

Coins associated with a possible mill structure in F163N in the Bainesse area

Two coins only were recovered from this locality, one Roman and the other modern:

1. sf. 519, from context 4754 (a band of fine black gravel).

This is very probably a *FEL TEMP REPARATIO* copy of the AD 350s, copying the types issued by Constantius II between AD 353 and 355. It is small (only 11 mm in diameter and 0.3 g in weight); and it is very poorly preserved, so much so that the attribution, though reasonably secure, is not absolutely certain. It shows relatively little circulation wear (though corrosion products also make that assessment less than definite).

2. sf. 522, from context 4824 (fill below structure 4819).

This is a very worn half penny of William III, bearing the legends *GVLIELMVS TERTIVS* (on the obverse) and *BRITANNIA* (on the reverse). It was minted between AD 1695 and 1701.
