Dear Armstrong,

I return your relies after a longer and more exhaustive examination thereof.

- The 6 pins are nearly pure gold, i.e. either 18 or 1. 22 carat (a most interesting discovery).
- The two Bronze buttons appear to be as specified. 2.
- Button marked A is of Copper (see underside).
- These three buttons I have examined more Silver ? exhaustively. The smallest contains silver i.e. partly silver, possibly 50%. Unfortunately in taking the test it has come apart, a small section having flown away which I failed to recover.
 - 2. The middle sized one contains silver of a poorer quality than previous one - possibly only 25%.
 - 3. The largest one probably of same material as the smallest, with about 50% of pure silver.

You see we do not know definitely the whole period covered in construction of these buttons, and at various dates the mixers of metals differentiated their ingredients. Als for the silver ones, so long as they were of a whiteish hue they were

Here we have many different metals, gold. silver, copper and bronze, but certainly no plating of any I wonder how you managed to acquire the very description. tiny and interesting gold pins?
