be blackened by fire in part. Inclusions: few ill-sorted,
random, opaque black, quartz. The tenebration on
EH 86 BB 1437 AA is similar to that on Boriedo in every way.

Flange only. No fracture survives but old
grit in surface trans grt with more opaque black
just signs that surface of flange could have
had some concentric scoring.

Occupation of M began in Nero's reign (AD 54 - 68). occupation dated AD 55-75 with possibility of being dated to later part of this period. Dr. 29.5.

The vessel has been restored from very many sherds but pasted flange and whole of base is restored. The surfaces are everywhere crazed and crumbling. Fine-textured cream fabric, ^{Few} something quartz, ^{sporadic} orange-brown and ? black. Intersections flat & quartz, little scurries. Surface discoloured but ^{as} _{shape not exactly} perfectly normal. irregular.
