## JOHN WILKES AND LUDGATE CIRCUS<sup>(1)</sup>

THE stone obelisk on the south side of Ludgate Circus was removed by workmen on 15th October, 1950. It was long regarded as a memorial to John Wilkes, who was Lord Mayor at the time of its erection, and it bore his name; but later investigations showed that it had been put up in 1775 by the Bridge House Committee "for the support of four lamps to enlighten the footway."
