THE ACCOUNTS OF THE CHURCHWARDENS OF ST. MARY, LEICESTER, 1652-1729.

THE following Accounts, &c., are derived from the Vestry Minute Book of this period lately restored to the Churchwardens by the will of the late Mr. Joseph Chawner. The book, which is made of good paper and well bound, still retains its original binding, and is in excellent preservation. On the first page is written: "William Rivitt & Philip Abney Churchwardens in the yeare 1652," and underneath in another handwriting "This Booke was bought for the use of the parishe by William Ryvett and Phillip Abney Churchwardens 1652."
