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Summary

AOC Archaeology Group was commissioned by CALA Homes (East) Ltd to undertake an archaeological watching brief on the demolition (grubbing up of former foundations) of the former SQA building on Ironmills Road, Dalkeith. These works were a requirement of planning consent as determined by Midlothian Council.

No significant archaeological deposits, features or artefactual material were encountered during the watching brief.

1 INTRODUCTION

1.1 An archaeological watching brief was required by CALA Homes (East) Ltd on groundworks associated with the demolition of the former SQA offices at Ironmills Road, Dalkeith. The work required was in response to a condition of planning consent (Planning Ref: 10/00605/PPP) set by the Midlothian Council, who are advised on archaeological matters by the East Lothian Council Archaeology Service (ELCAS).

1.2 Site Location

1.2.1 Ironmills Road is located to the north-west of the town of Dalkeith. The former SQA offices are located at National Grid Reference NT 32757 67382 (Figure 1).

1.3 **Archaeological Background**

No known sites of historic or archaeological interest are noted on the site of the SQA offices in the 1.3.1 National Monuments Record of Scotland. However by the mid-19th century the immediate area was widely used for industrial purposes, with the 'North Esk' woolen mill directly opposite the site to the north of Ironmills Road. Although this mill continues throughout the 19th and early – mid 20th century, there was no development within current application area until well into the mid-20th century.

2 **OBJECTIVES**


- 2.1 The objectives of the archaeological works were:
 - i) to safeguard the archaeological resource from disturbance by the proposed development works
 - ii) to liaise with the ELCAS and the client in the event of significant archaeological features and/or small finds being unearthed as to the most appropriate response in safeguarding these features either by preservation in situ, if at all feasible, or by archaeological recording;
 - iii) to report on the results of the watching brief.


3 **METHODOLOGY**

3.1 Machine excavation works in removing building foundations, concrete pads and similar ground fast structures were monitored by an AOC field archaeologist. All areas were closely inspected for possible archaeological remains. A plan identifying these areas can be found in Figure 1.

4 **RESULTS**

- The watching brief was undertaken between 10th July and 6th August 2012. Weather conditions were 4.1 generally fair yielding good archaeological visibility.
- 4.2 The monitoring of the removal of the foundations for the SQA buildings identified that largely the buildings had been erected through a madeground deposit into natural sands and gravels. The depth of the madeground varied between 0.5 m and 1.5 m. In one area to the northern boundary of the site where the madeground was exceptionally deep, a number of bottles and jars (ca. 1930s) were identified within an area of brick and sandstone demolition rubble.

4.2 A cable trench, approximately 1m in width, was excavated by hand along the southern boundary of the site. Here a disturbed garden soil mixed with subsoil, noted beneath the main ground level to a depth of 1 m, which was clearly a build-up for the levelling of ground prior to the scarping of the natural slope in this area.

5 **CONCLUSION**

- 5.1 No significant archaeological deposits, features or artefactual material were encountered during the watching brief.
- 5.2 Given the prior construction works involved in the creation of the SQA offices, the build-up of madeground deposits over natural subsoil and the general lack of natural deposits over the greater part of the site in would appear that the development area is archaeologically sterile.

6 RECOMMENDATIONS

6.1 No further archaeological works are considered necessary. This recommendation will require confirmation by Midlothian Council as advised by ELCAS.


