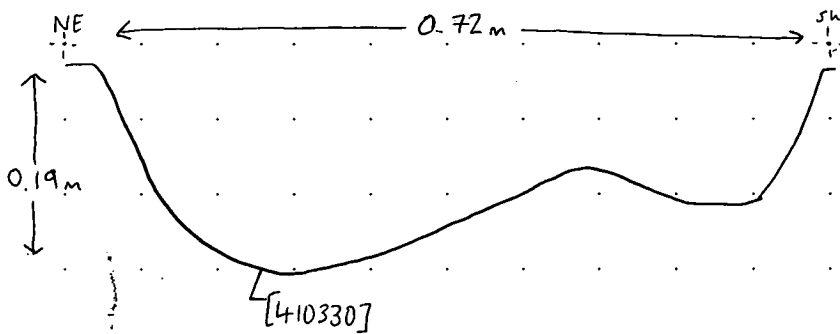
FILL OF PROBABLE CREMATION BURIAL - MOSTLY BLACK IN COLOUR WITH HIGH FREQUENCY OF CHARCOAL, WITH SMALL FRAGMENTS OF WHITE/ORANGE BURNT BONE THROUGHOUT. TOWARDS BASE, FILL BECOMES LESS CONSISTENTLY BLACK, ~~RESEMBLING~~ RESEMBLING MORE THE UNDERLYING FILL (MID YELLOWISH BROWN SILTY CLAY) BUT SAMPLED WITH THE REST OF THE CREMATION DUE TO CONTINUED OCCASIONAL PRESENCE OF BURNT BONE AND NOTABLE FREQUENCY OF CHARCOAL. ALL BONE WAS COLLECTED IN SAMPLE. CREMATION WAS FULLY EXCAVATED AND 100% WAS SAMPLED. OCCASIONAL STONE INCLUSIONS WERE MOSTLY SMALL ROUND PEBBLES (<0.05m DIAMETER), ^{WHICH} ~~THE~~ OCCASIONALLY SHOWED TRACES OF EXPOSURE TO BURNING (ALTHOUGH MOST DID NOT). VERY OCCASIONAL POT FRAGMENTS WERE RECOVERED - POSSIBLY IRON AGE IN DATE?
