

An area of some 0.8ha was stripped immediately adjacent and west of previous stripped and investigated parts of the quarry (WGN 047), bounded to the south by the B1085 and to the north by the quarry access road. This area was monitored intermittently and observed at various points during and after stripping by an experienced archaeologist.



A total of approximately 0.4m-0.45m of topsoil (a mid brown light sandy silt with moderate small to medium sized gravel inclusions) was removed from the field above the natural horizon, with sandy and silty gravels remaining. There were no other horizons present, as the ploughsoil was directly above clear natural gravels with no surviving unploughed levels. No finds or deposits of archaeological relevance were observed within the stripped area although a number of natural features were investigated (principally tree throws and animal burrows).
