Very heavy, hard fabric. orange-brown fabric; moderate ^{to subsequent} h
mostly small inclusions: transparent quartz;

some opaque black; rare opaque white + cream.

A very ~~has~~ distinctive 'skin' near top with thick pinkish-brown
core; surface? burnished but very light scoring marks.

Curious break along body, possibly had large pebble
here (c. 30 mm in length); curiously smooth break. Not enough
survives to be certain it had no gut; 1 gut can be seen but
is not really in surface-sl. covered. No use as summing surface.

Mini-bead has been razed for spout.

② Not marked. Almost half of the vessel survives. Dv. c 34 cms.

The vessel has never had any tituration glaze & has never been ^{nor stamped} used. Very hard, composition as no ① definite boundary between core & surface skin; but fabric marginally pinker ^(skin) (more like core of ①); but core of ② is paler brownish-pink. The flange on one side has come out noticeably thicker than on the other and this is the obvious reason one can see for the small amount of ^{iron-free} cream clay underneath all round - it is fractionally thicker under this end. Basethick, roughly turned with knife? & smoothed but body NOT smoothed. 2 little sausages of clay have been ~~best~~ used to form spout; used either a mixture of 2 clays or cream clay to smooth.

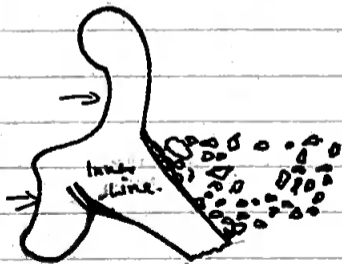
