

ARCHAEOLOGY OF SOUTHWARK & LONDON SUPERSTITIONS

The Cuming Museum specialises in the archaeological evidence for the history of Southwark and also collects the material evidence for the superstitions that were current in the London area. Many of the finds from the excavations in Southwark and Lambeth are, or will be, preserved in the Museum and may be seen by appointment. These will include mainly Roman to Post-Medieval material and will be especially strong in delftware from kiln dumps. There is also a general coin collection.

Facilities for parties can be provided. Free information leaflets.

Open daily 10 a.m. to 5.30 p.m. except Thursday (to 7 p.m.) and Saturday (to 5 p.m.) Closed Sundays and Bank Holidays. Admission Free.

The Museum is five minutes walk from the Elephant & Castle Southern Region and Underground stations and buses 12, 17, 35, 40, 45, 171, 176, 184 and 196 pass the door.
