### DEANERY OF HOLT.

There is nothing very noteworthy in the Church Plate of this Deanery; but the Communion Cup at Hunworth with the London date letter for 1567 is interesting. My tour of the Deanery was made in May, 1919, and April, 1920, and I renew my thanks to all those who so kindly placed their Plate at my disposal.

#### 1. BACONSTHORPE, ST. MARY THE VIRGIN.

*Communion Cup* (10½ oz.) on baluster stem. Height, 7⅝ ins. Diameter, 3⅜ ins. Engraved, Baconsthorpe, 1768, Marks: leopard's head crowned, lion passant, date letter m, 1767 (London). Maker's mark D H, David Hennell.

*Paten* (8 oz.). Diameter, 7 ins. Engraved, Baconsthorpe, 1768. Marks: leopard's head crowned, lion passant, date letter m, 1767 (London). Maker's mark, E C, probably Edward Capper.

*Flagon*, domed, with thumb piece (23 oz. 5 dwts.). Height,  $8\frac{1}{8}$  ins. Diameter,  $3\frac{1}{4}$  ins. Diameter of foot, 5 ins. Marks: leopard's head crowned, lion passant, date letter s of 1773 (London). Maker's mark, I D, John Darwell. Arms of Elizabeth Barton engraved over Baconsthorpe. The gift of Mrs. Elizabeth Barton, 1774.

*Paten* on foot. Diameter,  $6\frac{3}{4}$  ins. Engraved, Baconsthorpe, 1914. The gift of M. W. and E. King in memory of their mother. Marks: leopard's head, date letter B, 1877 (London), lion passant, queen's head. Maker's mark, T P.

*Apostle Spoon*. Engraved, "The gift of E. Milnes Walker in memory of mother, Feb. 22nd, 1914." Sheffield date letter 1906.

*Baptismal Shell*. Engraved, "In memory of John Anthony Partridge, M.A., Rector of Baconsthorpe, 29th February, 1861—C.A.H." Marks: leopard's head, date letter S, 1893 (London), lion passant, queen's head. Maker's mark, T<sup>B</sup><sub>W</sub>

Silver and glass cruet.

The Rectory here was destroyed by fire in 1692 and again in 1754.

## 2. BALE, ALL SAINTS.

*Communion Cup*. Height,  $5\frac{3}{16}$  ins. Diameter,  $3\frac{11}{16}$  ins. Marks: Norwich Castle over lion, date letter C, 1567. Maker's mark, a maidenhead, three assay marks. Engraved in band in capitals, FOR THE TOVN OF BALE 1568 † Parcel-gilt.

*Paten* on foot. Height, 2 ins. Diameter,  $5\frac{1}{4}$  ins. Engraved underneath, BALE 1718. Marks: Britannia, lion's head erased, date letter B, 1717 (London). Maker's mark unreadable. Lion's head erased on foot.

*Salver*, plated. Diameter,  $8\frac{1}{2}$  ins. Engraved I H S, with a cross over the H.

*Flagon*, pewter, with domed lid and thumb piece. Height, 9 ins. Diameter,  $3\frac{5}{8}$  ins.

3. BODHAM, ALL SAINTS.

*Communion Cup* on baluster stem. Height,  $7\frac{5}{8}$  ins. Diameter,  $3\frac{3}{8}$  ins. Diameter of foot,  $3\frac{1}{2}$  ins. Engraved, Bodham, 1778. Marks: leopard's head crowned, lion passant, date letter b, 1777 (London). Maker's mark, R (?).

*Flagon*, domed, with thumb piece. Height, 8 ins. Diameter,  $3\frac{3}{8}$  ins. Coat of arms. Engraved under arms, Bodham, and round foot, The gift of Mrs. Mary Ann Stuart, 1774. Marks: leopard's head crowned, lion passant, date letter t, 1774 (London). Maker's mark, I D, John Darwall.

*Paten*. Diameter, 7 ins. Bodham, 1778. Marks obliterated.

4. BRININGHAM, ST. MAURICE.

*Communion Cup* on hexagonal base. Height,  $8\frac{1}{8}$  ins. Diameter,  $4\frac{1}{8}$  ins. Marks: leopard's head, date letter n, 1848 (London), lion passant, queen's head. Maker's mark, J J K, J. J. Keith. Engraved

in locum veteris  
et iam usu detriti Calicis  
D D Shovell Brereton A.M.  
A S 1849.

*Paten*. Diameter,  $6\frac{3}{4}$  ins. Same marks, and same lettering, except that the third line reads "et iam usu detritæ patinæ."

*Alms Dish*, pewter. Diameter,  $7\frac{7}{8}$  ins. James Dixon and Sons.

A secular 8-in. plate.

## 5. BRINTON, ST. ANDREW.

*Communion Cup.* Height,  $5\frac{5}{8}$  ins. Diameter,  $3\frac{1}{2}$  ins. Marks: Norwich Castle over lion, date letter C, 1567. Maker's mark, a maidenhead. Engraved within a plain  $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. band with hatched edges, FOR the TOVNE of BRYNTON.

*Paten*, saucer shaped, with  $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. flange. Diameter,  $4\frac{1}{2}$  ins. Same marks.

*Cup*, plated, with knop in middle. Height, 7 ins. Diameter,  $3\frac{3}{8}$  ins. In memory of E. H. and T. H.

*Flagon*, plated, with cross at top. Height, 10 ins. Diameter, 2 ins.

*Alms Dish*, pewter. Diameter,  $8\frac{1}{4}$  ins. Marks: London, rose sprig and four others.

*Paten* on foot, plated. Height, 3 ins. Diameter,  $6\frac{3}{4}$  ins. I H S engraved in centre. Engraved under, The gift of the Rev. Augustus Dashwood, Rector of Brinton, 1855.

## 6. BRISTON, ALL SAINTS.

*Communion Cup.* Height,  $6\frac{1}{4}$  ins. Diameter, 4 ins. Marks: Norwich Castle over lion, date letter C, 1567. Maker's mark, sun in splendour, two assay marks. On the foot, two assay marks and the three other marks. In a  $\frac{5}{8}$ -in. plain band, hatched outside, in capitals, + THE TOWNE OF BURSTON 1568.

*Paten* on foot; top of foot gone. The above three Norwich marks.

*Paten* on three feet. Diameter,  $7\frac{7}{8}$  ins. Engraved, Briston Communion Plate, 1820. Marks: leopard's head crowned, lion passant; date letter looks like the i of 1784 (London). Maker's mark,  $\begin{matrix} D S \\ R S \end{matrix}$

*Alms Bason.* Diameter,  $6\frac{1}{2}$  ins.

*Communion Cup*, electro-plate. Height, 7 ins.  
Diameter,  $3\frac{3}{8}$  ins. No maker's name.

*Paten*, electro-plate. Diameter,  $5\frac{1}{2}$  ins. No maker's name. † engraved on border.

8. CLEY, ST. MARGARET.

*Communion Cup* on baluster stem. Height,  $6\frac{7}{8}$  ins.  
Diameter,  $3\frac{1}{8}$  ins. Marks: leopard's head, lion passant,  
date letter d, 1859 (London). Maker's mark,  $\begin{matrix} H & E \\ W \end{matrix}$  in  
indented shield, H. E. Willis.

*Cup*, with cover and acorn finial, plated. Height,  
 $14\frac{1}{8}$  ins. Diameter,  $4\frac{5}{8}$  ins.

*Large Paten* on foot, plated. Diameter,  $9\frac{1}{8}$  ins.

*Small Paten* on foot, plated. Diameter,  $5\frac{1}{4}$  ins.

*Alms Dish*, brass. Diameter, 12 ins.

9. EDGEFIELD, SS. PETER AND PAUL.

Marks: Norwich Castle over lion. Maker's mark,  
maidenhead. Assay mark twice on lip. In a plain

## 10. FIELD DALLING, ST. ANDREW.

*Communion Cup.* Height,  $5\frac{3}{4}$  ins. Diameter,  $3\frac{7}{8}$  ins. Engraved in double band in capitals, FOR \* THE \* TOVNE \* OF FYLDE DALLYNG. Marks: Norwich Castle over lion, maidenhead, date letter C, 1567. Assay marks on cup and foot.

*Paten*, quite plain, with  $\frac{1}{4}$ -in. rim, apparently re-cast from an older one. Four marks, all undecipherable except the date letter O, 1591 (London).

*Flagon*, pewter, very heavy. Height,  $13\frac{1}{8}$  ins. Diameter,  $4\frac{1}{8}$  ins. Plain with small thumb piece.

*Alms Dish*, brass. Diameter, 15 ins. Engraved, underneath, To the Glory of God and in loving memory of R. T. R. Horley.

## 11. GLANDFORD, ST. MARTIN.

*Communion Cup.* Height,  $6\frac{1}{4}$  ins. Diameter, 4 ins. A  $\frac{5}{8}$ -in. band, with leaf decoration, runs round the cup, which also has the coat of arms of Bowyer Smyth. The maker's mark is unreadable.

*Paten Top* on foot. Diameter,  $4\frac{3}{8}$  ins. Engraved with a cross, 1568, and the same coat of arms.

*Small Salver*, 6-in. secular, on three feet. Engraved with a bird, grapes and foliage. Marks: lion passant, date letter B, 1774, anchor (Birmingham).

*Wafer Box*, plain, 1913. Maker's, S. G. & W.

*Alms Dish*, shell pattern. "Mimmie," 1st Oct., 1893. Diameter,  $9\frac{5}{8}$  ins. Marks: leopard's head, lion passant, date letter K, 1885 (London), queen's head. Maker's mark, J H.

## 12. GUNTHORPE, ST. MARY.

*Communion Cup.* Height,  $5\frac{5}{16}$  ins. Diameter,  $3\frac{7}{8}$  ins. Marks: Norwich Castle over lion, date letter C, 1567.

Maker's mark, flat fish in oval. Two assay marks. Between  $\frac{1}{8}$ -in. band, leaf ornaments.

*Paten Cover* on foot. Height,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ins. Diameter, 4 ins. Same marks as above and three assay marks.

*Flagon*, domed, with small thumb piece. Height,  $10\frac{1}{2}$  ins. Diameter,  $3\frac{3}{4}$  ins. Marks: Britannia, lion's head erased, date letter o, 1709 (London). Maker's mark, BA, Richard Bayley. Engraved with arms of Houghton above inscription, The gift of Will<sup>m</sup> Houghton to ye Parish Church of Gunthorp in ye County of Norfolk 1709.

In the lid of the flagon all the marks are repeated except the makers.

*Salver*, plated. Diameter,  $9\frac{1}{2}$  ins.

### 13. HEMPSTEAD, ALL SAINTS.

*Communion Cup*. Height,  $5\frac{3}{8}$  ins. Diameter,  $3\frac{5}{8}$  ins. Marks: Norwich Castle over lion, date letter C, 1567. Maker's mark, flat fish in oval. Assay mark. Plain band with hatched edges.  $\frac{5}{8}$  in. wide, containing + FOR THE TOVN OF HEMSTED 1566. Two assay marks on foot.

*Communion Cup*. Height,  $7\frac{1}{2}$  ins. Diameter,  $3\frac{5}{8}$  ins. Electro-plated by Gainsford.

*Salver* on three feet, electro-plated.

*Flagon* to match.

*Bason*, pewter. Diameter,  $6\frac{5}{8}$  ins. Marks: London over seeded rose crowned.

### 14. HOLT, ST. ANDREW.

This church was practically destroyed by fire in 1708.

*Communion Cup*. Height,  $9\frac{1}{4}$  ins. Diameter,  $4\frac{3}{8}$  ins. Marks: leopard's head crowned, lion passant, date letter G, 1722 (London). Maker's mark, T. F., Thomas Farrer.

Engraved underneath, The gift of Henry Briggs, M.A., Rector of Holt to the said Parish. Arms of Briggs on the cup.

*Flagon*, domed, with thumb piece. Height, 12 ins. Diameter,  $3\frac{5}{8}$  ins. Marks: leopard's head crowned, lion passant, date letter I, 1724 (London). Maker's mark, S. W. with a mitre and cross over it. Engraved with the Royal Arms and Honi Soit Qui Mal y Pense, and lower down, The gift of his R.H. George P. of W. to the Parish Church of Holt Norff.

*Paten* or salver on foot. Height,  $2\frac{3}{4}$  ins. Diameter,  $9\frac{3}{4}$  ins. Engraved with I H S in centre, and underneath, "Of thine own have we given thee,"

H. S. MDCCCXLVIII.

"For the Lord's Table Holt Church Norfolk this Paten contributed by the Rector and CLVIII Communicants."

Marks: leopard's head, date letter n, 1848 (London), lion passant, head of Queen Victoria. Maker's mark, C T F  
G F Chas. T. Fox and George Fox.

*Alms Dish* with Townshend arms. Diameter,  $9\frac{1}{4}$  ins. Marks: Britannia, lion's head erased, date letter B, 1717 (London). Maker's mark not distinguishable.

A new rim,  $\frac{7}{8}$  in. in width, was added in 1848 by C. T. and G. Fox. Inscribed underneath, The gift of C. L<sup>d</sup> T. to the Parish Church of Holt Norff.

A similar *Alms Dish*, with probably the Walpole arms. Diameter,  $9\frac{3}{8}$  ins. Marks same as on flagon. Inscribed round the centre, underneath, The gift of the R<sup>t</sup> Hon. R<sup>d</sup> W. to the Parish Church of Holt Norff.

*Cup*. Height, 9 ins. Diameter,  $4\frac{1}{4}$  ins. Marks: leopard's head, lion passant, date letter B, 1837 (London), king's head (William IV). Maker's mark,  $\begin{matrix} E & E \\ J & B \\ W & W \end{matrix}$

Wm. Barnard. Engraved under the arms of Parry, The Gift of W. H. Parry, B.D. June 1837. For the service of the Table of Our Lord in the Parish Church of Holt in Norfolk.

Marks: leopard's head crowned, lion passant, date letter K, 1567 (London). Maker's mark (?) a grasshopper.

*Paten*, saucer shaped. Diameter,  $3\frac{3}{4}$  ins.;  $\frac{1}{4}$ -in. flange. Marks: Norwich Castle over lion, date letter C, 1567. Maker's mark, sun in splendour. Assay mark.

## 16. KELLING, ST. MARY.

*Communion Cup*, quite plain, on splayed foot. Height, 6 ins. Diameter,  $4\frac{1}{2}$  ins. Diameter of foot,  $4\frac{1}{8}$  ins. Marks: lion passant, two date letters O and P, 1671 and 1672 (London). Maker's mark, D I. Engraved, The Towne of Kellinge 1673, in a band with hatched edges and leaf decorations.

*Paten Cover* on foot. Diameter,  $5\frac{7}{8}$  ins. Same marks as on cup. Engraved with a rose with five petals and two leaves.

## 17. LANGHAM, ST. ANDREW.

*Communion Cup*. Height,  $6\frac{1}{2}$  ins. Diameter,  $3\frac{5}{8}$  ins. Parcel gilt. Marks: Norwich Castle over lion, date letter B, 1566. Maker's mark, sun in splendour. Assay mark.

*Paten Cover*. Diameter,  $3\frac{3}{4}$  ins. No marks.

*Paten* on foot with six lobes. Diameter, 8 ins. Marks: leopard's head crowned, date letter c, 1858 (London), lion passant, queen's head. Maker's mark, S S  
W N Engraved underneath, Langham Episcopi 1858.

*Flagon*. Height,  $11\frac{1}{4}$  ins. Same marks. Engraved underneath, In memory of Stephen Frost Rippingall, Clerk, who died 24 Sept. 1858 + Langham Episcopi.

*Communion Cup*. Height,  $8\frac{1}{4}$  ins. Same marks as on paten and flagon. Engraved Langham Episcopi 1858.

*Paten*. Diameter,  $6\frac{1}{8}$  ins. No marks. Engraved, Langham Episcopi 1858, and underneath, a cross and "Re-cast 1897."

*Wafer Box*, 6 ins. by  $3\frac{1}{4}$  ins. Marks: leopard's head, date letter p, 1910 (London), lion passant. Maker's mark, a j p. Engraved, Given to the Church of Langham Episcopi in memory of F. T. S. Rippingall, by Sir Alfred Jodrell, Bt. It is beautifully decorated with the arms of the Patron Saint, Jodrell, and Rippingall.

## 18. LETHERINGSETT, ST. ANDREW.

*Communion Cup.* Height,  $5\frac{1}{4}$  ins. Diameter,  $3\frac{1}{2}$  ins. Marks: Norwich Castle over lion, date letter B, 1566. Maker's mark, maidenhead in shaped shield.

*Paten* on foot. Height, 1 in. Diameter,  $4\frac{3}{4}$  ins. Marks: (1) AH, (2) crown, (3) Norwich Castle over lion, (4) rose sprig.

*Paten.* Diameter,  $7\frac{3}{4}$  ins. Probably had a foot at one time. Engraved on a  $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. rim as above, and round the centre, Hanc Patinam Deo et sacris dicavit Jacob Astley

This cup is unlike the usual Norwich type.

The dates of all the above are *circa* 1680.

There is a band running round the cup with two ribs, engraved with conventional design and two shields, one containing the letters I B (=) John Bvtes, and the second his coat of arms.
