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#### **Abstract**

An archaeological evaluation was undertaken by AOC Archaeology Group on the site of a proposed retail development at Duchlage Farm, Duchlage Road, Crieff, Perthshire.

The archaeological evaluation consisted of the machine trenching of some 1,896 m² representing in excess of a 6% sample of the 2.88 ha development area.

No archaeological material was encountered. It was noted that the northern half of the site including the former Council Yard had undergone significant modern disturbance.

#### 1 INTRODUCTION

#### 1.1 Background

- 1.1.1 AOC Archaeology Group was commissioned by Goodson's Associates on behalf of Tesco Stores Ltd to undertake an archaeological evaluation in advance of a proposed retail development at Duchlage Court, Crieff, Perthshire (Planning Reference No. 08/01955/FLN).
- 1.1.2 The proposed development lies within the administrative area of Perth & Kinross Council, which is advised on archaeological matters by the Perth & Kinross Heritage trust (PKHT). PKHT recommended a programme of phased archaeological works in accordance with Scottish Planning Policy (2010) and Planning & Archaeology (2011).
- 1.1.3 A Written Scheme of Investigation (AOC 2011) outlining the entire programme of archaeological works was agreed with PKHT in advance of the evaluation being undertaken. The evaluation was designed around a minimum 6% trenching sample.

#### 1.2 Location

- 1.2.1 The proposed development site amounting to some 2.88 ha (centred NGR: NN 8625 2108) is located at the site of a former dairy farm (Duchlage Farm) situated between Broich Road and Duchlage Road, Crieff. The site also incorporates a former Council Yard.
- 1.2.2 The site is underlain by solid geology of Lower Devonian sedimentary deposits. The drift geology is comprised of deposits of reddish brown alluvial clay tills.

#### 1.3 Archaeological background

- 1.3.1 Prior to the evaluation there were no known archaeological sites within the proposed development. A listed farmhouse (NMRS NN82SE 259) lies immediately to the east of the development area with Market Park (NMRS NN82SE 270) the site of variously a market or fair for sheep and cattle, a Crieff Highland Games venue complete with grandstand (and later slaughterhouse) and a World War II defence facility composed of Nissen huts. A mid 19<sup>th</sup> century Gasworks (NMRS NN82SE 57) also lay nearby.
- 1.3.2 Perhaps of greater relevance in terms of the possible survival of buried archaeological features within the development area is the scheduled site of *Brioch*, approximately 600 m to the south-east, comprising the remains of a cursus monument, ring-ditch, burial mound and later prehistoric settlement.

#### 2. OBJECTIVES

2.1 The objectives of the archaeological evaluation were:

- *i)* to determine and assess the character, extent, condition, quality, date and significance of any buried archaeological remains within the proposed development area (Phase 1);
- *ii)* to advise and implement an appropriate form of mitigation, such as evaluation, excavation, post-excavation analyses and publication given the infeasibility of preserving the archaeological material *in situ*, should significant archaeological remains be encountered.

#### 3 METHODOLOGY








Figure 2: Evaluation trench layout, Duchlage Court, Crieff

- 3.1 Thirty-two trenches totalling 1896 m<sup>2</sup> (basal dimensions) were excavated. Trenches were of varying lengths, 2 m wide, and set on varying orientations (Figure 2).
- 3.2 Stripping of the overburden was by means of a single tracked 360° excavator equipped with a 2 m wide toothless ditching bucket. Excavation was undertaken in shallow units/spits until the first significant archaeological horizon or natural subsoil was reached. All machine excavation was supervised by an experienced field archaeologist.
- 3.3 All trial trenching was undertaken according to AOC Archaeology Group's standard operating procedures. The trenches were carefully backfilled on completion of the evaluation.

#### 4 RESULTS

#### 4.1 Introduction

4.1.1 The archaeological evaluation was undertaken between 26<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> September 2011. Good archaeological visibility was present throughout the evaluation. The following should be read in conjunction with the data presented in Appendices 1 and Figure 2.

#### 4.2 Field A

4.2.1 The excavation of the trenches (Nos. 1-15) revealed a thin improved agricultural topsoil of soft, dark brown sticky clay loam with a high organic content. This overlay an alluvial deposit of red/brown silt. This varied from 0.10 m to 0.40 m in depth. The underlying natural subsoil was a stony clay till.

#### 4.3 Field B

4.3.1 A single trench (No.16) was excavated revealing the same deposits as Field A

#### 4.4 Field C

4.4.1 Three trenches (Nos. 17, 18 &19) were excavated within the Council Yard bordering Fields C & D. These were shortened to five metres in length due to the proximity of known services and to minimize disturbance (it is still a working Council storage yard). A number of unmarked services such as drains and electrical cables were also encountered.

4.4.2 All three trenches showed that the yard had been previously reduced to natural subsoil. Deposits encountered consisted of hardcore, tarmac and madeground excavated to a depth of one metre. No significant archaeological material was observed.

#### 4.5 Field D

4.5.1 Twelve trenches were excavated within Field D (Nos. 20-32). The trenches showed an increased depth of alluvium (max 1.20 m). Modern disturbance was recorded within Trenches 20-24 & 27. This was probably related to the construction of the nearby Council Yard. A large extinct ceramic drain was encountered within Trenches 24 and 27 running north to south. This was not picked up in any of the more southerly positioned trenches.

#### 5 CONCLUSION

5.1 Neither significant archaeological remains nor artefacts were identified during the evaluation. On the basis of the evaluation works undertaken the development area would appear as being archaeologically sterile.

#### 6 RECOMMENDATIONS





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Figure 1: Location of the site at Duchlage Court, Crieff


