

FULL ANALYSIS OF HUMAN REMAINS FROM FIELD 164 OF THE A1 WIDENING SCHEME

Summary

During excavations in2014, threecontexts of burnt bone were recovered from Field 164of the A1 Leeming to Barton Joint Venture for widening of the A1. Upon analysis it was determined that the quantity of bone recovered was too small, and the bone too fragmentary, to determine if they were human or animal in origin (Table 1). Therefore no further analysis was undertaken.
