested:-

Iron Key.
2 Small Knife Blades.
1 Large " "
Paper of 16 Pins
2 Large Hat Buttons
1 Small round Bean shaped Button.

} From the Co-op collection.

I suggest the latter may be ⁽¹⁾ the head of a single pin or ⁽²⁾ head of a double pin -  the latter an ornament for the hair. There is a trace of gilt? or see what may be down from each hole. metal and the back ⁽¹⁾ one of the attachment holes and I think I grooves for the pin - if double - to lie in, running. The front appears to be of non-ferrous iron. Modern or not, I cannot say.

It would be a very congenial task to describe the knives as you suggest if you will let me have them back when convenient to you.

If the iron ^{articles} were dipped in paraffin, then either brushed over with vaseline, or wax candle melted on them and the superfluous was wiped off whilst hot, it would prevent further disintegration.

It is a pleasure - so don't hesitate to give me other matters to deal with when I can be of use.
