

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
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Archaeological Recording

Summary

Wessex Archaeology was commissioned by Kirklees Council to undertake archaeological recording during groundworks associated with the improvement of footpaths and a drive within the grounds of Batley Parish Church, Stocks Lane, Batley, West Yorkshire (NGR 241 244). The archaeological recording was undertaken between 30th September 2010 and 11th January 2012.

The church graveyard had previously been cleared of gravestones, although the burials remain in place, and the stones used to construct paths through the former graveyard and around the church. The groundworks involved lifting the gravestone paths and laying a new flagstone path, upgrading vehicular access into the Site including the removal of gravestones that formed the drive, installation of fixed floodlights and cables, and tree planting.

A gravestone survey was carried out before the commencement of groundworks. The gravestone paths were surveyed, photographed and recorded in order to compile a detailed plan of the location of gravestones prior to the improvement works.

A watching brief was maintained during all groundworks in the former graveyard. The lifting of the gravestones provided an opportunity to enhance the gravestone survey records and all archaeological deposits and features were recorded. The outlines of 14 graves were identified beneath the path on the eastern side of the church but the burials were not disturbed by the works. To the west of the church a greater level of previous disturbance was identified; disarticulated bones were observed in the levelling deposits beneath the drive indicating that some burial had been disturbed during earlier groundworks. These remains were left *in situ* or reburied elsewhere on site.

Where possible, the gravestones removed from the paths and drive were re-layed adjacent to the new path and the new locations were recorded and cross-referenced onto the gravestone survey records. Fragmented stones could not be re-layed and were buried within the former churchyard.

A small assemblage of modern, unstratified finds was recovered but was not found to be archaeologically significant.

This report provides a full record of the 144 burial monuments that were affected by the recent groundworks, including photographs and transcriptions of individual gravestones, and plans showing the location of the gravestones prior to, and following, the path improvement works.

The site archive is currently stored at Wessex Archaeology's Sheffield Office under the project number 75430 and will be deposited with the West Yorkshire Archive Service, along with a copy of this report, in due course.

1 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Project Background

- 1.1.1 Wessex Archaeology was commissioned by Kirklees Council Regeneration Development Service to undertake a programme of archaeological recording within the grounds of Batley Parish Church, Batley, West Yorkshire (hereafter 'the Site').
- 1.1.2 This programme of archaeological recording was requested as a condition of Faculty approval issued by the Diocese of Wakefield for alterations within the grounds of Batley Parish Church and conformed to a methodology in a Written Scheme of Investigation produced by Wessex Archaeology and approved by the Diocese Archaeological Advisor.
- 1.1.3 The recording took the form of a gravestone survey prior to the construction works and an archaeological watching brief during all groundworks.

1.2 The Site, Location and Geology

- 1.1.4 Batley lies about 2km north of Dewsbury in West Yorkshire. The Site (centred on NGR SE 241 244) is located between Stocks Lane (the B6123) and Branch Road to the north of the town centre (**Figure 1**).
- 1.1.5 The Site comprises the former graveyard of Batley Parish Church (a Grade I Listed Building: no. 51245), which is now a public open space maintained by Kirklees Council. The Site is grassed and includes numerous mature trees. A path from Stocks Lane to Branch Road, which crosses the Site to the south of the church, was the primary focus of the works.
- 1.1.6 The underlying geology of the Site comprises Emley Rock Sandstone of the Lower Coal Measures (British Geological Survey 1:50,000) and the church grounds lie at approximately 63m above Ordnance Datum.

1.3 Archaeological and Historical Background

- 1.1.7 Batley appears in the Domesday Book of AD1086 as *Bateleia* or *Bathelie*, where it is recorded as a *vill* with a church in the ownership of Ilbert de Lacy. Following the Norman conquest Ilbert de Lacy was granted over 200 manors (in modern Yorkshire) which formed the Honour of Pontefract (Roberts 2002). As Batley lies in the 'West Part' of the honour it was probably administered from the motte and bailey castle at Almondbury.
- 1.1.8 The de Lacy's retained their estates through the 11th, 12th and 13th centuries but in the early 14th century the estate was surrendered to the Crown and granted to the House of Lancaster (*op. cit.*). Batley lay partly in the Wapentakes of Morley and Agbrigg and was of some significance in the area, being both a Township and Parish.
- 1.1.9 All Saints church contains the only known surviving remains of medieval Batley. The dates of the fabric of the church differ slightly between sources:



The English Heritage listing (compiled in 1963) describes the earliest fabric as 13th century but a more recent study of medieval churches in West Yorkshire identified specific elements of the building as 12th century (Ryder 1993). It is also possible, particularly given Batley's status as a Parish, that a church may have existed on this site prior to the Norman Conquest.

- 1.1.10 Ryder's survey identifies 'well-squared stonework' in the lower part of All Saints' tower and 'thick pieces of wall at the end of the late medieval nave arcades' as 12th century constructions, and the south arcade and chancel arch as 14th century (*op. cit.*, 30, 36). The listing description and Ryder agree that the rest of the church was built in the late 15th century possibly under the patronage of Sir William and Lady Anne Mirfield who are commemorated with alabaster effigies on a tomb in the Mirfield Chapel on the northern side of the church.
- 1.1.11 The church was restored in 1872-3 by Walter Hanstock but 'escaped the Victorian era relatively lightly' (Ryder 1993, 141). The graveyard contains 18th- and 19th-century memorials and was presumably used for burials until Batley's municipal cemetery opened in 1865.

1.2 Improvement Works

- 1.3.1 The improvement works by Kirklees Council included:
 - Lifting the gravestones that form the main footpath through the church grounds and laying a new flagstone path;
 - Lifting the gravestones that form the vehicular access from Stocks Lane to upgrading the vehicular access surface and create a turning head adjacent to the church;
 - Lifting and re-laying the concrete and flag footpaths on the southern side of the church:
 - Re-laying complete gravestones to the side of the new path;
 - Installation of floodlights and,
 - Tree planting.

1.4 Best Practice

1.4.1 The archaeological recording was conducted in compliance with the Institute for Archaeologists' *Standards and Guidance for an Archaeological Watching Brief* (Revised 2008). Finds were treated in accordance with the relevant guidance given by the IfA (2008b), the UK Institute of Conservators Guidelines *Conservation Guideline No 2* (1990) and the Museums and Galleries Commissions *Standards in the Museum Care of Archaeological Collections* (1992).



2 GRAVESTONE SURVEY

2.1 Introduction

2.1.1 The existing footpaths and vehicular access through the church grounds were constructed from headstones and tombstones that had previously marked the positions of graves. These stones were to be moved during the renewal of the paths and although the stones were not in their original positions or marking burials, a gravestone survey was required in order that the new location of any stone could be traced.

2.2 Aims

- 2.2.1 The aims of the gravestone survey were:
 - To record the location, position within the path, condition and any legible inscriptions/decorations/mason's marks on the gravestones that currently form the main path;
 - To map the new positions of re-located gravestones; and
 - To prepare documentation and plans that will allow the new positions of the gravestones to be identified.

2.3 Methodology

- 2.3.1 Prior to any development works taking place, the current locations of gravestones in the paths were recorded. The recording was undertaken between 30th and 31st September 2010.
- 2.3.2 The survey recorded the length of the main path that was to be replaced, locating the 144 gravestones with a Leica Viva series GNSS unit combined with a photographic survey.
- 2.3.3 Each stone was allocated a unique number and examined *in situ*, and a record of stone condition, decorations, edge treatment and mason's marks was made on *pro forma* sheets. Inscriptions were subsequently transcribed and added to the sheets. Where inscription text was not clearly legible, '...' was used to denote unreadable text, whilst text in brackets indicates the likely readings.
- 2.3.4 Lifted gravestones that could not be re-laid immediately were numbered and placed on pallets for temporary off-site storage. Wherever possible the lifted gravestones were re-located along the sides of the new path, whilst highly fragmented stones were retained for burial within the Site.
- 2.3.5 The new locations of the stones were mapped and cross-referenced to their original positions.

2.4 Results

Introduction

2.4.1 The location of the gravestones prior to the groundworks is shown on **Figure 2**, with their new locations shown on **Figure 3**. A gazetteer, with a separate entry for each gravestone, including photographs and transcriptions, is included within **Section 4** of this report.



- 2.4.2 Following discussions between Kirklees Council and the Church, a low area in the north-eastern corner of the Site was identified as the burial location for fragmented gravestones (shown on **Figure 3**).
- 2.4.3 For clarity the gravestone ID numbers are shown in bold type in square brackets in sections 2.4.4 to 2.4.10 below.

Condition

- 2.4.4 The majority of the stones recorded had some form of wear, usually granular erosion produced as a result of their use within a public thoroughfare.
- 2.4.5 It appeared that many gravestones had been cut to size during the construction of the existing paths, with additional breaks clearly having occurred whilst *in situ*. The path at the west side was particularly badly affected due to the passage of vehicles needing to approach the church.

Dates

2.4.6 The majority of stones date from 1750-1850, although securely dated stones range in date from 1687[80] to 1865[11]. Other stones may represent earlier dates, however the extent of wear prohibited an accurate reading, e.g. 16(?3)1[133].

Style


- 2.4.7 All the stones were rectangular, possibly as a result of their selection for use within the pavement, rather than a reflection of the distribution of gravestone shapes within the original graveyard.
- 2.4.8 Five stones were identified as Kirkless Heartstones: ...85[54], 1705[53], 1687[80],[83], and 16(?3)1[133]. These are distinctive and highly decorative headstones bearing a band on which are recorded the year of death and the deceased's initials, divided by a heart.
- 2.4.9 Several stylistic elements recur with enough similarity to suggest stock designs:
 - **Decorative Celtic word 'HERE', or initial 'H'** on 18 stones: 1732[4], 1715[5], 1769[9], 1777[20], 1741[47], 1740[57], 1752[60], 1746[61], 177(?4)[69], 1732[74], 1748[76], 17..[77], 1736[87], 17(?3)9[90], 1749[91], 1738[117], 1746[121], 1748[136]
 - **Pillar, arch and winged souls** (also with decorative Celtic 'HERE' or 'H') on 4 stones:

1710[**3**], 1736[**64**], 1722[**68**], 1728[**71**]

Mason's Marks

2.4.10 Only one mason's mark was encountered, on stone [142] reading: 'S. Hepworth'.

4 WATCHING BRIEF

4.1 Introduction

4.1.1 The archaeological watching brief was undertaken during groundworks carried out between 5th April 2011 and 11th January 2012.

4.2 Aims

- 4.2.1 The aims of the archaeological watching brief were:
 - To monitor all groundworks in order to identify and record any archaeological remains that might be disturbed;
 - To record, as far as is reasonably possible, the location, extent, date, character, condition, significance and quality of any surviving archaeological remains observed.
 - To collate the results of the watching brief, including all necessary analyses, and to prepare a report.

4.3 Methodology

- 4.3.1 An archaeologist was present on site during all ground investigations in order to observe each area during excavation and, where possible, examine the surface and sections after excavation. Where archaeological remains were thought to be present the area was be rapidly cleaned with features hand-excavated and recorded.
- 4.3.2 The extent, depth and nature of all groundworks within the Site were recorded. Archaeological remains were recorded using Wessex Archaeology's *pro forma* recording system. A full photographic record was maintained using both colour transparencies and black and white negatives (on 35mm film), supplemented with digital images.
- 4.3.3 The lifted gravestones were examined and the *pro forma* gravestone survey sheets were enhanced with additional observations. Where human remains were discovered, they were recorded *in situ*, then covered, protected and reburied. Where fragmentary bones were disturbed, the remains were collected and reburied on site. No human remains were removed from Site.
- 4.3.4 Recovered artefacts were recorded by context, washed, weighed, counted and identified by specialists. All finds were treated in accordance with relevant industry guidance (Institute for Archaeologists 2007, 2008b; English Heritage 2005; Neal & Watkinson 1998).

4.4 Results

Introduction

- 4.4.1 The following ground works were monitored:
 - Works associated with laying an electrical cable and the installation of fixed floodlights (Plates 1-2);
 - The excavation of 13 pits for planting trees (**Plate 3**);
 - Works to the path west from the church to Stocks Lane (**Plate 4**);
 - Works to the path east from the church to Branch Road (**Plates 5-6**);
 - The re-laying of stones in the paved area to the south of the church.



4.4.2 The following section provides a summary of the information held in the Site archive. Observed features and contexts for each monitored area are tabulated as **Appendix 1**. Archaeological features, and the extent of the monitored areas, are shown on **Figures 4-5**.

Site stratigraphy

- 4.4.3 The monitored groundworks were all excavated to no greater depth than 0.5m. Upper deposits across the Site were observed to comprise dark loamy topsoil (contexts **101** and **200**) over sandy clay subsoil with occasional sandstone fragments (contexts **102** and **201**; **Plate 7**).
- 4.4.4 The stones and gravestones of the path were laid on patchy levelling deposits of imported clinker (context **119** and **234**), corresponding to the creation of the path, and sand and clay (context **202**) from subsequent intermittent re-levelling.
- 4.4.5 The western drive from the church to Stocks Lane appeared to have been widened with a central deposit, indicating its original width (context **108**). A portion of edging was observed *in situ* at the eastern end of the drive, although nothing else remained to indicate the nature of the earlier path's construction.
- 4.4.6 A narrow linear band of coarse sandstone gravel (context **236**) was observed following the line of the east path. This feature was not investigated as it lay beneath the target level of the groundworks, but likely corresponded to a service trench.

Tombs and gravestones

- 4.4.7 Fragments of tombs and gravestones were encountered during the groundworks. These included:
 - several large fragments of masonry with moulded edges recovered from the cable trench east of the church (**Plates 8-10**);
 - a disturbed plain edge fragment of a tomb or gravestone beneath the path to the west of the church (context **106**; **Plate 11**);
 - and an *in situ* feature to the west of the church comprising two parallel rows of handmade red bricks (context **103**; **Plate 12**).
- 4.4.8 A fragmented 'heart stone' was uncovered at the western end of the west drive (**Plate 13**). The stone was broken into two and had substantial granular erosion making much of the stone unreadable. Centred on the stone was a large Celtic-knot style heart with the letter 'O' to the left and 'S' to the right.
- 4.4.9 A number of the stones used within the path appeared to have originated from tombs, although none of them bore any ornamentation. One stone used within the paving south of the church was found to have been cut down and placed upside down (**Plate 14**).

Burials

4.4.10 The lowering of levels to the side of the path at its eastern end uncovered 14 grave cuts arranged in five rows (contexts **205-232**; **Plates 15-16**). The grave cuts were roughly coffin shaped, and orientated NWW-SEE with their thinner end, corresponding to the foot of the grave, pointing east. Whilst the



- size of the graves varied, the majority were around 2m in length; three graves were around 1.50m in length (contexts **221**, **223** and **229**) and were probably those of children.
- 4.4.11 Whilst no grave cuts were observed further west, this was the result of poor visibility due to the remaining depth of topsoil, rather than indicating the absence of graves in that area.

Finds

- 4.4.12 A number of finds were recorded during the watching brief, comprising disarticulated human bones and a small assemblage of 19th and 20th century ceramics from levelling layers beneath the path (contexts **202** and **234**).
- 4.4.13 The finds are summarised in **Table 1** below. No further analysis is warranted for any of the components of this assemblage. Given the date-range of the finds recovered, and the quantities represented, retention for long-term curation is not recommended.

Human remains

- 4.4.14 Disarticulated human bones were identified in the topsoil (context **101**) around the northeast floodlight foundation and a levelling deposit (context **108**) within the western path (**Plate 17**).
- 4.4.15 Four skulls and a disarticulated bone were also recorded *in situ* within deposit **108** beneath the western path from the church (**Plates 18-20**). All of the bones were in a fragmentary state and no evidence of grave cuts was observed. It is likely that the remains had been incorporated into the deposits beneath the path during previous renovations.
- 4.4.16 One group of remains (context 112; Plate 21) within subsoil deposit 102 comprised a skull, fragments of both left and right humeri, and a fragment of the right scapular. This arrangement suggests redeposition following the truncation of the upper half of a skeleton during previous groundworks.
- 4.4.17 No human remains were removed from the site but recorded *in situ* and reburied. Where disarticulated bones within the topsoil and subsoil were disturbed by the ground works, they were reburied on Site at a greater depth.



5 CONCLUSIONS

5.1 Summary of Results

- 5.1.1 A gravestone survey was carried out before the commencement of groundworks at Batley Parish Church. The gravestone paths were surveyed, photographed and recorded in order to compile a detailed plan of the location of gravestones prior to the improvement works.
- 5.1.2 A watching brief was maintained during all groundworks in the former graveyard. The lifting of the gravestones provided an opportunity to enhance the gravestone survey records and all archaeological deposits and features were recorded. The outlines of 14 graves were identified beneath the path on the eastern side of the church but the burials were not disturbed by the works. To the west of the church a greater level of previous disturbance was identified; disarticulated bones were observed in the levelling deposits beneath the drive indicating that some burial had been disturbed during earlier groundworks. These remains were left in situ or reburied elsewhere on site.
- 5.1.3 Where possible, the gravestones removed from the paths and drive were relayed adjacent to the new path and the new locations were recorded and cross-referenced onto the gravestone survey records. Fragmented stones could not be re-layed and were buried within the former churchyard.
- 5.1.4 A small assemblage of modern, unstratified finds was recovered but was not found to be archaeologically significant.
- 5.1.5 This report provides a full record of the burial monuments that were affected by the recent groundworks, including photographs and transcriptions of individual gravestones, and plans showing the location of the gravestones prior to, and following, the path improvement works.

6 ARCHIVE

6.1 Preparation

6.1.1 The project archive, consisting of all primary written documents, plans, sections, photographs, and electronic data, will be prepared by Wessex Archaeology staff in accordance with the requirements of the repository archive and in line with guidelines published by the United Kingdom Institute for Conservation (1990) and the Museums and Galleries Commission (1992).

6.2 Deposition

6.2.1 It is anticipated that the site archive (including a copy of this report) will be deposited with the West Yorkshire Archive Service. Until such time the archive will be kept at the Sheffield office of Wessex Archaeology.



6.3 Dissemination of Results

- 6.3.1 A copy of this report will be supplied to Kirklees Council and additional copies will be provided to Batley Parish Church, the West Yorkshire Archaeological Advisory Service and the Diocese Advisory Committee.
- 6.3.2 An OASIS form will be completed at the conclusion of the project, http://ads.ahds.ac.uk/project/oasis/, for inclusion in the ADS database.



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







