ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Infant burial, one of two within a grave (pit cut and stone surface) that is the south western one, and probably the older of the two. It is believed it is roughly 3-4 years old.

This was the first individual to be found, at first the cut was marked out as an anomaly; a possible pit sticking out of the ditch [381837], some initial bones were found, bagged as if they were animal bones, until the cranium was found. The initial bones have been labelled as mixed bones from [381833] but are broken ribs and some vertebrae.

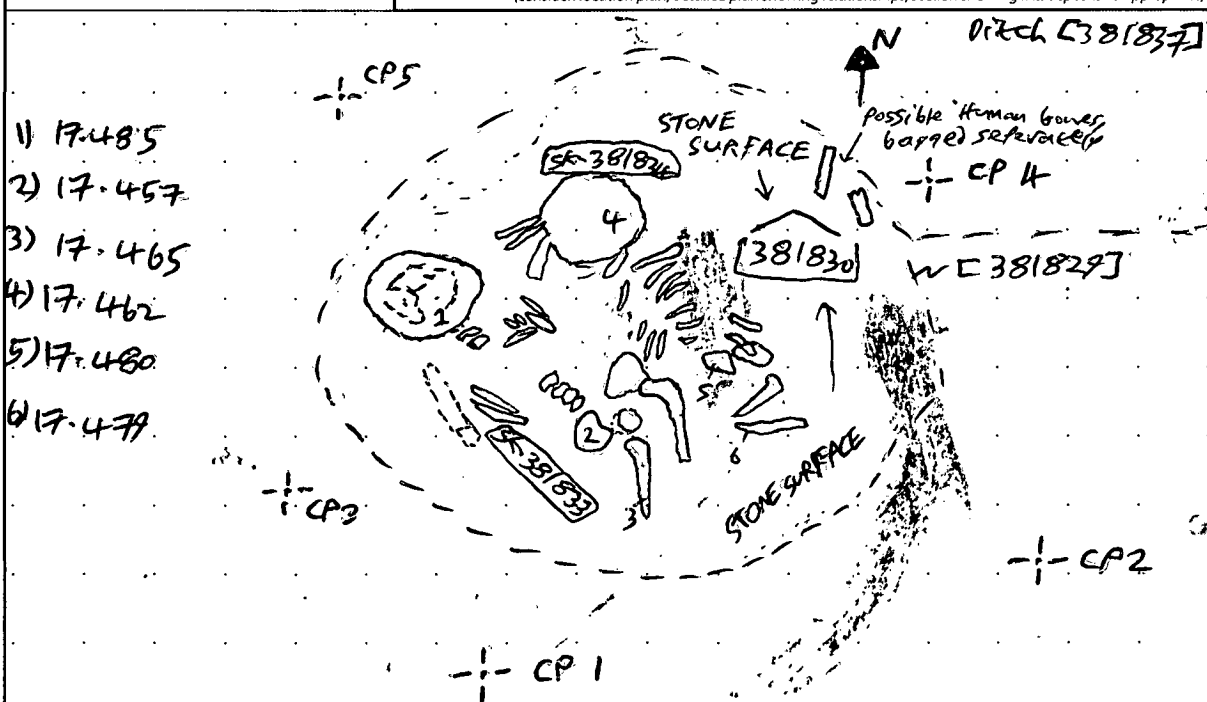
The arm from this individual was underneath the skull of SK [381834] and could not be removed without damaging the skull and so has been packed with it, apart from a few frags bagged individually.
