

## Courses in Archaeology & Local Studies 1975-76

Almost one hundred courses in Archaeology and Local Studies are offered in this year's programme, in part-time evening classes and both residential and non-residential weekends.

Some courses are general in approach and are designed to be introductory, while others specialise in single period or area of archaeology. They range in topic from Early Man in Africa to Medieval Britain.

The following types of courses are offered:

1. Three and four year courses by examination, leading to the Certificate in Field Archaeology or Diploma in Archaeology, or the Diploma in History (Scheme C, Local History).

2. Courses without examination directed towards a particular subject or area.

3. Those with a practical content, including archaeological methods and techniques of excavation. One and two week training excavations are also available.

4. Courses with a more specialised content. This year's programme includes courses in Human Skeletal Material in Archaeology and a lecture series by specialists on New Developments in Archaeological Methods.

There are no entrance requirements other than a willingness to study seriously under direction.
