ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

FILL OF GULLY [385748]. POTTERY RECONGRENIS IRON AGE IN DATE. GULLY COULD BE RELATED TO OCCUPATION. FILL PROBABLY MANUAL BACK FILL AS SO DARK AND FILL SHOWS NO EVIDENCE OF WEATHERING. SOME ROOT DISTURBANCE PRESENT BUT ALL FEATURES AROUND IT ARE. INCLUSIONS OF SMALL TO MEDIUM SUBANGULAR STONES AND OCCASIONAL FLECKS OF CHARCOAL (1mm-50mm). ANIMAL BONE RECOVERED AS WELL SOME COMPLETE LIMB BONES AND A RIB PORTION. ONE PATCH OF CLAY IN FILL WITH ABURNT LOOK BUT ONLY SMALL.

UPDATE (26/10/17) -> GULLY EXCAVATED 100%. WE TOOK 20L SAMPLE (S38592) BECAUSE THE COMPOSITION OF THE FILL. WE FOUND FREQUENT PRESENCE OF ANIMAL BONES (MEDIUM AND BIG SIZE) AND MODERATE PRESENCE OF IRON AGE POT (INCLUDING A NICE PIECE OF IRON AGE DECORATED POTTERY).
