## SUMMARY OF FIELDWORK RESULTS:

An archaeological evaluation, consisting of a single trench, was carried out on the site of a small residential development to the rear of 14 High Street, Southminster, Essex. The site was formerly a garden with semi-mature trees along the northern edge. The south, east and west sides of the development area were demarcated by property boundaries while to the north were allotments.

The trench showed that there was approximately 0.3m of modern topsoil on top of 0.3m of dark brown silty sandy subsoil. The approximate depth to the undisturbed natural, mid brown sandy gravel, was 0.6m. No archaeological remains were identified. No finds were collected and no environmental samples taken. It seems likely that no significant archaeological remains exist within the site boundaries, despite the frontage buildings being 16th century in origin and the development area being within the projected Saxon and medieval settlement.




Fig.1. Location plan
