Fill of mid brown sand. Looked old but no finds (spoil already levelled on open ground but driven over) dr). Feature 0002 0.7m deep flat bottom with lots of charcoal. Some burnt stone. Large piece of pot recovered from base of feature, bone next to it.

Finds: 0002, fragment of horse metapodial (73g). Body sherd, medium sandy greyware, prob. Early Saxon (37g).
