Synopsis:

In response to an archaeological condition placed on the planning permission for the construction of retirement apartments on the above site, the Heritage Network was commissioned by the developers to fulfil the planning authority's requirements on their behalf. The commission extended to the clearance of a post-medieval and Victorian burial ground under the terms of a licence issued by the Home Office under the Disused Burial Grounds (Amendment) Act 1981.

A desk-based archaeological assessment of the site carried out by the Heritage Network in September 2002 demonstrated that the site held a low potential for the preservation of archaeological remains from the prehistoric and Roman periods, but a more significant potential for preservation from the Anglo-Saxon period onwards. A burial ground, associated with the Congregational Chapel that formerly occupied the site, was believed to have been largely cleared in the late 1960s, before the construction of a modern office block.

An archaeological evaluation carried out by the Heritage Network in August 2004 demonstrated that a number of post-medieval and Victorian burials survived intact across the site. In addition, the presence of sherds of 8th to 14th century pottery, in residual contexts, confirmed that there was late Saxon and medieval activity in the vicinity of the site, although no features attributable to these periods were identified.

The present programme of archaeological monitoring and recording was carried out intermittently between November 2004 and July 2005. No archaeological features or deposits pre-dating the post-medieval period were identified. However, in the course of the project, a total of 276 graves from the post-medieval burial ground were identified and recorded. These included 1 vault, 43 brick graves, and 232 simple inhumations. From these graves the remains of 344 individuals were exhumed, including 2 from the vault, 47 from brick graves, and 8 which had been interred in lead coffins. In addition, a communal grave that was created following the earlier clearance of the site, was found to contain the disarticulated remains of approximately 45 individuals, and a further two individuals contained in lead coffins.

A number of the graves had identifying inscriptions, the earliest of which dates to 1775 and was located in the north-west corner of the burial ground. The remaining inscriptions span the period from 1828 to 1864. Those which were readable demonstrate an age range for the individuals between 3 and 85 years, although at least one burial appeared to be that of a new born baby. Most of the later burials were located in a strip 11m wide on the south side of the site, which represents an extension to the cemetery dating to the 1820s.

All the investigation, recording and exhumation works were undertaken by Heritage Network staff in association with specialists from BGS UK Ltd. The work was carried out with due regard to the health, safety and welfare of individuals working on site and of the general public, under the supervision of the local authority's Environmental Health Officer. All the exhumed remains have been reburied in Hitchin's municipal cemetery located in St John's Road, with the agreement of the minister from Christ Church, Hitchin, as the successor to the Queen Street Congregational Chapel.

1. Introduction

1.1 This report has been prepared on behalf of *Pegasus Retirement Homes Ltd*, as part of a programme of archaeological work associated with the development of land at 43 Queen Street, Hitchin, Herts. The planning permission for the development (ref. 01/01092/1), granted by the North Hertfordshire District Council (NHDC), has been subject to a standard archaeological condition, in accordance with the provisions of the Department of the Environment's *Planning Policy Guidance Note 16* (PPG16). The scope of the required work followed the model *Design Brief for Archaeological Monitoring and Recording* issued by the *County Archaeology Office* (CAO) of Hertfordshire County Council, acting as advisers to NHDC, with specific provisions outlined in correspondence from the CAO dated 5/10/2004 (ref. JGS/01/1092-4). A full specification for the programme of archaeological works was contained in the Heritage Network's approved Project Design dated November 2004.

1.2 The study area is located on the south-eastern edge of the historic core of the town, centred on NGR TL 18125 28837 (Figure 1). It is bounded by Queen Street on the west, the Hitchin British Schools Museum complex (41-42 Queen Street) on the north, Storehouse Lane on the east, and Cannon House and Hazeldene on the south. The redevelopment involves the construction of retirement apartments.

1.3 A desk-based archaeological assessment of the site carried out by the Heritage Network in September 2002 demonstrated that the site held a low potential for the preservation of archaeological remains from the prehistoric and Roman periods, and a more significant potential for preservation from the Anglo-Saxon period onwards. The site may lie within the cemetery zone of the recently identified Anglo-Saxon settlement area to the north, and also lies within a post-medieval burial ground which is believed to have been partially cleared in the late 1960s under the guidance of Mr H.C. Jenkins (Ashworth, 2002).

1.4 An evaluation of the site was carried out by the Heritage Network in August 2004. The aim of the evaluation was to consider the location, extent, date, character, condition, significance and quality of any remains that are liable to be threatened by the development, and to provide a local and regional, archaeological and historical context for any such remains, in accordance with the current published regional research agenda (Glazebrook 1997, Brown and Glazebrook 2000), if they were discovered.

1.5 The results of the fieldwork indicated that the site had been significantly disturbed between the post-medieval period and the present not only by the post-medieval cemetery but also by modern construction, and by service pipes at the front of the site. However, residual fragments of Anglo-Saxon and medieval pottery were recovered. The evaluation clearly demonstrated the presence of intact post-medieval burials on the site, confirming that the clearance of the burials in the 1960s was not complete.

1.6 On the basis of the results of the advance works, the present project had two principal aims:

- to record and remove all post-medieval and Victorian human remains in accordance with the licence issued by the Home Office under the Disused Burial Grounds (Amendment) Act 1981;

- to identify and record any archaeological features and deposits which might be uncovered and retrieve artefactual and ecofactual elements which would allow the date, character, and significance of the site to be assessed in accordance with the current published regional research agenda (Glazebrook 1997, Brown and Glazebrook 2000), subject to the limitations of reasonable safety and practicality.

1.7 The present report is intended to complete the record of the project, and, together with the re-interment of the remains recovered, the publication of a note recording the results of the project in *Hertfordshire's Past and Present*, and the deposition of the site archive with the North Hertfordshire Museum Service, to complete the requirements of the planning condition.

2. Site Narrative

TOPOGRAPHY AND GEOLOGY

2.1 Hitchin lies in the valley of the River Hiz, with the land rising on both eastern and western sides of the river. Both Windmill Hill, on the eastern side of the town, and West Hill, opposite it, rise to heights of approximately 90m AOD.

2.2 The town lies in the centre of the Hitchin Gap, a glacially derived deep cutting. The solid geology is Lower Chalk, with a deep drift covering of fluvio-glacial sands and gravels of the Anglian phase of the Quaternary period. The chalk bedrock is present at considerable depths below the fluvio-glacial deposits. Locally the soils are derived from the St Albans Association and comprise a brown earth derived from the underlying sands and gravels.

2.3 The present site lies on the east side of the Hiz valley on ground rising from 66.65m AOD on the street frontage, to 74.50m AOD on the boundary with Storehouse Lane. The underlying geology across the site is predominantly sand.

SITE BACKGROUND

2.4 A desk-based archaeological assessment of the site was undertaken by the Heritage Network in 2002 (Ashworth, 2002). This demonstrated that the site had a moderate potential for the preservation of archaeological remains from the Anglo-Saxon period onwards. The assessment also showed that the site had been previously occupied by an Independent Meeting House (later recorded as a Congregational Chapel) and its associated burial ground. It was considered likely that the use of the southern part of the site as a graveyard, and its subsequent clearance in the late 1960s, would have removed any earlier archaeological evidence from substantial parts of the site. The reported discovery of undisturbed human remains during the construction of Sodexo House suggested that the clearance of the post-medieval cemetery was limited and it was therefore considered likely that further intact burials would survive on the site.

2.5 As part of the subsequent evaluation of the site, four trenches were dug to form a sample of approximately 3.5% of the affected area. The three trenches, which lay within the boundary of the former graveyard, revealed at least 27 undisturbed grave cuts and 1 brick grave, clearly indicating that the original clearance of the site had not been carried out thoroughly.

METHODOLOGY

2.6 Although it had been intended that the archaeological work would be carried out alongside the construction programme, for reasons of practicality it was decided that all the archaeological clearance would take place in advance of the principal groundworks. Because it was not possible to remove the spoil from the site, the site was divided into blocks of varying sizes, which were cleared and subsequently backfilled in sequence.

2.7 The fieldwork was carried out in two phases, with the bulk of it being carried out between November 2004 and January 2005. The remaining work, a narrow strip on the

southern side of the site, was completed in June 2005, once the southern boundary wall had been removed and piling put in place which allowed deep excavation to be carried out safely at the very edge of the site.

2.8 The machining was carried out under close archaeological supervision with a wheeled 360° excavator fitted with a 1.5m toothless bucket. Works started in the south-east corner of the site and continued systematically in a north-easterly direction, before progressing down the site towards the street frontage..

2.9 Once grave cuts had been identified, they were investigated rapidly to ascertain the depth of the remains, and then excavated using trowels and hand shovels. Each grave and its contents were recorded, and the human remains and any personal items and coffin furniture were then boxed for reburial.

2.10 All work was carried out in accordance with the Heritage Network's approved *Project Design*, the Home Office licence issued under the Disused Burial Grounds (Amendment) Act 1981, current health and safety legislation, and IFA standards. The work was carried out under the supervision of the Environmental Health officer of NHDC, and the services of exhumation specialists, BGS UK Ltd, were retained to manage the opening of any sealed brick graves, and the safe removal of any remains, including lead coffins, where a potential health hazard had been identified.

MEDIEVAL AND EARLIER REMAINS

2.11 Although some fragments of Anglo-Saxon pottery were recovered in the course the evaluation of the present site (Saunders, 2004), and Anglo-Saxon remains were identified on the Jeeves Yard development to the north (Davis, 2001), no archaeological features or deposits which predate the use of the site as a burial ground were encountered during the current phase of work. It is possible that the intensive use of the site between the 17th and 19th centuries destroyed earlier remains, or that the material recovered during the evaluation was redeposited from elsewhere in the vicinity.

BUILDINGS

2.12 Documentary evidence shows that the original Independent Meeting House was erected on the site in 1690. The burial ground, which was established to the south, continued in use until the late 19th century. In 1853, the congregation resolved to build a new chapel to the east, and the old building was converted to a schoolroom. In 1869, however, it was demolished, and new schoolrooms were built on to the chapel. These buildings survived until the late 1960s. A photograph of the original meeting house forms part of the Latchmore Collection in Hitchin Museum (Plate 1), but all traces of the building appear to have been destroyed by the later chapel and subsequent office block (Figure 3).

2.13 The remains of the foundations for the later 19th century chapel were recorded on the northern side of the site (Figure 4; Plate 2). The brick built building measured 11.50m in width but only the eastern 16m survived, the remainder having been destroyed by terracing for the footprint of the later office block. Fragments of tin glazed crockery were recovered from the vicinity, bearing the inscription "Congregational Church Hitchin" (Plate 3).

GRAVES

2.14 In the course of clearing the site, a total of 276 graves were identified and the remains of 344 individuals were exhumed (Figure 4; Appendix 1). The remains of five further individuals [36], [40], [44], [46] and [248] were observed and recorded but had to be left *in situ* because they fell both outside the impact area of the development (Figure 2) and well within the canopy of the mature trees bordering the site to the east. Amongst the graves, 43 brick graves were recorded containing a total of 47 individuals, and a single vault was recorded containing 2 individuals (Figure 5). Four complete lead coffins and two fragmentary lead coffins were also removed from the brick graves. The remainder of the graves were inhumations placed directly in the ground, apart from a communal grave located against the southern boundary of the site, which contained the remains of individuals exhumed in the late 1960s, prior to the construction of the later office block.

Brick Graves and Vaults

2.15 The vault (Plates 5 - 8) was of brick construction having a single chamber, measuring approximately 4 x 2.8m (13' x 9'), with a stepped access on the eastern side measuring 1.6 x 2.6m (5'4" x 8'6"). The steps led to an arched opening into the vault itself which was bricked up after the last coffin had been deposited. The inside was painted white in common with many of the brick graves, and there was a shelf on the northern side which would have supported one or more coffins. The vault appeared to have been largely cleared as there were coffin lids and wood debris scattered throughout. Nevertheless, one adult skeleton and other bone fragments were recovered.

2.16 A total of 43 brick graves were recorded containing 47 individuals. It is likely that further brick graves were destroyed in the course of the clearance of the site in the late 1960s, when it appears that only the upper chambers of multi-storeyed family graves were removed.

2.17 Most of the brick graves were of a similar form, measuring approximately 2.52m (8'4") long, and 1.06m (3'6") at the widest point, reducing to 0.71m (2'4") at either end (Plate 9). The height of each chamber was 0.70-0.80m (2'4" - 2'8") and all were white-washed inside. In general, the lower chambers were separated by a slab, with the uppermost chambers having a vaulted brick roof. Uniquely, grave [61] included a slab with an inscription reading "W:W:1830" (Plate 10). All other slabs were blank.

2.18 Variations to the normal pattern include brick grave [87], which had small brick extensions at either end of the main chamber containing infant burials (Plate 11), and brick grave [227], which was built over the vaulted roof of a lower chamber and had a tiled floor (Plate 12).

2.19 Two other structures are notable: contexts [41] and [121]. Both appeared to have been designed to enclose three brick graves side by side, though in the case of structure [41], the centre plot was never used, and in the case of structure [121], the third grave, [129], appears to have been a later extension to the two original graves.

Inhumations

2.20 Most of the cut graves for the inhumations were approximately 1.78m (5'10") in length, and 0.64m (2'1") in width at the head, reducing to 0.49m (1'7") at the feet. Apart from 8 lead coffins and 1 iron coffin, all the other burials were in wooden coffins. At least 9 of the coffins were decorated with copper alloy studs. Three coffins, graves [01], [03] and [65], appeared to have been constructed with planks fitted to square iron hoops, like a square barrel.

2.21 Of the 294 skeletons from simple cut graves, 156 (53%) were in a good state of completeness and either in good or fair condition, though there was no significant correlation between condition and either location or depth of burial (Figures 6 & 8). The most significant factor for the survival of the skeleton appeared to be the presence or absence of a coffin plate (Figure 7; Plate 13). For burials in which a coffin plate had been present, the bones of the upper chest were absent or had almost completely decayed. However, the rest of the skeletal elements were present. Differential preservation within a burial was also observed when copper alloy shroud pins were present. In these cases the survival of shroud fragments and/or hair was common.

Cemetery Clearance

2.22 A report compiled in June 1970 by H.C.Jenkins (HALS NR8/7/22), in association with the clearance of the site, provides a plan of the burial ground with the gravestones numbered (Figure 11), a key to the numbered gravestones, an alphabetical list of burials with headstones (Appendix 6), and a chronological list of all burials without headstones (Appendix 5).

2.23 The remains recovered during the cemetery clearance of the late 1960s are recorded as having been buried in a communal grave close to the southern boundary of the site. This proved to be one of the deepest features excavated with its base located 2.99m below the existing surface. The remains of at least 45 disarticulated individuals were recovered from this location together with a further 2 lead coffins (Plate 14).

2.24 An inscription recovered from one of the lead coffins suggests that it originated in the Wilshere family plot, grave [121]. The other lead coffin almost certainly originated in the upper level of a brick grave or vault, as no lead coffins were found interred.

2.25 The Jenkins report appears to suggest that 84 marked graves were identified and cleared. However, the remains recovered from the communal grave only amount to approximately 45 individuals, leaving a further 39 unaccounted for. The majority of the bones in the communal grave seemed to be in good condition and it may be that less robust remains have not survived. Most of the gravestones appear to have been broken up and reburied during the clearance.

CEMETERY LAYOUT AND DENSITY

2.26 The site plan provided in the Jenkins report of 1970 is only a schematic representation of the relative positions of the graves and is not drawn to scale (Figure 11). Nevertheless, it would appear to indicate that the earliest burials were located in the north-east corner of the site, later extending to the south then the west.

2.27 The majority of brick graves were located in the north-eastern quadrant of the site, clustered around vault [43]. The cut graves were broadly laid out in rows running parallel with the site boundaries. Due to overcrowding, in some parts of the burial ground the established rows appear to have broken down. Intercutting graves are fairly common across the whole site, even the vault being built over an earlier brick grave [104]. Brick graves [63] & [72] were cut on either side of grave [98] leaving incomplete and disarticulated remains (including skull, pelvis and other bone fragments) in the 0.28m gap in between.

2.28 The density of the burials is noticeably greater in the north-western quadrant of the site indicating that space was becoming increasingly scarce at the turn of the 19th century. Undoubtedly as a result of this, the cemetery was extended southwards by 11m, probably in the late 1820s but definitely before 1845, incorporating the adjacent plot to the south. This increased the available space by nearly 500m² and provided space for a further 71 individual burials. Despite the pressure on space in the original burial ground, it remained in use, simultaneously with the southern extension, until 1864. The cemetery was closed well before the extension reached its capacity.

2.29 The depth of burials varied across the site with the shallowest being at the western end of the original plot (Figure 8). Some remodelling of the site is likely to have taken place when Sodexho House was built, c. 1970, with levels at the western end being truncated to allow vehicle access to the rear of the site. Many of the graves at the higher, eastern end of the site are 1.7 to 2m deep suggesting they are at, or close to, their original depth from the surface.

DATING

2.30 Although the graveyard is likely to have been in use from the late 17th century, the earliest marked grave is recorded as dating to 1722 in the Jenkins report. Coffin plates recorded as part of the present project give a date range between 1775 and 1864.

2.31 The Jenkins report indicates an increase in the number of deaths between the late 1830s and the late 1850s. The figures may indicate an ageing congregation or a general increase in the size of the congregation. Alternatively, outbreaks of cholera are known to have been prevalent in Hitchin during that period, and a programme to improve the water supply and sewer construction was instigated in 1849, in response to a report by William Ranger, the London health inspector. A combination of overcrowding and inadequate sanitation caused a high mortality rate which led to part of Queen Street being named Dead Street. The improvement works were completed in 1854.

2.32 A list of unmarked graves from 1837 onwards, compiled from church records for the Jenkins report, contains 141 names (Appendix 5). In the course of the present project, 291 individuals were recorded from, apparently, unmarked graves. It is possible that the balance date to the period between 1690 and 1836. A record of burials between 1786 and 1836 is believed to be held by the National Archives at Kew, but has not been consulted for the present project. A list of marked graves from 1837 onwards is included as Appendix 6.

2.33 The later list, contained in the Jenkins report appears to contain some anomalies. For example, no burials are recorded for a two-year period between 1847 and 1848. Nevertheless, a copper alloy coffin plate, recovered in the course of the present works from grave [152], had

the inscription “James Coleman Died May 13th 1848 Aged 53”. According to the church records, James Coleman died in 1849. The lack of records for this period is explained by a hiatus between incumbents.

2.34 The only other person named in the church records whose burial has been positively identified is Sarah Joiner. She was buried in grave [171], with a coffin plate reading “Sarah Joiner Died 1850 Aged 61 Years”.

ARTEFACTS AND UNUSUAL FEATURES

2.35 A complete inventory of artefacts, including coffin plates and coffin furniture, found in the graves is included as Appendix 2. All artefacts were reinterred with the remains of the individuals with whom they had been buried.

2.36 Evidence of copper alloy shroud pins was found in 19 of the burials. Apart from fragments of shrouds, four burials included buttons, two burials included hair-slides, and a set of spring mounted dentures was recovered from grave [105] (Plate 16). A further set of dentures were observed in the communal grave, [76].

2.37 The occupants of neighbouring graves [145] and [156] had been the subject of a post-mortem craniotomy (Plate 15). This is a process whereby the skull cap is sawn across transversely in order to gain access to the brain as part of the autopsy procedure. The Anatomy Act of 1832 legalised the post-mortem process allowing doctors to dissect donated and unclaimed bodies. Burial [145] was dated to 1849. The precise reason for the craniotomies is unclear but it was around this time that post-mortem findings were first used as evidence in English courts of law.

3. Discussion

3.1 The desk-based assessment of the site at 43 Queen Street, and its subsequent evaluation, suggested that the redevelopment of the site might disturb remains of Anglo-Saxon date, and would certainly encounter post-medieval human remains deposited in the disused burial ground which occupied the site.

3.2 On the basis of this information, the planning consent for the construction of retirement apartments on the site was subject to an archaeological condition requiring the monitoring of all groundworks and the recording and removal of any archaeological remains encountered. Additionally, under the provisions of a licence from the Home Office, issued under the provisions of the Disused Burial Grounds (Amendment) Act 1981, all human remains associated with the former Queen Street Congregational Church burial ground were to be removed from the site with due care and attention to decency, and reinterred without undue delay in an appropriate alternative burial ground.

3.3 The construction methodology required the terracing of the footprint of the new buildings into the natural slope which rises on the east side of Queen Street. As a result of an unforeseen delay in the construction programme, access to the site was made available for the archaeological works in advance of the groundworks. Consequently, the whole site was systematically investigated and largely cleared without disruption to the clients' timetable.

3.4 Although records indicate that the post-medieval burial ground had been cleared in the late 1960s, it quickly became apparent that this clearance had been limited to the removal of grave markers from the site, and those burials which occurred at a limited depth from the surface. In the course of the present project, the remains of at least 349 individuals were recovered, ranging in age from infant to 85 years. Of the total, the remains of approximately 45 individuals were removed from a communal grave established near the southern boundary of the site to accommodate the remains cleared in the late 1960s. Fourteen of the graves occurred within the footprint of the 1970s office block which occupied the northern half of the site, and all but one of these contained human remains.

3.5 The foundations of the 19th century Congregational Chapel were also recorded, beneath the footprint of the 1970s office block in the northern half of the site. No remains of the earlier 17th century Independent Meeting House were encountered.

3.6 No archaeological features or deposits predating the use of the site as a burial ground were encountered. It is assumed that the intensive nature of the site's later use would have destroyed or significantly disturbed any such remains.

3.7 On the completion of the site works, all the human remains, personal items and associated coffin furniture from the burial ground were moved to Hitchin's municipal cemetery in St John's Road and reinterred.

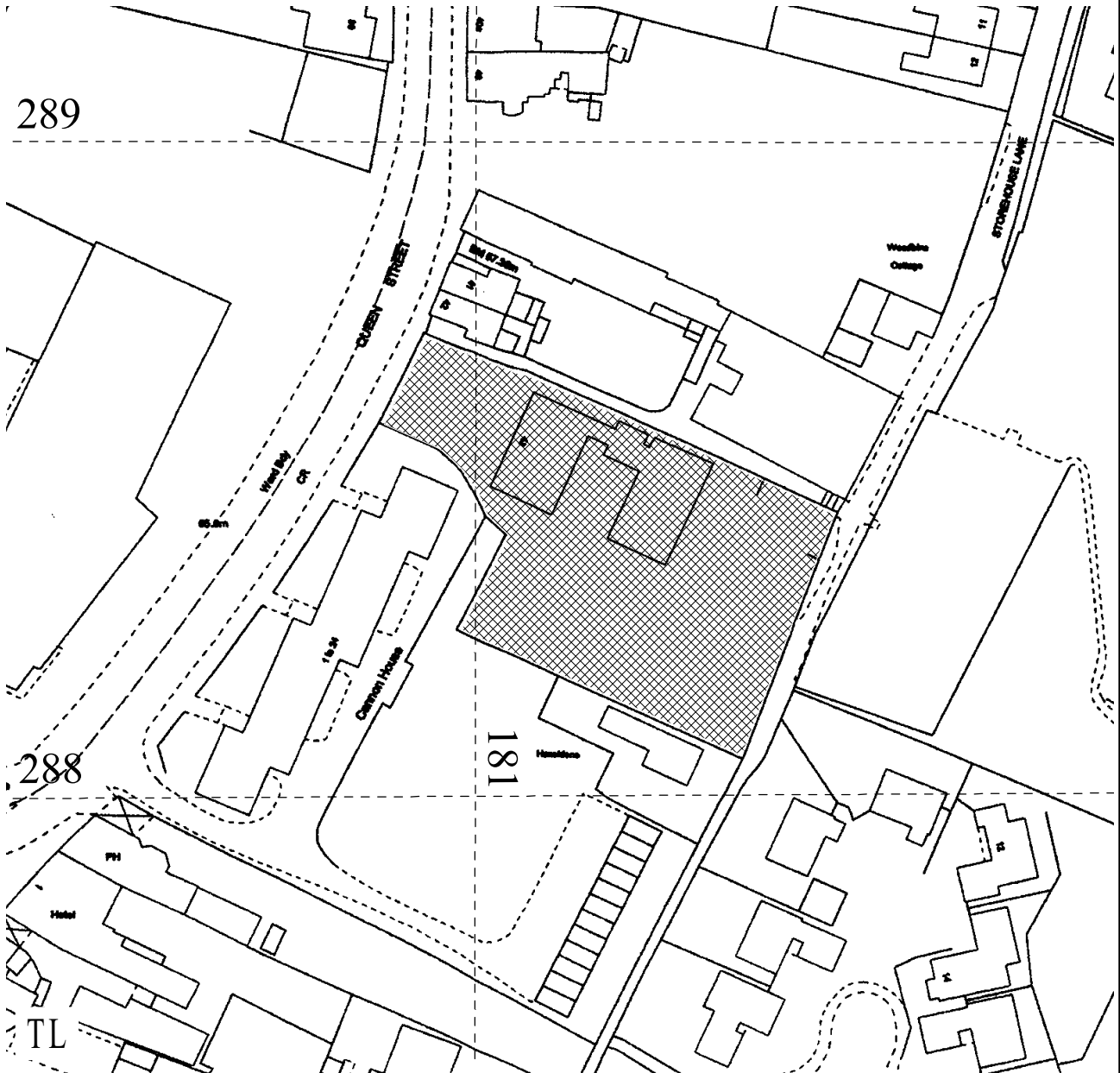
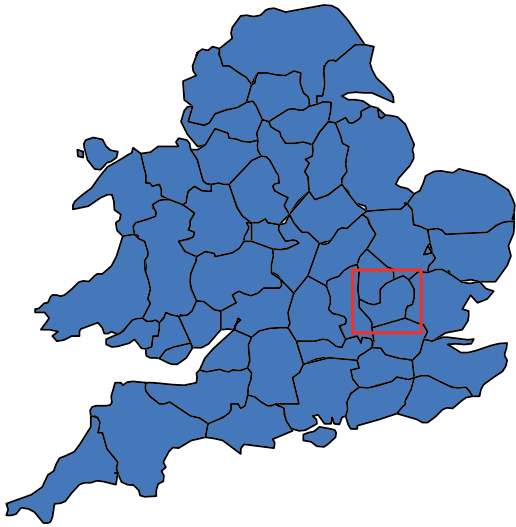

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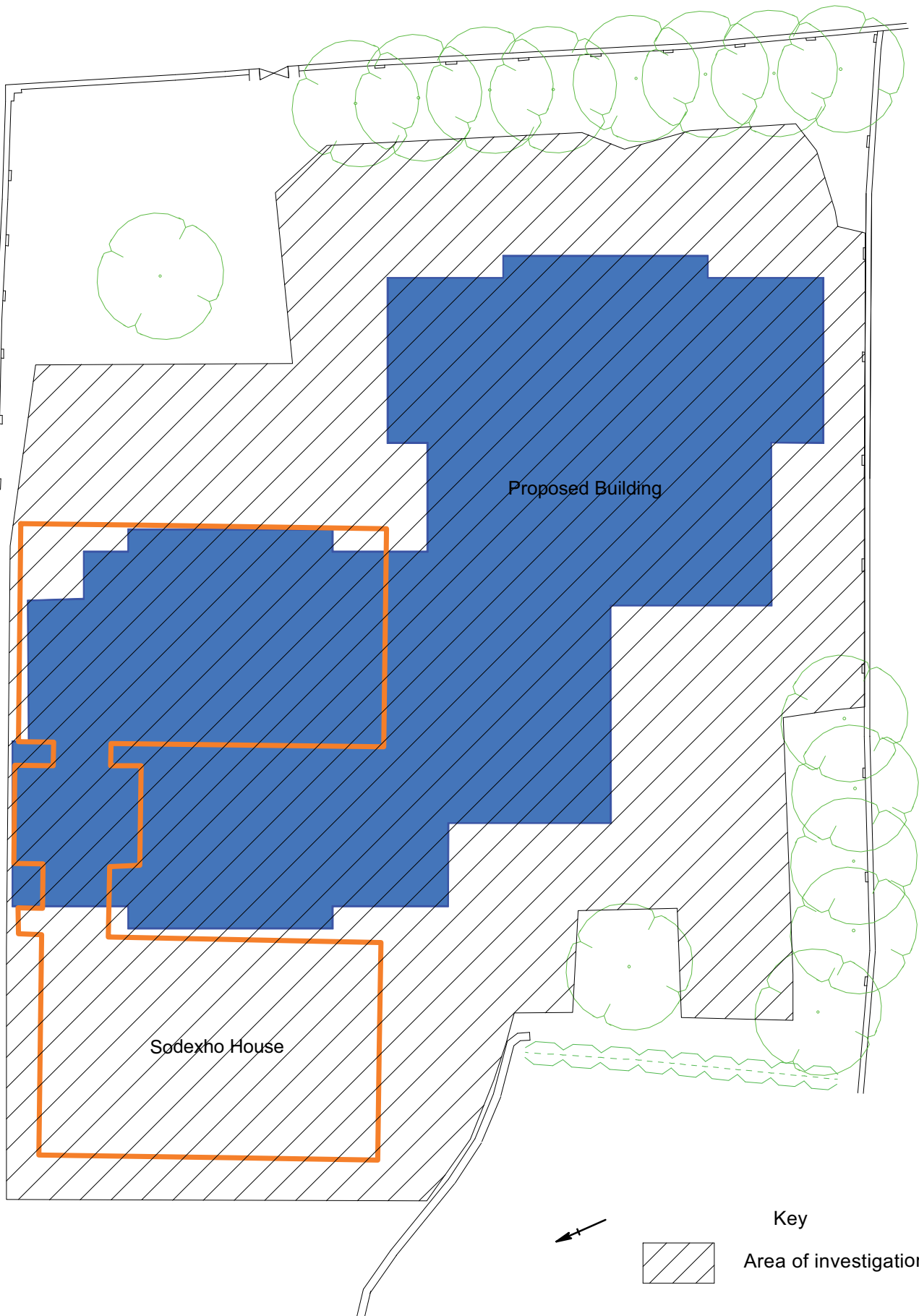


Site Location

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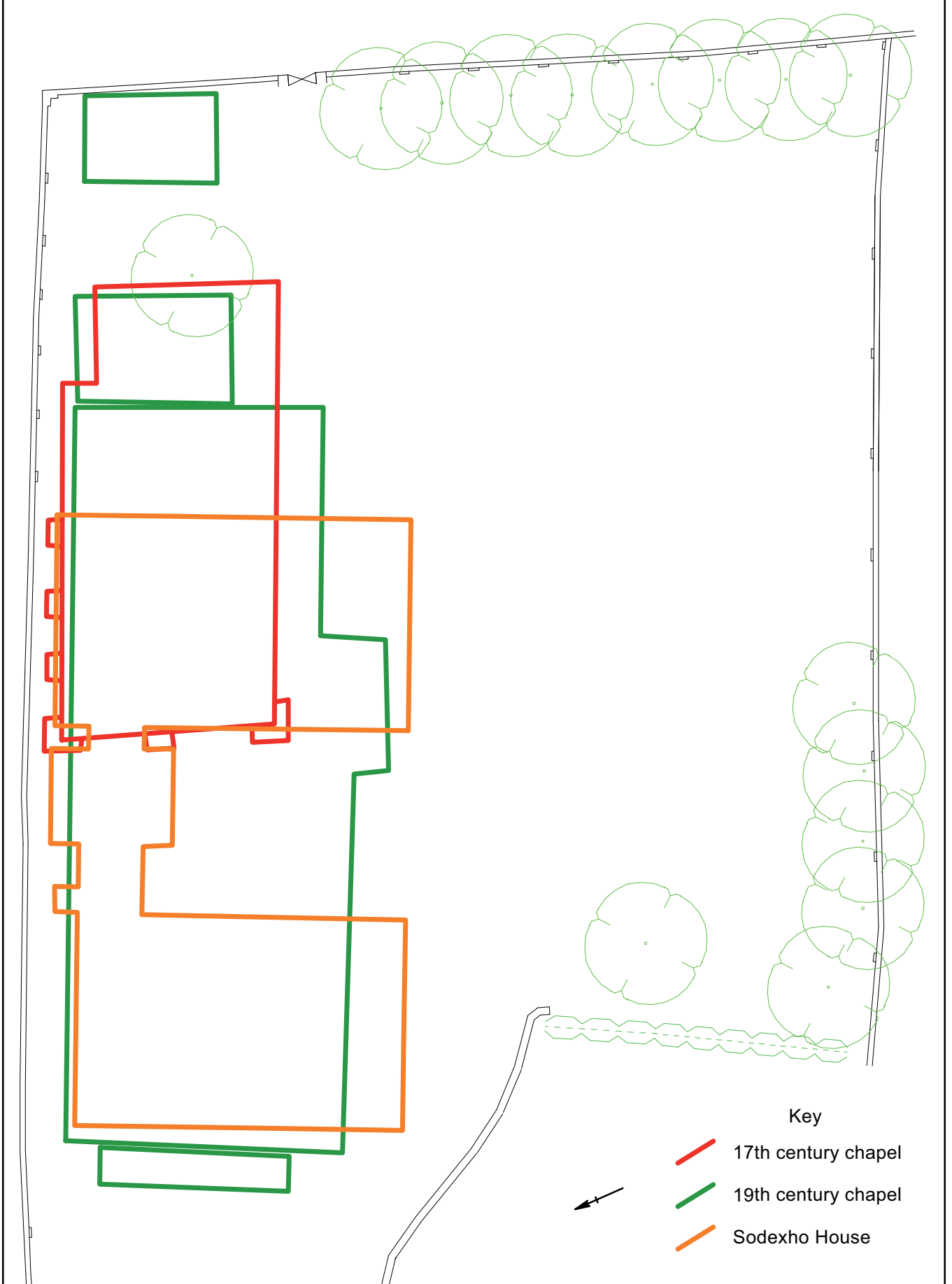

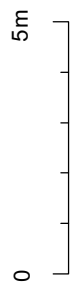

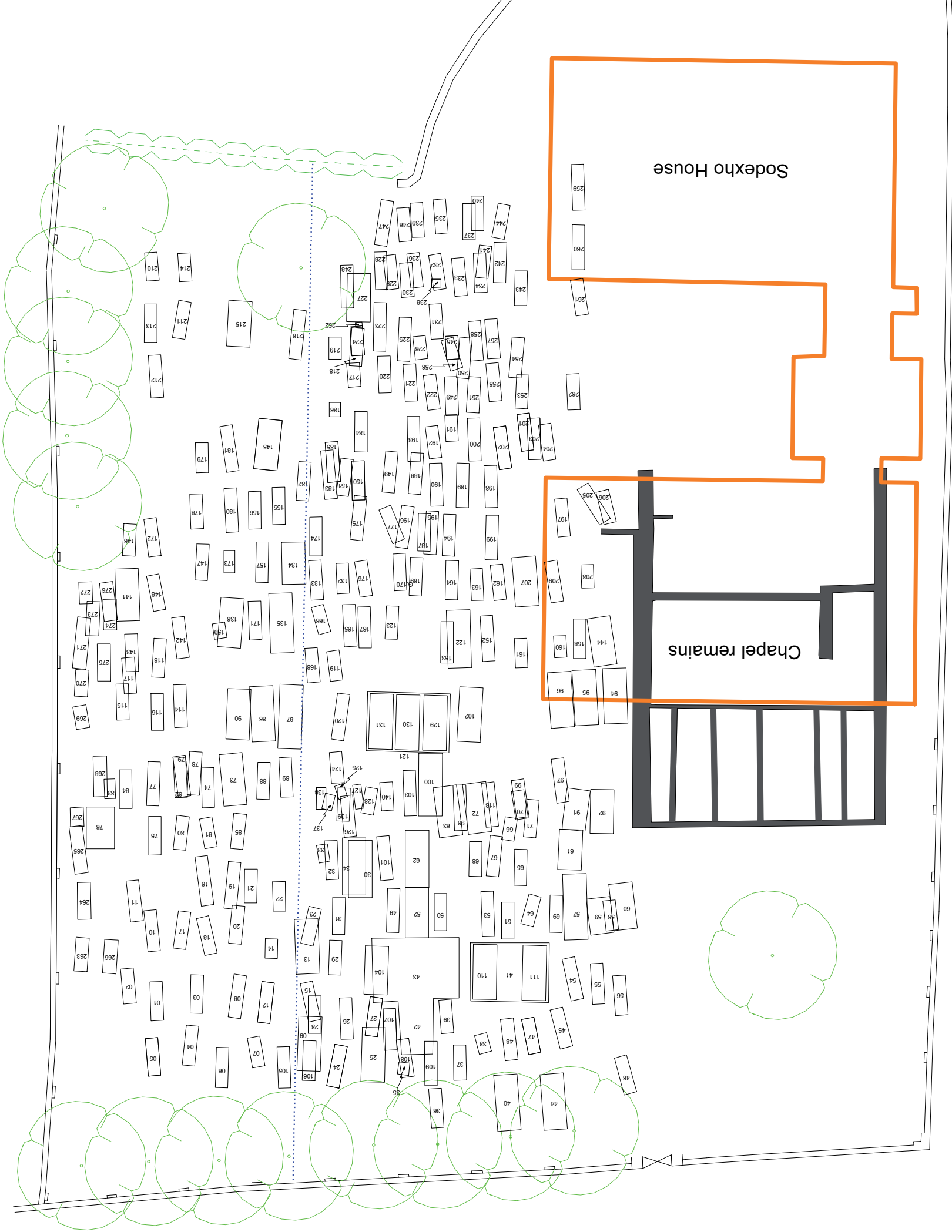
Site Layout

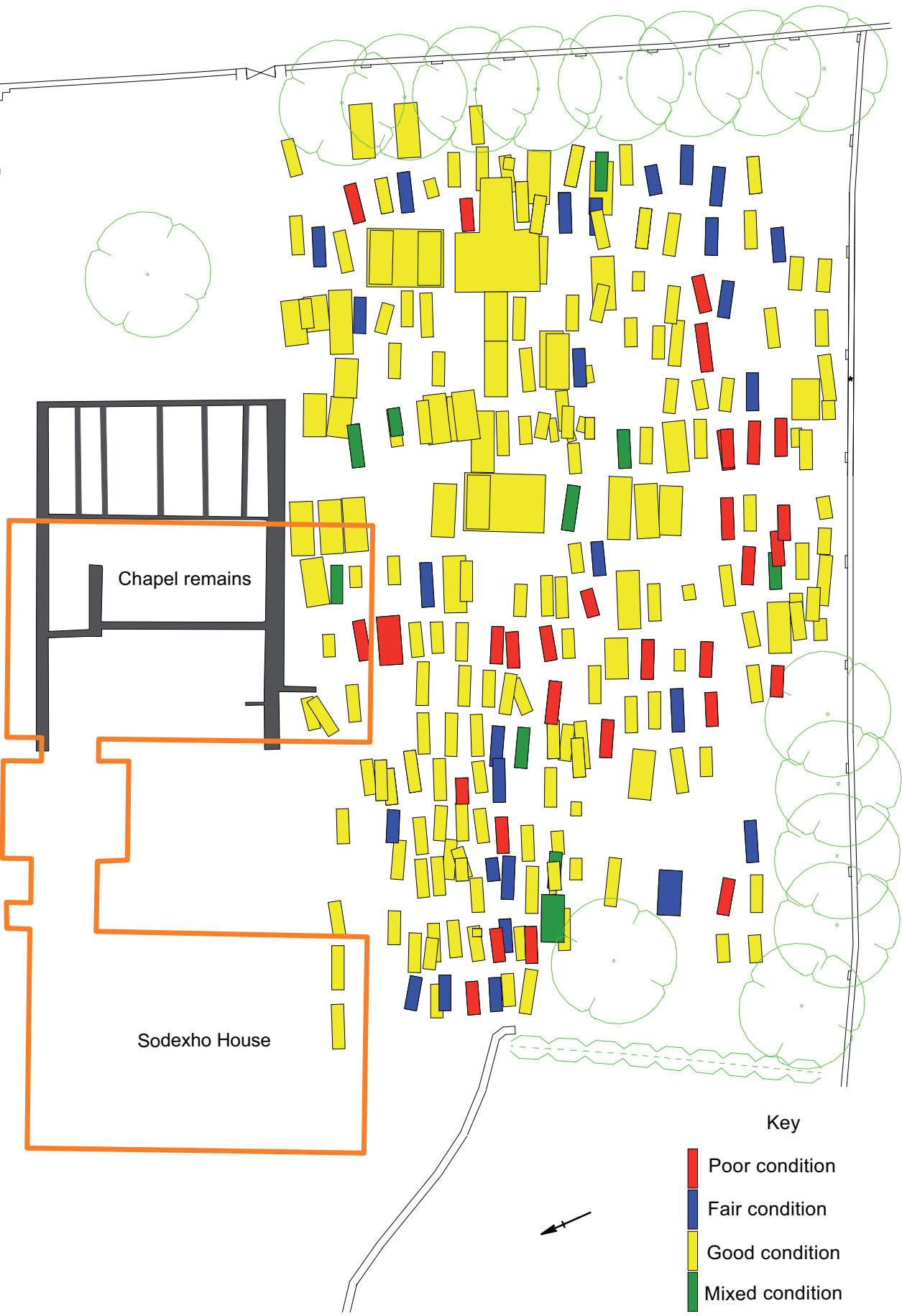

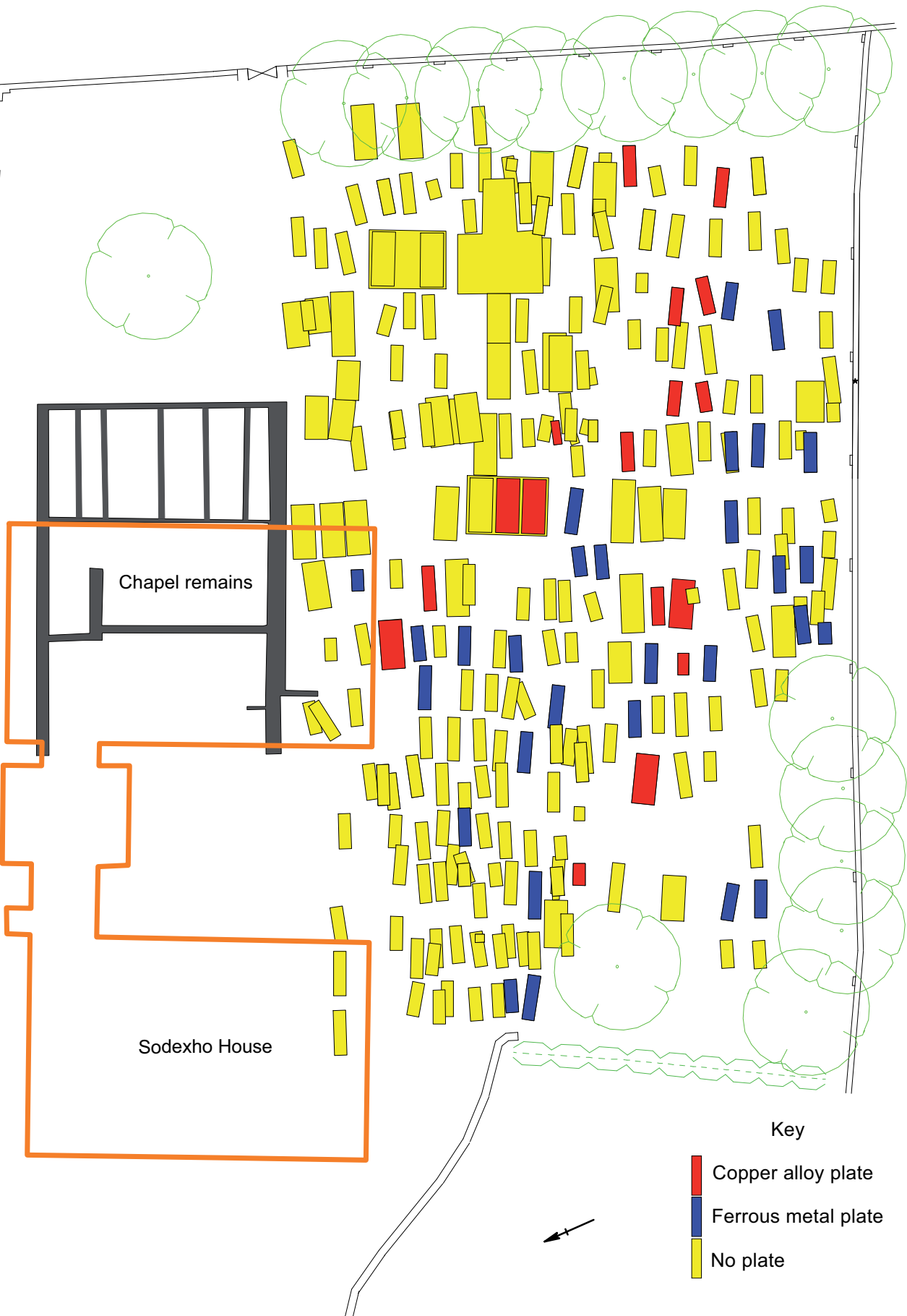

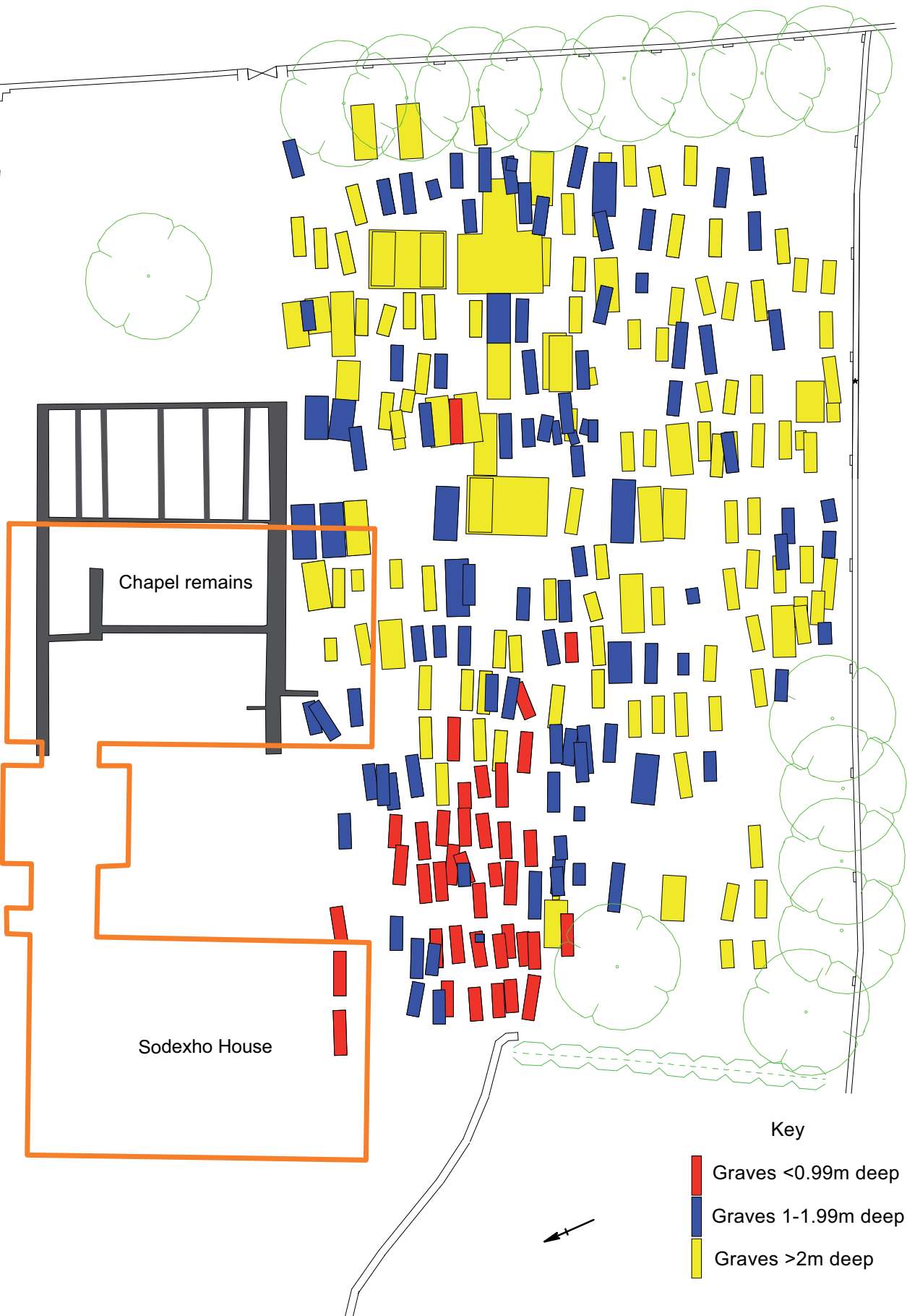

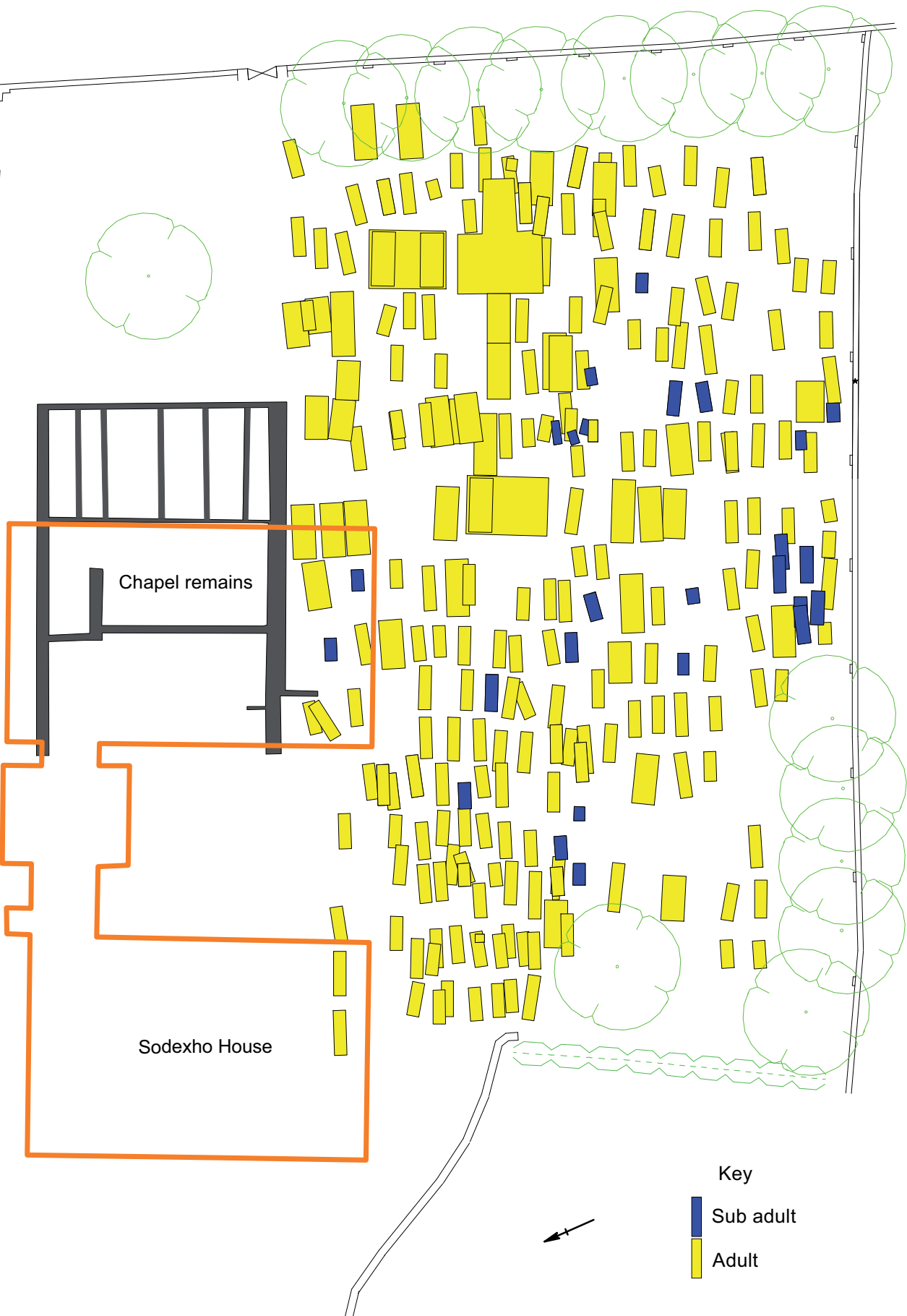

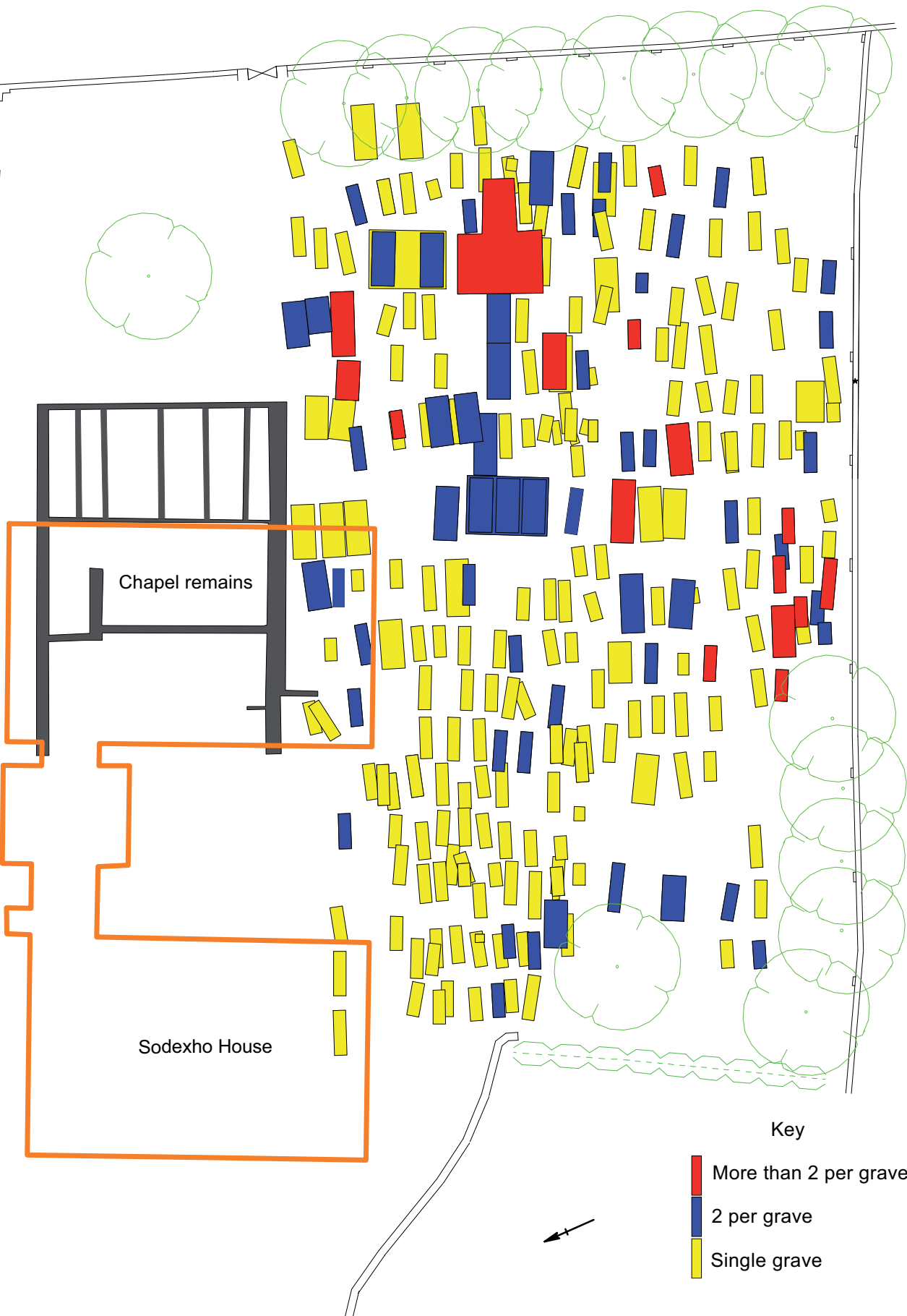

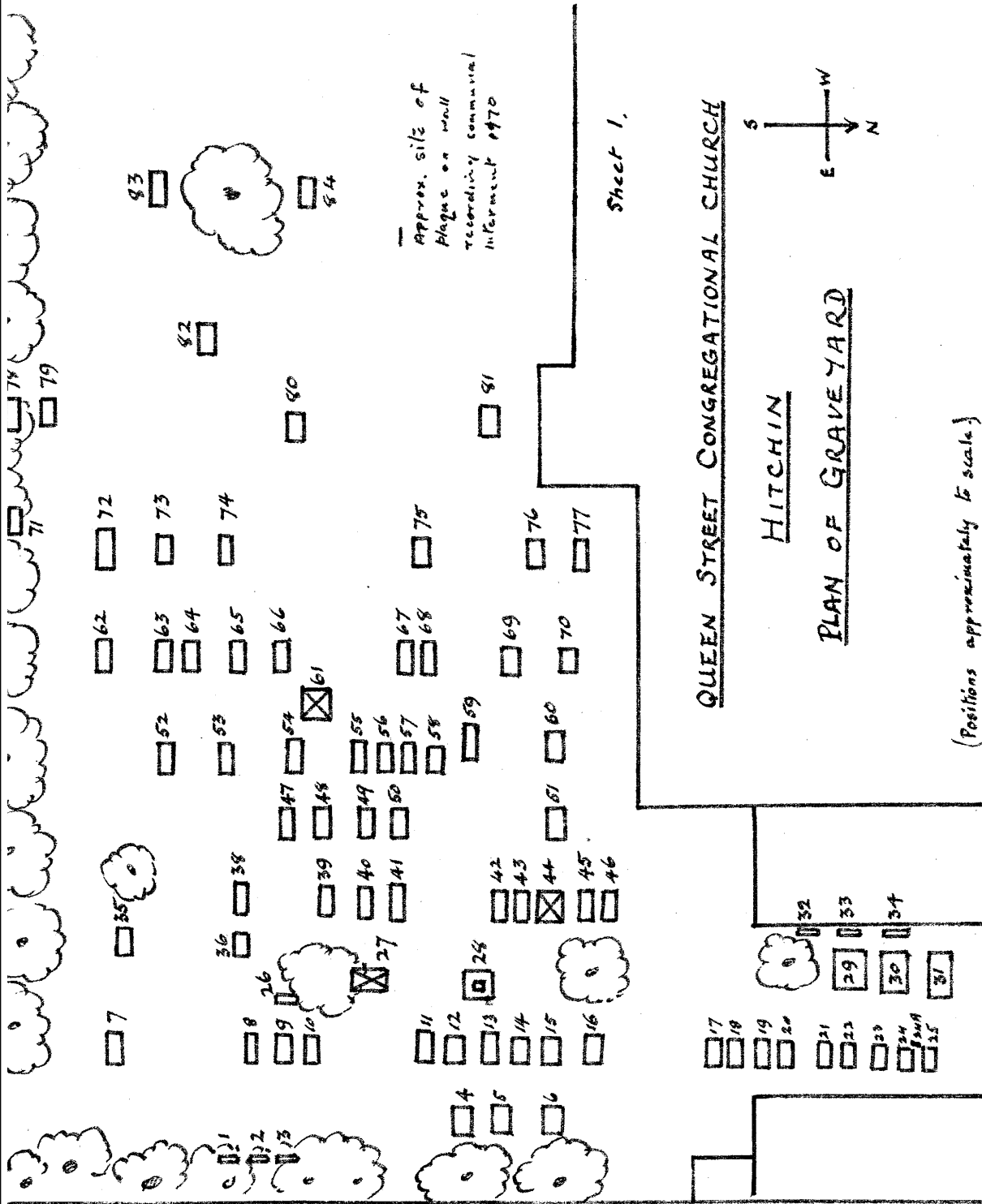

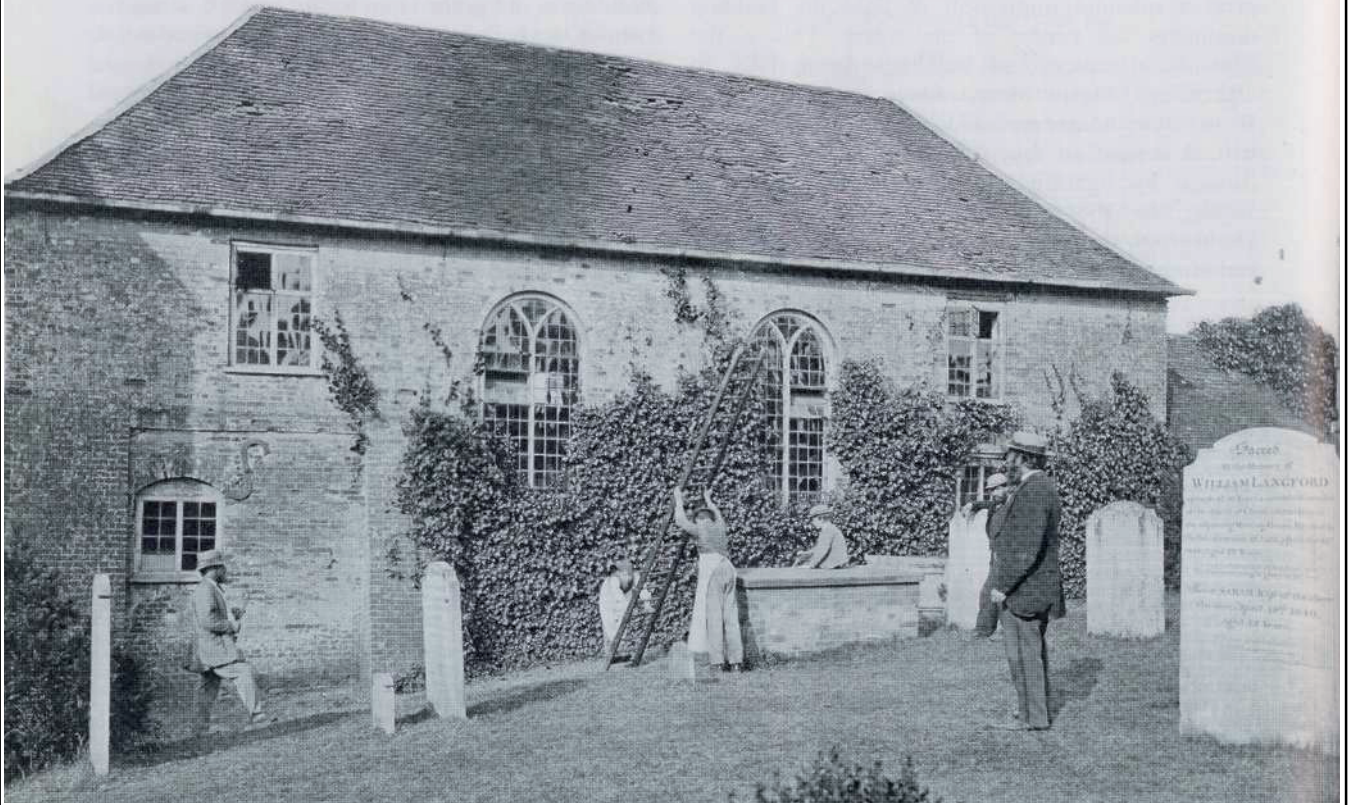

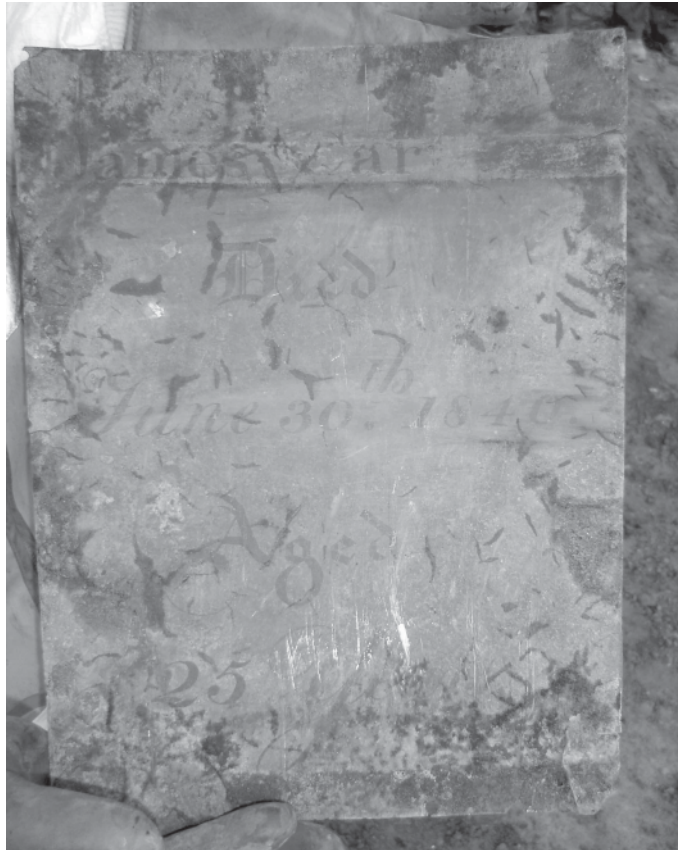
