## MANORIAL RECORDS IN THE MIDDLESEX COUNTY RECORD OFFICE

No class of documents is of greater importance to the study of local history, in its social, economic, topographical and even genealogical aspects, than the records of the ancient manors and estates, not a few of which have continued in existence to the 20th century. It seems appropriate, therefore, in this Journal, to print a summary of the more important of such records as are now housed in the Middlesex County Record Office<sup>†</sup> at the Middlesex Guildhall, Westminster, S.W.1. The list is not complete, as the deposits of private and estate documents in the muniment rooms have not all been fully catalogued. In some cases the dates and descriptions assigned to documents by the depositors have been provisionally accepted and are subject to revision. The summary which follows may, however, serve to indicate to students where useful source material may be found. For some manors, notably that of Harrow (alias Sudbury), there are fine series of documents covering many centuries, while for others an isolated membrane records only the transactions of a single court.

Lysons, in his Environs of London (Middlesex Vols., 1795-1800), enumerates some one hundred and fifty manors or reputed manors in those parishes which now form the administrative county of Middlesex. Little more than one-fifth of these are represented by any kind of manorial document in the Middlesex Record Office. The records of the Middlesex manors are, perhaps, more than usually dispersed owing to the early disintegration of the large estates in the county. Also, it must be remembered that at various periods the Crown, the church, the colleges of the ancient universities and other corporate bodies have been large land-owners in Middlesex. The Court Rolls and other records of many manors must, therefore, be looked for among the archives of these institutions and are unlikely to come within the orbit of the County Record Office. Up to the present, no comprehensive survey (such as that of the Surrey Manorial Records prepared by the Surrey County Council and the Surrey Record Society in 1928) has been made

of the surviving manorial records in Middlesex. This is a work for which there is urgent need and which is likely to be of immeasurable value and interest to students of the history of the county.

Meanwhile, the work of collection is still actively proceeding. During the past year two valuable series of manorial records have been located and deposited in the County Record Office, which is, of course, approved by the Master of the Rolls for the reception of such documents. Normally only documents relating to the present administrative county of Middlesex are accepted on deposit, though occasionally items referring to other counties form part of collections which otherwise belong to Middlesex. Such is the case of the records of one or two manors now in the administrative County of London included at the end of the list.

In the list which follows, the name of the manor is given in its modern form, the earlier spelling only being used if it differs so greatly from the modern as to cause confusion. The parish named is that in which the *caput* of the manor is situated. The manor lands may well spread into neighbouring parishes and counties. An asterisk against the name of the manor indicates that a collection of miscellaneous deeds and papers is associated with the records listed. Covering dates only have been given and do not mean that the series necessarily run consecutively. Gaps of less than fifty years have been ignored.
