ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

skeleton - ¹¹¹³⁶⁸F11063 was partially exposed and damaged by machinery, resulting in the loss of the top half of the cranium and Pot F11064. The cut was disturbed by burial of ¹¹¹³⁶⁹F11065, resulting in staining and the loss of several bones, including the feet. Pot F11064 was alongside the skull and lifted complete, unknown if objects placed with pot. Unable at time of excavation to sex the skeleton. Shroud pins (possible) recovered, suggesting the person was shrouded. All 3 skeletons ¹¹¹³⁶⁸F11063, ¹¹¹³⁶⁹F11065 and ¹¹¹³⁷⁰F11066 and all buried in very close proximity with one another. Location is with a boundary ditch, with a cluster of cremations on the other side of the ditch. This could suggest the individuals buried within the ditch were so for a reason - perhaps excluded from society.
