

A SURVEY OF THE MANOR OF HENDON  
 IN THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX BY  
 PRESENTMENT OF THE HOMAGE  
 19TH OCTOBER ANNO DOM. 1574

*a.* THE PRESENTMENT of John Notting and Robert Niccoll of Mill Hill, William Nicoll of Mill Hill, Richard Nicoll of Ridgeway, Willyam Niccoll of Highwood Hill, Richard Edlyne, Thomas Linford, Peter Winter, William Wise, Robert Braynte, John Gibb, Allen Niccoll, Thomas Marshe, John Butts, John Parson, Nicholas Marshe, John Lambe, Senr., John Shepherd, Robert Marshe of Gladwin Street, Willyam Marshe of White's, Robert Marshe of Mill Hill, William Marshe of the Netherhale, William Elis and Richard Niccoll Junr., certaine of the Customary Tenants of the Right Worshipful Sir Edward Herbert Lord of the Manor of Hendon by them given upp the first daie of October 1576, and in the xviiiith year of the raigne of our sovereyne Lady Queene Elizabeth, touchyng the charge to them given at a Court holden at the said mannor the xixth daie of October 1574 to enquire of as followeth. Vizt.

*b.* THE OUTBOUNDS of the parish of Hendon.

FIRST Mordins Brooke leadeth unto Bibwell, The Weildes boundeth against Bibwell to Wildswoode by a ditch to Harnsey Park corner and so by Weildswoode against Hampsted heath and over the heathe to Hodford wood corner and so to Wolfherst and so to the Temples, and to Blackets well and so to the Whelme in the Greene, downe the slipe to the corner of Oxgate feld and so the outside of Fernehill and goeth by Elieth feld, and leadeth through Harrowes land by a Slaunte in the Feild to West highwaie, and so half the high waie to Braint bridge and so by the Brooke to the common poole, and from the common poole up to the Lanes ende,

that cometh from Cowle Oak and so by Downedge, and by Rekes, and so to Gospell crofte next unto the lane which leadeth to the Hide house, and from the Hide house half the high waie to Edgware bridge, and so leadeth by the brooke to Parnell bridge, and by the brooke to the Hale bridge, and so by the brooke to Boyes land and Bernells Bridge, and so by a Pollard in six acres and so to Hod-geilders corner, and so to Hendon wood corner, and so by the outside of the old lane to Greensgate, and so by the outside of Hendon woode lane to Braintfeld corner, and so by the brooke to Wall-brooke corner, and so by a dytch to Hendon Meadgate, and by the outside of Heybourne land to Homes corner and so by the brooke to Tadbourne grove corner, and so to Malland and by the brooke to Frith bridge and so to Dollis bridge and so by the brooke to the Lord bridge in the Parke and so leadeth by the brooke to Mordyns pightell againe.

*c.* THE ANTIENT CUSTOMS USED IN THE SAID  
MANOR OF HENDON.

(1) IMPRIMIS, Our Antient Custom is within the said Manor time out of mind or memory of man used and to us and our Predecessors and Ancestors always allowed is and by all the said time hath been that at every alienation or at the Death of any Tenant of any Copyhold Lands or Tenements holden of the said Manor the Lord to have for his Fine the value of one years Rent coming clearly of the same Lands or Tenements that such Tenant held (the Lords Chief rent deducted) that such fine is to be paid within one year next after the Death of such Tenant or alienation of the same Lands or Tenements.

(2) ITEM, It is our Custom that Two Tenants of the same Manor or more may take a Surrender of any Copyhold Land holden in the same Manor, and bring it in and present it into the Lords Court within one year and a Day next after the taking thereof if there be any holden that year and if one of the Tenants shall fortune to Die in the meantime then the other Tenant surviving may lay in the same Surrender and upon his Presentment thereof made unto the Steward of the said Courts the same Surrender to be good and available.

(3) ITEM, It is our Custom that we may at our free will and Pleasure to let fall take down and remain any of our Customary or Copyhold Houses without any Fine or Forfeiture to or for the same to the Lord.

(4) ITEM, It is our Custom that all such Tenants that hold any Customary or Copyhold Houses Lands or Tenements by Surrender of the same Manor for Terms of years or for Terms of Life shall not let fall for lack of due reparation of any of their said Houses or Tenements neither fell any Timber growing upon the said Lands (except it be for the Reparation of such House or Tenement) upon forfeiture of his or their estate unto the next Heir to whom the Remainder of the Inheritance ought to Descend.

(5) ITEM, It is our Custom that a Woman that claimeth her Dower of any Copyhold Lands or Tenements holden of the same Manor shall not have the third of the said Lands but shall be ordered by the Homage to take yearly the Allowance for the same in money.

(6) ITEM, It is our Custom that all the Lords Tenants which hold any Lands of the said Manor to them and to their Heirs may fell cut down and carry away all the Timber and Wood growing upon the same Land at their will and pleasures.

(7) ITEM, It is our Custom that whosoever is Receiver Vizt (he that gathereth the Lords Rent) shall not pay neither Rent nor Service for Corn for that Year for that Tenement but is free and acquitted for that year.

(8) ITEM, It is our Custom that we have Two usual Courts in one year (that is to say) one upon Tuesday before the Feast of Pentecost and the other upon the Tuesday before the Feast of Saint Katherine. [That is St. Katherine the Martyr, kept on 25 November of the Roman Calendar.]

(9) ALSO, It is our Custom and hath out of mind been used that the Head Tenant payeth to the Lord his Chief Rent and Service and the Undersets being parcel of the same Head Tenant are to pay unto the Head Tenant rateably and according to their proportion.

(10) ALSO, Our Custom is that for all such Lands or Tenements as have been accustomedly herriottable after the Death of any of the Lords Tenants the Lord to have his Herriott (that is to say) the Heir or Successor to have first Choice of the best Beast and the Lord the second and that no underset of the same Tenement or Lands is or shall be chargeable to or with any such Herriott.

(11) ALSO, It is our Custom that we may at our free will let our Customary or Copyhold Lands or Tenements for the Term of Three Years without Fine paying to the Lord or Licence to be by him granted for the same.

(12) ALSO, It is our Custom and so time out of mind hath been used that all amerciaments growing to the Lord for want of appearance or otherwise shall be sessed and set down by the Two Tenants called the Ferres or more that shall be of the Homage or Jury at the Lords Court, and that any the Lords Tenants may be Essoin at the next Court after his and their appearance at the Lords Court Baron paying for every such Essoin.....1<sup>d</sup>

THE COPPIHOLDE LANDES WITHIN THE SAID  
MANNOR OR LORDSHIP OF HENDON.

And tenn bushells of otes.

(3) RICHARD MARSHE holdeth a tenement called Birtes contaynning by estimacion xv acres and renteth yearlie to the Lord.....iii<sup>s</sup>  
And paieth for service.....iii<sup>s</sup>

Item three crofts called Megfeildes conteynning by estimacion vi acres parcell of the tenement called Jenates now Valentine Jacketts and renteth to the same tenement.

And also one crofte called Birdcroft and renteth to a tenement called Greenes now Wiles.

(4) ROBERT MARSHE holdeth a messuage and ten acres of lande called Goldstones and renteth to the Lord.....xvi<sup>d</sup>  
And payeth for service .....iiii<sup>d</sup>

Item one parcell of land called Birt croft and renteth unto a tenement called Waffe [or Waise] now Robert Niccoll.

And also the same Robert Marshe holdeth three crofts of land and wood parcell of the tenement called Wayse now Roger Page and renteth to the same.

(5) FRANCIS BARKER holdeth one grove called Brane [Broom] feild and renteth yearlie to the Lorde.....iiii<sup>d</sup>

Item one parcell of ground that his house standeth upon by estimacion lx feet and in breadth xx feet. And renteth yearlie to the Lord.....i<sup>d</sup>

(6) JOHN NICOLL of the Hale holdeth half a tenement called Howans by estimacion vii acres of lande and wood viz. one acre of wood one croft called Longland one feild called Shortlands one mead called Hale meads and iiii feilds of land in Sheveshill And renteth yearlie to the Lorde.....xii<sup>d</sup>

And payeth for service.....ii<sup>d</sup>

Item one croft called Long acre by estimacion two acres and a half and one feild lying in Sheveshill parcell of White tenement and renteth to the same tenement.

And also one dole lying in Sheveshill parcell of the Smales tenement and renteth to the same tenement.

(7) JOHN NICOLL of Totteridge holdeth a cottage with a garden called Graunte parcell of the tenement some time Goodwins, now Robert Nicoll, and renteth yearlie to the same tenement.

(8) HENRIE PLOTT [or Blott] holdeth in the right of his weif one messuage with a garden and two feildes thereto belonginge parcell of the tenement of Birts and renteth to the Lord yearlie. .ii<sup>s</sup> iii<sup>d</sup>

And payeth for service .....vi<sup>s</sup> viii<sup>d</sup>

And tenn bussells of oates.

(9) JOHN ADAM holdeth one messuage with a garden and one meadowe by estimacion iiii acres one croft called Horsland one croft called Slane land and one feild called Slane by estimacion xxi acres and renteth yearlie to the Lorde .....viii<sup>s</sup> iiiii<sup>d</sup>

And payeth for service .....iiii<sup>d</sup>

And is heriotable to the Lorde.

Also one grove called South grove and renteth yearlie to the Lord .....iiii<sup>d</sup>

(10) RICHARD NICCOLL of Dryvers holdeth a tenement called Dryvers by estimacion xxiii acres and renteth yearly to the Lorde .....viii<sup>d</sup>

And payeth for service.....iii<sup>s</sup> iiiii<sup>d</sup>

Item three felde being parcell of the tenement called Mordins conteynning by estimacion xx acres and renteth yearlie to the Lorde .....xx<sup>s</sup>

(11) FRANCIS KEMPE holdeth one messuage one orchard and one meadow conteynninge by estimacion three acres and renteth yearlie unto a tenement called Wolfherst nowe Willyam Wise.

(12) NICHOLAS ADAM holdeth a tenement called Michalls by estimacion xvii acres and renteth to the Lorde . . . . . vii<sup>s</sup> vii<sup>d</sup>  
And payeth for service.

(13) JAMES FOTHERLEY holdeth in the right of his weife one parcell of lande and wood called Grauntes parcell of Grauntes tenement, otherwise called Goodyers and renteth to the same tenement.

(14) WILLIAM WISE [OR EDES] holdeth ii croftes called Westcrofte and renteth yearlie to the Lorde . . . . . iii<sup>d</sup>

(15) ROBERT MARSHE of Millhill holdeth a parcell of tenement called Graunts, being one messuage one garden and three croftes by estimacion x acres and renteth to the Lorde . . . . . xii<sup>s</sup> i<sup>d</sup>  
And payeth for services . . . . . iii<sup>d</sup>

And also the same Robert holdeth three crofts called Smithsons [or Swetsons] by estimacion xviii acres and renteth yearlie to the Lorde . . . . . vi<sup>s</sup> iii<sup>d</sup>

And x bussells of oats.

(16) GEORGE SHEPPARD holdeth a tofte and two crofts of lande called Warrens and renteth yearlie to the Lorde . . . . . xx<sup>d</sup>

And also one crofte of lande called Aldwick by estimacion iiiii acres and one grove of woode and crofte of land called Brodlands by estimacion iiiii acres and one meade called Brodland meade by estimacion halfe an acre and renteth all to Perreis tenement.

(21) JOANE FISHER holdeth a cottage and renteth to the Lorde .....i<sup>d</sup>

#### NOTES ON THE SURVEY OF 1574.

##### (a) THE PRESENTMENT.

Ridgeway. There are two deeds in the Author's possession dealing with Ridgeway. One, a grant by Thomas Nycoll of Ridgewaye in the Parish of Hendon, Yeoman (son and heir of Richard Nicoll late of Ridgeway deceased), to Richard Marshe of Gladwynstreate in the same parish, Yeoman, of a croft or parcel of Meadow commonly called Mussidge Crofte alias Well Crofte, containing 4 acres, lying at Bonnes in the same parish, abutting on the Kingshighway or lane leading towards Page Street on the north, on the house of the said Richard Marshe called Bonnes on the east, and on the free lands of Richard Marshe late of Wm. Blackwell, gent, on the south and east. 22 Nov. 1608. (with signature of Thomas Nicoll and non-armorial seal). This deed and others belonging to the author have been transcribed and in some cases translated by Mr. F. G. Emmison of Bedford.

The second is a release of Dower by Margaret, widow of Thomas Nicoll of Ridgeway in the parish of Hendon, yeoman, to Richard Marshe of Gladwynstreat in the same parish, yeoman, for £50, in two closes formerly belonging to Thomas Dawes, now called Welfields, lying near Bonnes in the parish of Hendon; also in one dole of land containing one acre lying in one of the said fields called Further Welfields; which belonged to her late husband who sold them to the said Richard Marshe, 17 Nov., 8 James I, 1610. (with signature of Margaret Nicoll and seal).

Willyam Niccoll of Highwood Hill. In *Calendar of Patent Rolls*, Edward VI, 1550-53, p. 84, 24 April 1551, there is a licence to John Niccoll of Highwoodhyll in the parish of Hendon to grant his lands called le Esyng Spittle, land of the late hospital, in tenure of Roger Marshe and Peter Nicoll to William Copwood, gentleman, and John Snowe the elder and their heirs for the use of the said John Niccoll and Margaret his wife for term of life in survivorship with remainder to the use of Roger Marshe and Agnes his wife, one of the daughters of the said John Niccoll and the heirs of his wife Agnes.

This land was the same for which on 1 September 1458, a licence was granted for the alienation in Mortmain by John Fortescue Kt. to Elyngspital of 12 acres of land 3 of meadow 4 of pasture and 4s. 4d. in rent in Hendon, for 10 marks paid in the Hanaper. (*Cal. Pat. Rolls*. Hen. VI, 1452-61, p. 473.)

Edlyne. In 1561 a true bill was found at the Middlesex Sessions that "for three months following the said day and even till now, Henry Edlin, late of Hendon, Co. Midd., husbandman, has had neither bow nor arrow for shooting, against the form of the statute in that case provided."

This slackness on Edlin's part was a breach of an Act of 1521 encouraging archery by all males, but it was apparently neglected by Hendon as a whole. Butts should have been provided for the village and every male

above 14 years of age should have possessed a bow and two shafts. The Act was supplemented by a further ordinance for the encouragement of Harquebus-men and Matchlock Volunteers, with an old soldier as Sergeant.

Hendon did not erect butts until 1597 when the Constable ordered their construction (see E. T. Evans, *History of Hendon*). In the All Souls Map, No. 1, Henry Edlinge appears as a tenant of the land on London Waye (Watling Street) close to Silk Bridge and to the West of the Silk Stream. This would be the estate now called Cowleaze and held (1933) by Miss Alice (Nicoll) Perkins, the latest of the Nicoll family to live in Hendon.

Whites. In this list of the Jury there is mentioned "Whites," one of the principal tenements. Custom (9) states that the Head Tenant pays rent and service to the Lord and the Undersets pay to the Head Tenant in proportion.

In a later Survey, that of 1685 (of which two copies are in the author's possession and one is in the Bodleian Library), there is a list of all Reeveable tenements which will probably not materially have altered since 1574 or even earlier. They are Saunders Hutchins, Bishops Lands, Mallands, Waifes, Goodhews, Wolfhurst, Greens, Knights, Winches, Little Birts, Little Daws, Elderslands, Marrynors, Myles, Woodcroft alias Birts Land, Bordens, Bunns, Dallahay, Swetsons, Wauves, Saunders, Old Goodhews, Edward ap-perries, Witringshams, Walter ap-perries, Tadborne, Nells-field, Dyes, Great Dawes, Henry Rogers, Walter Drews, Stony-fields, John-at-Hedge, Lowdams, Corbies, Jenatte, Great Birts, Bornefield, Sagrims, Coggtutters, Gibbfield, Hightrow, Westlande, Lyndraper, Smales, Slattons, Whites, Marriott, Jacobs, Allan Sopers, Richard Goodwin, Robert Bonds, Drivers, Homans (54 in all).

#### (b) THE OUTBOUNDS.

Hyde. In the muniments of All Souls there occur, 9 Ed. II, Richard and Michael atte Hyde, and Simon and Isabella le Taillour; and 35 Henry VI, 8 Ed. IV and 24 Henry VII, Hedes Londres.

Parnell Bridge. In the Complete Map of Edgware, 1599 (All Souls), there are three Parnell fields, close to Watling Street.

Hod-geilders corner. In the Complete Map of Edgware, 1599, there are three fields called Hegelders, at the extreme N.E. of Edgware where it abuts on Hendon Wood.

(3) Birts is short for Ilberts and the latter was in the possession of the Nicolls from 1477 when William Payne of Stanmore gave full and quiet possession and seizin of Ilbertsmead, 9 acres more or less, to John Nycoll, the father and John Nycoll the son. In the Ilbert set of Nicoll deeds there are also deeds of 1541, 1590 and 1623.

Megfeildes and Jenatus. A deed in the author's possession of 10 May, 44 Eliz. 1602, relates to a Court Baron of John Gouldborough, gent., and is a copy of the Court Roll, referring to the Quit-claim by Richard Nicoll of Ridgeway to Edward Lawman of London, gent., re three crofts or closes called Jennatts, formerly belonging to Richard Marshe, and belonging to the tenement called Jennatts, now two crofts called Beldanhawe and Megfeildes, containing together 7 acres, lying near Milhill within the Manor; which Robert Nicoll, citizen and innholder of London, surrendered by the hands of Wm. Nicoll of Marrynors and Wm. Marshe of Mylhill (two tenants of the Manor) to the use of the said Edw. Lawman on the 15th January preceding.

(6) No mention of Sheveshill Commonfield occurs in the Black Survey, 1321. A deed of 1505 of the Marsh family refers to Shefshill. Evans, *History of Hendon*, pp. 313, 315, mentions that in 6 Elizabeth it was

ordered that no tenant in Sheveshill should "depasture or keep there more than two cows and horses for every acre of fallow, and for every acre of meadow or pasture five sheep, and for every acre of fallow three sheep, under penalty of three shillings and fourpence for every beast beyond that number." He also mentions that in 1590 William Deacon was presented for hunting sheep on the common (probably Sheveshill Common field).

(7) Graunts. A deed in the author's possession dated 28th Nov., 1592, refers to a Court Baron of Edward Herbert, Knight, and is a copy of the Court Roll, relating to the admission of Richard Nicoll on the Surrender of Robert Nicoll, sen., his father, at his death, on 28th May, 1592, by the hands of Wm. Nicoll of Marners and Rob. Marshe, jun. (two tenants of the Manor) to a tenement called Waifes near Mylspit, two crofts adjoining a meadow called the Mead, closes called Hornecrofte, Crowche feilde and Graunts lying together, four crofts called Gladwinsfeilde, Fernecrofte, Nutfeilde and Longcrofte; and all the rest of his lands and tenements within the Manor (except a cottage and piece of land adjoining at Mylhill in the occupation of Rob. Nicoll, jun.).

(23) Peter Wise. In *Calendar of Patent Rolls*, Edw. VI, 1547-48, p. 411, 9 Sept., 1548, there is a grant to Thomas Bourchier and Henry Tanner of London of two closes, 18 acres of pasture called Byrdshot and Seiters in tenure of Nicholas Wyse in Hendon, Middlesex, abutting upon the eastern side of Braynt brydge there and upon the way leading from Edgware on the West.

This suggests the origin of the name Wise Lane in Mill Hill, leading from Hammers Lane to Mylespit Hill.

(50) A deed in the author's possession records the Conveyance by Roger Cholmeley, Knight, to Joan Parson, widow, of Hendon, for £6 13s. 4d. of his cottage and orchard adjoining in the occupation of Thomas Joyse in the parish of Hendon. Also power of attorney to John Tanner and John Marshe, both of Hendon, yeomen, to deliver possession to the purchaser. 28 April, 1 Eliz. 1559. There is a signature of Roger Cholmeley, but his seal is missing. He was founder of Highgate Grammar School and is the "Mr. Chumley," who figures on the Map of Clitterhouse. If he is correctly styled a commoner, then we may date the Map as prior to Elizabeth's reign.

(65) Saunders Hochins. William Houchons was Reeve from 2 Dec. 1348 to 12 August 1349 and probably succumbed to the Black Death. This holding, which has continued to recent years, evidently perpetuates his name. The first part of the name is of frequent occurrence and derives from one of the tenants of 1321.

(94) Tipler Donne. There are several deeds, part of a collection made by Mr. Frank Marcham, relating to this property; one of 20 May 1636 of a message called Triplirey Donne in Brainstreete, Hendon and 2 orchards and 2 acres in the occupation of Henry Knight, Edward Shepperd and John Butterfield: one of 30 April 1674 relating to Thomas and John Sutton; one of 8 April 1675, lease to Henry Gardner, one of 11 April 1683, assignment by Dr. Walter Mills and John Sutton to Jerom Newbolt; one of 12 Jan. 1691-2, John Sutton to Rt. Hon. Sir William Rawlinson Kt.; and one of 6 April 1764 by William Rawlinson, Earle, relating to a message called Tripley Down alias Triplarisdam, 2 acres.

(99) Estons Lande. This holding, as well as others of interest, is mentioned in a deed in the author's possession, dated 14 Dec., 13 Henry VI, 1434. It is a grant or Conveyance by John Clerk of Hendon in the County of Middlesex and Eve his wife to John Golde of the parish of Yelling in the same County and Agnes daughter of the said John Clerk of one toft

with a garden adjoining called "Goldbeters Gardyn" containing three acres lying in the parish of Hendon between the King's highway on the north side and the land of John Eston on the West and South sides and the land of Thomas Nychol on the East side; also four crofts lying together in the same parish between the land of the said John Eston and Simon Bunde on the north and west sides and Moselane on the east side and the land of the Lord called Harpershotte on the south side, whereof one is called Upcroft and contains 10 acres, the second Thyselcroft and contains 6 acres, the third Goldbetersmede and contains 4½ acres of meadow and the fourth Beinefeld and contains 5 acres. To hold to the said John Golde & Agnes and their heirs. Witnesses John Breynt, Thos. Jacob, Wm. Nycoll, Wm. Rolf, Ralph Chawchyll.

Forty. In the possession of the author there is an assignment of a Lease by Humphrey Hall of the parish of Hendon, husbandman, to Thomas Marshe of Cannons in the parish of Stanner-the-less, yeoman, for £18 of a tenement with the orchard adjoining, several parcels of land called Hasilwood, Lammeseleshill, Pightell and Uppercrofte, his freehold land in a field called Close fortie, a field called the Inner Fortie, two parcels called Doles lying in a field called the Further Fortie, five doles in Sheshill felde together with the lops and tops of the trees thereon; all situate in the parish of Hendon. Which land etc. had been leased for 12 years by deed dated 15 Nov., 8 Eliz. (1566) by Roger Marshe of Chippinge Barnet, yeoman, to the said Humphrey Hall; and are now assigned to the said Thomas Marshe for the remainder of the term. 21 Nov., 14 Eliz. (1571).

(117) Christian Norris. In the possession of the author there is a deed of 1515 being an award by Richard Elyott and Lewis Pollard, Justices of the Common Pleas, arbitrators between Richard Bellamy, gent, and Christian Noreys, widow, granting to the latter certain lands and tenements called Bungsfeld and Alyn's hill in the parish of Hendon, the title to which the parties had disputed; she paying five marks sterling to the said Richard Bellamy. Last day of June, 7 Henry VIII.

(118) Reskymmer. Mrs. Reskymmer (*sic*) is perhaps an unmarried daughter of William Reskymmer and his wife Alice, *nee* Denzil, or it may refer to Alice herself, but she died in 1564, ten years before the date of the Survey. Mr. Trelawny Roberts and Mr. J. P. Rogers inform me that William Reskymmer was descended from Gilbert Reskymmer, a 12th century Cornishman, who married Eliza, d. and heiress of Lelote Pawlyn, and the descent is as follows: Gilbert; Richard; Richard; John; Richard; Sir Richard, d. 1312, = Alice, d. of Sir Roger Prideaux; William; Richard; Roger; John; Sir John; Ralph; Ralph; William, d. 1471, = Eliz. d. of Sir Thomas Arundell; John; William. William and Alice had four daughters: Anne = John Trelawny and Sir William Mohun; Katherine = Peter Courtney of Landrake, whose name figures on the All Souls College Map; Francisca, who may be this Mrs. Reskymmer, and Johanna.

(119) Sir Gwillm Hollis. This is a very interesting family to be associated with Hendon. The first Sir William Holles, (1471?-1572) was Master of the Mercers Company, Sheriff, and in 1539/40 Mayor of London. His son, Sir Gwillm Holles, was of Haughton, Notts., while the grandson, Sir Denziel Holles, whose name occurs on the All Souls Map, died 12th April 1590. Next came John Holles, Earl of Clare (1564-1637) who served against the Armada, in the Azores, and against the Turks. He had two sons, John, second Earl of Clare (1595-1666) and Denzil Holles (1599-1680), one of the "Five Members." From John were descended the Pelham-Holles, Dukes of Newcastle.
