The Publications Committee has decided to record in Norfolk Archaeology recent books, pamphlets, and articles relating to local archeeology. Vol. 20 part 3 contained a list of such recent articles in periodical literature, and the present contribution is a list of books and pamphlets published during the years 1916-20, all of which may be consulted in the Norwich Public Library, which contains a large Local Collection, comprising some 7,000 volumes, 9,000 pamphlets, 7,000 topographical prints, 950 portraits, and 380 maps. It is anticipated that annual lists of books, pamphlets, and articles will be published in Norfolk Archeeology, which will form valuable supplements to Walter Rye's Index to Norfolk Topography,

and his two supplements thereto, published in 1896 and 1916. Members of the Society are invited to send to Mr. Stephen bibliographical particulars of any recent items, in order that future lists may be as complete as possible.

The following particulars regarding the items are given in conformity with modern bibliographical practice: author's name, title, series, pagination, size in inches, place of publication, publisher's name, date of publication, and price. The dates and names within square brackets are not given on the title-pages of the items, but have been supplied by the compiler.

By request, biographies of persons recently deceased, and local items relating to the European War, have been omitted from the list.
