
REPORT ON A TRENCH THROUGH A SECTOR OF THE RUISLIP MOUND

THE Ruislip Mound is situated about 50 feet south of the Pinn Brook and a quarter of a mile east of Bury Street (vide *Earliest Ruislip*, by Hugh Brann, Fig. 5).

The Mound is of the dimensions shown in the diagram:



The depth and direction of the trench is marked in red.

At A was found a piece of glass (pronounced to be possibly Roman). At B₁, B₂ were found fragments of pottery widely disseminated, and all of a small size. They were identified as being either mediaeval or Roman.

The Mound shows signs of having been trenched already in a north-west—south-east direction.
