

Diary

Until 23rd January 1974—*The Chinese Exhibition* at the Royal Academy, Piccadilly, W.1. The 380 exhibits cover twelve periods starting at Peking Man and include the beautiful horse of Kansu, the jade death suit of Queen Tou and a wide selection of bronze, ceramic and wooden objects. To 23rd December and 14th-23rd January Mondays 4-7 p.m., Tuesdays to Sundays 10 a.m.-7 p.m.; 24th December to 13th January (ex. Christmas and Boxing days) daily 10 a.m. - 7 p.m.

Admission is 60p for adults and 30p for children, students and old age pensioners. Last admission one hour before closing time. For evening periods only, there is an advance booking service with tickets at £1.10. There are facilities for people confined to wheelchairs.

19-27 January—Brunel's Rotherhithe Pump House. An exhibition at St. Mary's Church, Rotherhithe (near tube station) of the now derelict pumphouse, built by Brunel for his Thames tunnel. Admission free. Mondays to Fridays, 10 a.m. - 7.30 p.m. Saturdays and Sundays, 10 a.m. - 5.30 p.m.
